Sunday School: In this week's lesson, "A Mercy-Full Message," Jesus tells the famous parable (story) of the Good Samaritan, who risks his own life to help a Jewish man whose trouble was ignored by his own countrymen. In telling the parable, Jesus answers the question "Who is my neighbor?" for His followers as He challenges us to "go, and do likewise" (Luke 10:37). *As a family, you could discuss ideas to help those in need in your community.* Sunday School meets from 9:15–10:15 am in the following grade school classrooms:

Youth Bible Study: Our Sunday morning high school youth Bible study meets from 9:15–10:15 am in the youth room (the lower level of the church office).

Adult Bible Study: This morning Clint Colwell will share a one-week study on Holy Communion. When Jesus gave us the Lord's Supper, He chose bread and wine. But why those? How is that different from the Passover meal that Jesus and His disciples were celebrating? And what does it have to do with the animal sacrifices in the Old Testament, the Ark of the Covenant, and Jesus' death on the cross? Let's dive into the Bible and explore how all these pieces fit together. We'll uncover what the Lord's Supper means and why, as Lutherans, we celebrate it the way we do. *Gather at 9:15 am in the school gym*.
