

#### Congratulations to Pastor Clark for 20 years of Ministry!

Pastor Clark was ordained at his home congregation, Christ the King, Spencer, Iowa after graduating from Concordia Seminary, St. Louis on June 9, 2002. He was installed on June 30, 2002 at St. Luke's Lutheran Church in Wisconsin Rapids, Wisconsin where he served his first call as Associate Pastor. Rev. Tim Wenger was a wonderful mentor in pastoral ministry. Pastor Clark was blessed to also be mentored by a group of pastors and their wives who shared their experience in the gifts of the Holy Spirit through a monthly small group gathering. Though it was only three and a half years, lifelong friends were made in Rapids.

In the spring of 2006, Pastor and the family moved to Walden, New York in the Hudson River Valley to serve at Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church. For the first year and half he served as the associate pastor and then became their senior pastor for eight and a half years. Trinity was a unique ministry not only in its more charismatic style but also its evangelistic passion. Pastor Clark was mentored by Pastor Ray Cummings, Pastor Bob Griffin, and evangelist Bruce Carlson and introduced to new ways to do ministry. The children grew up in New York and the family will always have ties there!

After a prophetic dream was shared with Katherine in November of 2015, the couple was not surprised to receive a phone call from St. John's in Buffalo in April of 2016. (Though they were a little surprised to receive a follow up call after the way the first phone call had ended! ;-) Thanks, Dave Haggerty!) Pastor Clark began his ministry here at St. John's in August of 2016. In his own words, "Working with the staff, elders, leadership and congregation has been a joy! Thank you for the opportunity and privilege to serve as your pastor."

Kids from age 3 through 4<sup>th</sup> grade will have a great time singing, watching skits, creating crafts and playing games.



Membership at St. John's guarantees all women can be members of Women in Mission. But there are definite opportunities and benefits to joining the Women in Mission Board and/or actively participating in activities. So we are open to changing meeting times to better fit schedules if people want to join but can't make the meetings. We will be hosting events at differing times to hopefully fit a wide range of schedules.

We pray women of all ages, backgrounds and life situations get to know us as Christian sisters who can boost fellowship and friendship. Please share your needs, ideas for activities and interests. Later this summer, the Sewing Ladies will host a training for people want to learn to sew. In the Fall, canning gurus will teach tricks to preserving produce. We will soon begin regular community coffee hours.

Lutheran Women in Mission, or LWML, is a national organization in its 80th year. St. John's is part of the MN South District which has 8 conferences and about 3k members. Per their statement, "The LWML has focused on affirming each woman's relationship with Christ, encouraging and equipping women to live out their Christian lives in active mission ministries and to support global missions."
