

### Words From Our Pastoral Care Counselor...

Unity in the Spirit

1 Corinthians 12:13 "For we were all baptized by one Spirit into one body—whether Jews or Greeks, whether slaves or free—and we were all given one Spirit to drink."

This last Sunday I was very appreciative of the lesson on Christian unity. We often are focused on distinctives to the exclusion of unity. In this lesson we learned that we have a diversity of Gifts (1 Corinthians 12:4), Ministries (1 Cor. 12:5), and Activities (1 Cor. 12:6). This diversity is a celebration and recognition that not all people will conduct themselves and do ministry in the exact same way. And this is OK. You see in the kingdom of God there is a diversity of workers.

This diversity then is to be used for the edification of the body. We are to promote the common good of other believers (1 Cor. 12:7). We are to humbly recognize the value of others who are different from where God has placed us (1 Cor 12:21-24). As we consider those things that are seemingly less honorable we are then to give greater honor. This reminds me of Jesus' words in Matthew 20:16 "So the last will be first, and the first last." This diversity is used in the preparation of believers for ministry.

Culturally we often focus on how church meets our needs. The expressions I hear are "I go to church to be filled," or "Does this church meet our needs," or "I want to go to a church that believes the same as I do."

Now depending on the circumstances, these statements may or may not be a good thing. However, if this is the chief aim of church life then we have really missed the mark. Our attendance of the church gathering together is for the edification of others. We ought to figure out what our particular gifting is and make our aim to understand how we can serve others.

This of course is our cooperative work with God to produce good works. It is gifting by God's Spirit, Ministry of our Lord Jesus Christ, and activity of God our Father, that not only sets an example of unity in diversity, but also empowers us to do the same. It is the Spirit that brings unity in purpose and power unto effectiveness. One body with many parts is the way God has designed us to work together as believers (1 Cor. 12:18).

It is a reality that this diversity can create tensions between individuals. But as we hold to the unity found in Christ and manifest by the Holy Spirit, we will grow into maturity as believers. This tension handled in a humble, kind, generous, and compassionate manner is the mark of true faith and evidence of the Holy Spirit's work in the Christian's life. As we take hold of the Grace that is found in Christ, let us pray that same grace flows through us into the relationships we have in the church. Further let us boldly proclaim the truth and substantively edify our brothers and sisters in the Lord.


