Hosanna's Sunday School will be taking offering during the music time of Sunday School.


Each month, one of the classes will choose where they would like the S.S. offering to go.

Approval of December Agenda, November Council Meeting Minutes and November Financial Reports.

Old Business

Stewardship – November's stewardship drive could be the start of a yearlong focus. 68 pledges have been received so far. Pledges have exceeded previous stewardship campaigns. A variety of "payment" types have been used.

Budget – The 2024 budget is larger than 2023's. There were additional moneys added to the Funded Depreciation line item.

Council Recruitment - Nomination Committee was selected and approved.

New Business

The *Annual Meeting* Preview will be January 14, Annual Meeting will be January 21. Both will take place after worship.

Red Cross Shelter – The Red Cross has updated their mission and are requesting shelters that would be supported by their own team. Only select people would allow access to the building. Hosanna can accept requests based on building availability.

Advocate Reports

Outreach – The Red Cross blood donation was successful again. The next Red Cross blood donation is March 18, 2024. Payments have been made to the groups that Hosanna supports, including missionaries.

Properties – The furnace was repaired instead of replaced. A new water heater was installed. Cement was poured in the parking lot near the west entrance. Energy consumption should be down so utility payments may decrease.

Fellowship – \$2,500 raised from the Christmas Bazaar. A widower's support group will begin but meet outside of Hosanna.

Discipleship – A free little library is organized and operating. The Sunday School Christmas program is coming together. The Advent activity was enjoyed by all. Sunday School teachers have been flexible to help with covering needs.

Worship - The first Wednesday Advent worship was very well attended.

Staff Reports

Faith Formation - Meetings with Family Promise and Overland Elementary have been held, to review their needs. Overland will be supported through a Giving Tree in January. The Christmas Program is coming together nicely. Confirmation Camp planning is already taking place!

Pastor - Advent season is in full swing. Upcoming

events of Christmas Eve services and Promises of Hope discussed. Preparation has already begun for Lent and Summer.
