SIGN OF THE CROSS: We remember + our baptismal calling.

WREATH: In the ancient world, various peoples lit fires to mark the turning of the light into winter's season and to pray for the return of the light. Today in this place, these candles are signs of the growing light of Christ who is coming again in all fullness into the darkness of our world. Until the dawning of that Great Day, we watch and wait in Holy Spirit for Christ's coming into the darkness of our world, lighting candles of hope, peace, joy, and love; and remembering the promises of God with prayer.

We gather around these candles of hope, peace, joy, and love, remembering the promises of God with prayer. We light our first candle in hope. As the First Candle of Advent wreath is lit we hear God's Word:

Hear God's promise of hope from Isaiah 64:1-5:

O that you would tear open the heavens and come down, so that the mountains would quake at your presence—as when fire kindles brushwood and the fire causes water to boil—to make your name known to your adversaries, so that the nations might tremble at your presence! When you did awesome deeds that we did not expect, you came down; the mountains quaked at your presence. From ages past no one has heard, no ear has perceived, no eye has seen any God besides you, who works for those who wait for him. You meet those who gladly do right,

those who remember you in your ways. But you were angry, and we sinned; because you hid yourself we transgressed. The word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God!**

*SCRIPTURE OF THE DAY: Mark 13:24-33 The Lord is with you. And also with you. A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark. Glory to you O Lord. But in those days, after that suffering, the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light, and the stars will be falling from heaven, and the powers in the heavens will be shaken. Then they will see 'the Son of Man coming in clouds' with great power and glory. Then he will send out the angels, and gather his elect from the four winds, from the ends of the earth to the ends of heaven. "From the fig tree learn its lesson: as soon as its branch becomes tender and puts forth its leaves, you know that summer is near. So also, when you see these things taking place, you know that he is near, at the very gates. Truly I tell you, this generation will not pass away until all these things have taken place.
