And from First Peter (4:10)- "Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms." And from the Book of Proverbs (22:9): "The generous will themselves be blessed, for they share their food with the poor." And from Mark's Gospel (10:45): "For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many." From Matthew (5:16): "In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven." And from John: "As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. Now remain in my love. Carefully peel back the top layer to retrieve the bread and then peel back he second layer to be able to drink the fruit juice. All are welcome to share in this meal with us!)
