Dear Beloved of Hosanna,

### Our Advent series theme this year is "What Do You Fear? Insisting on Hope This Advent."

We begin our series with the Gospel of Luke telling the story of the birth of Jesus. "In the time of Herod..."

While this detail may seem minor to us, it actually reveals information about the fearful world Jesus entered, one filled with rampant

oppression, economic disparity, uncertainty, and instability. A world not so unlike our own. And yet, throughout the stories of Christ's birth, the whispers of angels deliver a surprising message: "Do not fear."

Today, we might ask: is it even possible to be fearless in a fearful world? When Mary, Joseph, the shepherds, and the magi are each called into God's redemptive story, they do not deny their fears—they move through them. They ask questions, hold fast to courage, trust in good news, and say, "Here I am, Lord." When we find ourselves in fearful times, can we acknowledge our fears while also insisting on hope?

Our Advent series invites us to seriously consider the angels' message and trust that Christ's birth truly *is* "good news of great joy for all people." This series looks closely at the fear and terror looming in the background during the time of King Herod and invites us to consider the fears we hold now. Fear can divide and paralyze us and even be used as a tool for oppression.

But what if we formed a different relationship with fear? Can we acknowledge fear without letting it rule us? Might we turn our fears into love and action? What if naming our fears helps us see more clearly how God is breaking in and where God is at work? In this series we will be gently invited to identify where fear is present—both in the Advent story and in our lives—while also finding our way toward hope, with the angels' voices in our ears.

Join us this Advent season for Sunday worship, Wednesday evening Advent suppers and worship, the Intergenerational Christmas Program, the Promises of Hope Service and Christmas Eve services. We will light candles, sing carols, pray for and proclaim Christ's coming because we believe God entered a frightened world to bring good news. We hold onto hope because we believe that Christ did come—that's the promise of the season.

Our hope is not flimsy or fleeting. It's gritty, resilient, and can endure—no matter what we fear or face.

This season, let us insist on hope and trust that God... Immanuel is with us.

# COUNCIL REPORT - Fellowship

Celebration is closely intertwined with the concept of fellowship. One example is how Christians have been meeting on Sundays to worship alongside fellow believers, since the days of the Early Church, to celebrate Christ's resurrection.

Each Sunday morning at Hosanna we gather with others to confess pray, hear God's Word, praise Him through music, make offerings, and celebrate communion. Oh, and enjoy coffee, goodies, and conversation with fellow sojourners afterwards. :-) Because of Jesus being raised from the dead, making a way for us to have abundant, eternal life with Him, we take time to celebrate - **together**.

I enjoy reading weekly emails from author/speaker/podcaster/artist Mary DeMuth. She recently emailed a post from her archives, "Confession: I Am No Good at Celebrating".

Here's an excerpt that speaks to the importance of celebration, and how fellowship with others is a lovely outflow from celebrating.

I am terrible at celebrating.

I flit from thing to thing, seldom stopping to cherish a moment or celebrate a milestone. Can you relate?

I'm reading a really helpful book right now called *Tiny Habits* by BJ Fogg. It's been the habit book that has truly produced life change in me.

By far, the hardest chapter of *Tiny Habits* to digest was the chapter Fogg wrote about celebration. I didn't realize this, but celebration imprints your habits! If you celebrate after you've done your fifth push-up, you'll be more likely to do 5 more tomorrow.

Why celebrate if no one else joins the party? My internal monologue sounds like, *keep your head down. Keep working. Don't stop. Celebrating doesn't matter; it takes up time.* It's no fun to have a party alone.

And yet, I think of the life Jesus wants for me, for you. A life of abundant joy, of forward momentum, and hope. I am worthy, not because I do a bunch of things, but because I am a child of God. HE WANTS TO JOIN THIS PARTY! He, as a good Parent, wants to celebrate along with me! Celebrating fits right in with what the Spirit wants to do in our healed lives. It's an acknowledgment of gratitude for what God has done in and through us.

I've finally learned It's not prideful to honestly celebrate a win. Why?

#### **Because celebrating does three cool things:**

- \*It slows you down enough to rest and enjoy an accomplishment, realizing your worth is not tied to that in the first place.
- \*It invites other people into the celebration, producing camaraderie and fellowship.
- \*It redirects your heart to Jesus, the One who gives you the ability in the first place.

In this season of Advent, Hosanna offers more opportunities than usual to have "camaraderie and fellowship" in celebration, through mid-week Advent suppers and services, a Christmas program, and Christmas Eve services. You are invited to these parties, where together we can redirect our hearts to Jesus, and rejoice that He came to earth!

Opening Devotion

Approval of November Agenda, October Council Meeting Minutes and October Financial Statements.

#### **Old Business**

Angel Update – John Kamrath will buy all the angels back. The current angel is "pre-purchased" so that when it comes down John will take possession. The tower has been touched up with fresh paint.

Capital Campaign update – over \$304,000 has been brought in of the \$633,000 pledged.

#### **New Business**

Nominating Committee – there are openings for President Elect, Synod Assembly and Nominating Committee.

Ideas - \*\*The Rochester ELCA churches want to support Channel One. An idea was shared of pooling money to give to Channel One and make a public Christian statement about caring for the hungry. Remember - Hosanna distributes food for Channel One and there are other food shelves besides Channel One. What would be the most efficient use of ELCA churches resources? More discussion will take place.

\*\*There was discussion about expanding Blessing Bucks offering opportunities. Once a month - can funds be used to bless and replenish Hosanna's pantries? Agreement was given. There will be pictures taken and shared to show the impact on the pantries.

#### Advocate Reports

Outreach – \*The Men's Breakfast group will restock Susan's Suppers. Which groups can help in December and January? Decisions will be made. \*Overland Elementary has a goal of one deodorant for each student to promote personal hygiene. A Thrivent Grant will be used to help make progress towards that goal. \*Pillowcase Ministry will make donations soon. \*The next American Red Heart blood drive will be December 15.

\*Shopping will take place at Aldi to fill Hosanna's pantries.

Worship – \*The season of Advent begins November 30. \*Pastor is working part time at Peace Lutheran in Eyota. \*Aimee Hampton is now leading Grace. She's a recent Luther grad and will be leading worship the 3rd Sunday of the month.

Fellowship – \*The grief series was valuable time to learn how to support others. They studied biblical characters who went through grief and how they dealt with it. \*More people are supporting refreshments on Sundays. \*Lefse will be made Saturday, November 22. \*The pie social will be on Wednesday, November 26. \*There will be potluck style supper before Advent Wednesday services. \*There will be a Women's Retreat at Good Earth Village on April 17-19.





Discipleship – \*Eight students were confirmed! \*Bibles were given to three-year-olds and 3rd graders. \*The Faith Formation Committee will meet to discuss fundraising options. \*The high school and middle school are youth supporting this year's Christmas program. \*There will be cookie baking with the youth. \*The Christmas bazaar is coming up on Saturday, December 6. \*Bible study groups are going strong. \*The Palm Sunday menu has yet to be decided.

Support – \*The Memorial Garden wall has not been completed because Hosanna's project may be at the bottom of their list. Questions-Are they waiting for better weather to have better quality work? How long should we wait? Can some sort of "prediction" be given for a timeline? A deposit has been paid. \*There will be a new snow removal crew. \*The heating and cooling priorities are put off until spring. That way materials are only moved once and at a lower cost. Questions-Can solar panels be added? Have rebates passed and are incentives gone? Many decisions are coming in December's meeting. Cost saving may be possible by a new energy consumption rating.


