



LWML/WIM/St. John's Women

St. John's welcomes all our new members. If you aren't familiar with Lutheran Women in Mission (LWML), here's some info about the global Missouri Synod Women's organization: St. John's is part of the MN South District. All LCMS women are automatically members of



Lutheran Women in Mission. Most churches, including St. John's, have Women in Mission boards. There are several focuses, but the main focus is missions and service. Women in Mission groups raise money in several ways. Each church is different, but mites are a main donation avenue.

What are mites? Mites are spare change donations from members. The title is based on the Biblical story about the widow's offering/mites, where Jesus watched a crowd putting money into the temple treasury. Rich people threw in large amounts, but a poor widow added two very small copper coins, worth a few cents. "Jesus said, 'Truly I tell you, this poor widow has put more into the treasury than all the others. They gave out of their wealth, but she, out of her poverty, put in everything-all she had to live on.'"

Matthew 12: 43-44. If you'd like a reminder and container to hold your spare change, St. John's has little purple and white cardboard mite boxes at the back of the narthex and in the Women in Mission display in the Fellowship hall by the kitchen. When it's full, bring it back to church. If you don't want to use a mite box, just add spare change to a baggie and label it.

Women in Mission ladies host a Mites Sunday each month, where they serve coffee and snacks during Bible study, and have a basket for mites. At the last convention, attendees found out that St. John's had the biggest mites donations in our District. Our Mites bring in approx. \$300-\$400 per month for designated Mission Grants. People may feel like giving small bills, quarters, dimes, nickels and pennies don't make a difference. However, bring it in! The ladies welcome counting your change because it adds up fast. Millions of small donations make a huge difference. In fact, LWML has been able to donate over \$100 million to missions since its inception in 1942.

Amy wants to use Rally Sunday to get more people to help with the Sunday Offering Count. Will check to see if there are more people wanting envelopes or would want to do an ACH giving making it easy to go on-line. Motion made by Amy Klemz & seconded by Scott Spadgenske. Motion passed.

<u>New/Old Business:</u> Church Facility Reservation Request and Agreement Form (the Church Policy): A discussion took place on the available use of the church for non-Christian groups to have meetings in church as well as Christian groups. No maintenance staff or custodians. Council asked to read the Policy & any questions can be asked at the next meeting.

Congregation to vote on it at the Oct. Quarterly Meeting.
