In the Book of Exodus, Moses asks Pharaoh to let God's people go seven times (Ex 5:1; 7:16; 8:1, 20; 9:1, 13; 10:3), and Pharaoh finally does it! When he does, God's salvation is so amazing that the event becomes the Gospel of the Old Testament. Israel's Scriptures mention the exodus 125 times! Throughout the book, God reveals who He is through His absence and His presence, through His silence and His speech, through His wrath and His mercy, and through His judgment and His amazing grace. In doing so, the book paints a beautiful portrait of our Savior Jesus. *Worship Wednesdays in Lent and on Maundy Thursday and Good Friday at 10 am and 7 pm.*

- P** but I cannot carry it out.
- C** **What I do is not the good I want to do.**
- P** No, the evil I do not want to do, this I keep on doing.
- C** **I find this law at work—**
- P** when I want to do good, evil is right there with me.
- C** **In my inner being, I delight in Your law.**
- P** But I see another law at work in the members of my body, waging war and making me a prisoner of the law of sin and death.
- C** **Who will rescue me from this body of death?**
- P** Almighty God in His mercy has given His Son to die for you and for His sake forgives you all your sins. As a called and ordained servant of Christ, and by His authority, I therefore forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the ✠ Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C** **Amen. Thanks be to God through Jesus Christ our Lord!**
