**SIGN OF THE CROSS:** We remember + our baptismal calling.

**WREATH**: In the ancient world, various peoples lit fires to mark the turning of the light into winter's season and to pray for the return of the light. Today in this place, these candles are signs of the growing light of Christ who is coming again in all fullness into the darkness of our world. Until the dawning of that Great Day, we watch and wait in Holy Spirit for Christ's coming into the darkness of our world, lighting candles of hope, peace, joy, and love; and remembering the promises of God with prayer. We light the first candle in hope and now light this second candle for peace.

As the First Two Candles of the Advent wreath are lit we hear God's Word:

Hear God's promise of hope from Isaiah 40:1-8:

Comfort, O comfort my people, says your God. Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and cry to her that she has served her term, that her penalty is paid, that she has received from the Lord's hand double for all her sins. A voice cries out: "In the wilderness prepare the way of the LORD, make straight in the desert a highway for our God. Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain. Then the glory of the LORD shall be revealed, and all people shall see it together, for the mouth of the LORD has spoken." A voice says, "Cry out!" And I said, "What shall I cry?" All people are grass, their constancy is like the flower of the

field. The grass withers, the flower fades, when the breath of the LORD blows upon it; surely the people are grass. The grass withers, the flower fades; but the word of our God will stand forever. The word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God!**

\*GOSPEL ACCLAMATION: Wait for the Lord #262

\*SCRIPTURE OF THE DAY: Mark 1:1-8 The Lord is with you. And also with you. A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark. Glory to you O Lord. The beginning of the good news of Jesus Christ, the Son of God. As it is written in the prophet Isaiah, "See, I am sending my messenger ahead of you, who will prepare your way; the voice of one crying out in the wilderness: 'Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight.' John the baptizer appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. And people from the whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem were going out to him, and were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. Now John was clothed with camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. He proclaimed, "The one who is more powerful than I is coming after me; I am not worthy to stoop down and untie the thong of his sandals. I have baptized you with water; but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit. The Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you O Christ!** 

### MESSAGE FOR ALL AGES & VISIO DIVINA P

(Visio Divina is translated as "divine seeing." It is related to the prayer form Lectio Divina (divine reading), but instead of Scripture, this form of prayer uses visual elements to help set your mind on prayer. It allows God to speak into your heart through the image. Focus your eyes and mind on the image, on the words you hear and the music playing in the background. If a thought comes into your mind, let it come and go. Pray the prayer of your heart!)
