

#### Increasing our Connectedness

The link between our connectedness to others and our health and well-being is long established in science and experience. A study in 2014 showed that social isolation was worse for our health than "obesity,



smoking and high blood pressure". (See <u>http://ccare.stanford.edu/uncategorized/connectedness-health-the-</u><u>science-of-social-connection-infographic/</u>)</u>

On the other hand, increasing our social connections strengthens our immune function, helps us recover from illness faster, and lowers our rates of depression and anxiety. As the hardest part of winter sets in, we could all use support warding off the winter blues and worries!

This science is no surprise to our Creator who designed us to be in relationship with Himself AND with others. Here are just a few examples:

- We are told the early church "devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer." - Acts 2:42

-Paul instructs us in Romans 12:16 to "live in harmony with one another" and in Galatians 6:2 to "carry each other's burdens".

-And Jesus makes it clear in the Gospel of John, "Love each other as I have loved you."

He intended for us to *do life together*! And our brains and bodies were wired with that togetherness in mind. If you're feeling isolated or lonely this winter, pick out ONE thing you can do this week to get more connected.
