Dear RBC Family,

Believe it or not, at my house we used to have something called a land line. It was a telephone that was plugged into a jack in the house, that was connected to wires that are strung all over town and across the country. But over the last several years, we noticed that the only people who ever called us on the land line were political parties and people offering a weed service.



Where I grew up, if someone called you asking you to sign up for their weed service, you were talking to someone who was probably going to jail. And when we lived in Baton Rouge, most of the politicians who called would eventually be in jail as well. But of course, the weed services being offered on the phone had nothing to do with drugs, but simply to do with people wanting to come spray your lawn for weeds.

Over the years, we noticed that fewer and fewer people would call us on our land line, and most people used our cell phones to talk with us. And so, to avoid talking with the politicians and the weed service, when the phone would ring at the house, we just let it ring. Eventually, we began to consider saving money by not even having a land line. But my biggest objection was “what if we had an emergency.” And so we kept the phone, and it would ring, and the politicians and the weed service would have to speak to a device known as an answering machine. Eventually, we figured out that if we did have an emergency, that we could use our cell phones effectively to call for help. So we just cancelled our land lines and haven’t really missed them since.

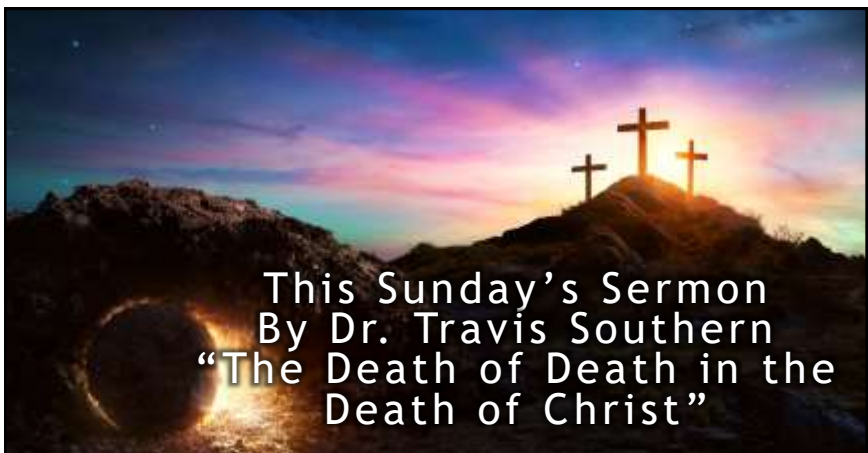
(Pastor Travis's Column Continued)

I wonder if prayer in our lives has become a lot like our land line telephones. Maybe there was a time in your life when you prayed all of the time. A day didn't go by when you would talk to God about everything. But over the years, you began to talk to someone else. You began to try to figure things out on your own. And prayer became a generic conversation, then something just to be accessed for emergencies. And finally, just by sheer neglect, prayer is disconnected from our lives.

But prayer never goes away like technologies. According to 1 Thess 5:17, we are to "Pray without ceasing." How is your prayer life? Is it neglected? How can you focus more on prayer? May the Lord raise up a new generation of prayer warriors in these perilous times.
