-  During that time, all believers will celebrate this feast ([Zechariah 14:16](#)).

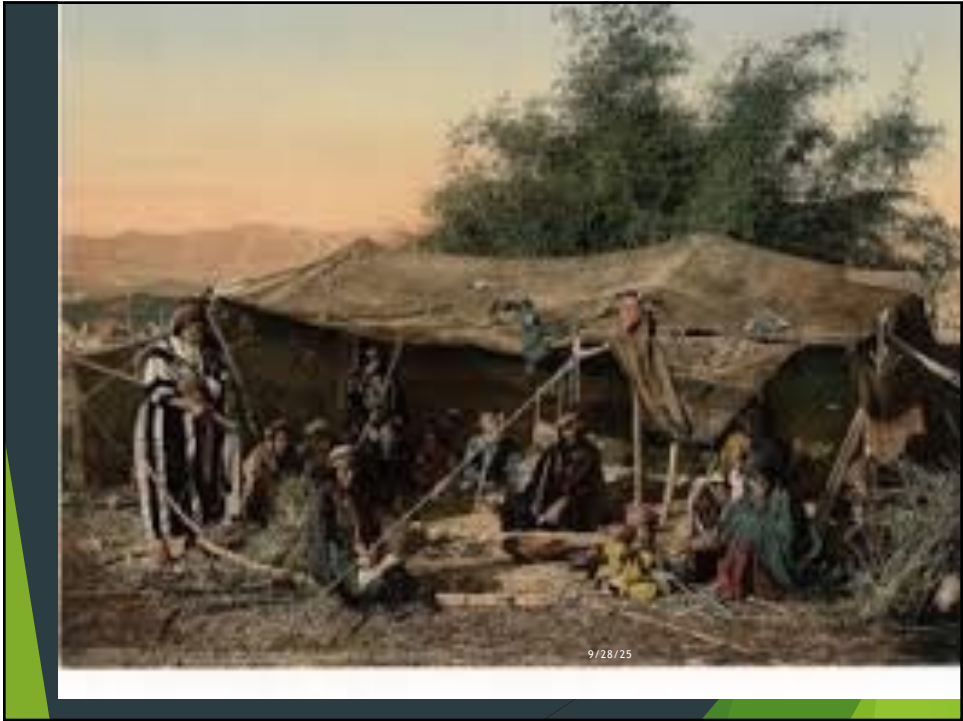


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DWELL IN SUKKOT (Booths, Tents)
