**Why We Fast — Making Room for More of God**

Fasting is not simply abstaining from food; it is the intentional surrender of what feeds the flesh so that what feeds the spirit may grow **intentionally** stronger. It is saying:

**“God, I want more of You than I want anything else.”**

**Isaiah 58** reveals God’s heart for true fasting—not only to humble ourselves, but to:

- ✓ Break the chains of injustice
- ✓ Lift heavy burdens
- ✓ Heal the oppressed
- ✓ Purify the heart
- ✓ Restore righteousness and joy
- ✓ Strengthen our relationship with God

As we fast, we invite the Holy Spirit to search us, purify us, and renew us. We make room for God to work deeply and fully in our hearts—and through us, to impact **ONE MORE** life.

### **Types of Fasting**

Choose the fast that aligns with your health, faith, and desire for breakthrough:

1. **Normal Fast** – Water or liquids only.
2. **Absolute Fast** – No food or water for short, Spirit-led intervals.
3. **Partial Fast** – Limited food or specific restrictions (e.g., one meal daily).
4. **Daniel Fast** – Plant-based; abstain from meats, sweets, and dairy.

Our goal is **not perfection**, but **intention**—to position ourselves for God’s transforming work.

**Keys to Miracle Prayers:** There are several important keys to successful miracle prayers that every Christian must employ when praying, believing and expecting miracles. When these keys are not utilized, individuals who pray and do not receive may become disappointed and allow doubt to overwhelm them.

• **It Must Be God’s Will, Not Yours.** **James 4:2–3** (AV) 2 Ye lust, and have not: ye kill, and desire to have, and cannot obtain: ye fight and war, yet ye have not, because ye ask not. 3 Ye ask, and receive not, because ye ask amiss, that ye may consume it upon your lusts.

• **You Must Have Faith.** **Hebrews 11:6** (AV) 6 But without faith it is impossible to please him: for he that cometh to God must believe that He is, and that He is a rewarder of them that diligently seek Him.

• **You Must Fast, Pray and Believe.** **Matthew 17:19–21** (AV) 19 Then came the disciples to Jesus apart, and said, why could not we cast him out? 20 And Jesus said unto them, **because of your unbelief:** for verily I say unto you, if ye have faith as a grain of mustard seed, ye shall say unto this mountain, remove hence to yonder place; and it shall remove; and nothing shall be impossible unto you. 21 Howbeit this kind goeth not out but by prayer and fasting.

**BEGIN EACH DAY PRAYING THE LORD’S PRAYER AND PROPHETIC PRAYER DECLARATION:**

Remember the Lord Is Near (Our Father in heaven —**Matthew 6:9**), Reflect on who God is (**hallowed be your name- Matthew 6:9**) and Refocus your life toward his kingdom and his will (**your kingdom come your will be done in the earth as it is in heaven- Matthew 6:10**) Request the needs you have for today (**Give us today our daily bread-Matthew 6:11**, Repent of the sins you have committed and forgive others (**forgive us our debts as we also have forgiven our debtors-Matthew 6:12**) and Rest in God deliverance and presence in time of temptation (**And lead us not into temptation but deliver us from the evil one-Matthew 6:13**. For thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory. Amen.

## **40 DAYS OF DEVOTION DECLARATION AND PRAYERS**

### **DAY 1 — LONGING FOR THE LIVING WATER**

#### **“Lord, Do It One More Time in Me”**

**FAITH DECLARATION:** I declare and decree that as I intentionally begin this fast, I am positioning myself for **greater impact** and **unusual encounters with God**. This is not a routine fast—this is a deliberate act of faith in **the Year of God Doing the Unusual**. As I fast, I believe that God will meet me **again**. He will fill me **again**. He will revive me **again**. Lord, I make room for You. Do it **one more time** in me—one more touch, one more encounter, one more outpouring for Your glory. I receive this by faith, and I commit to walking intentionally so my life produces lasting impact. **In Jesus' name, Amen.**

**Deuteronomy 7:6** I rejoice in God who has chosen me and made me His special treasure. I am set apart, cleansed, and called to live a holy life. Today I come thirsty, longing for the Living Water that only Jesus gives.

**Psalms 42:1 (AMP)** As the deer pants [longingly] for the water brooks, So my soul pants [longingly] for You, O God.

**SCRIPTURE — John 4:7–14 (NKJV)** 7 A woman of Samaria came to draw water. Jesus said to her, “Give Me a drink.” 10 Jesus answered and said to her, “If you knew the gift of God, and who it is who says to you, ‘Give Me a drink,’ you would have asked Him, and He would have given you living water.” 13 Jesus answered and said to her, “Whoever drinks of this water will thirst again, 14 but whoever drinks of the water that I shall give him will never thirst. But the water that I shall give him will become in him a fountain... springing up into everlasting life.”

### **DEVOTIONAL — “My Soul Thirsts for the Living God”**

The first day of a fast is a day of is a holy yearning. It is the moment when we come to Jesus—like the woman at the well—empty, thirsty, tired, and in need of something only He can give. **John 4** does not begin with a miracle of provision; it begins with a miracle of invitation. Jesus sits at a well in the heat of the day waiting for a weary soul. And He waits and longs for us to come in the same way. This is a **“NOW”** moment. Today is our day.

Before He supplies anything else, He first supplies Himself—the Living Water. The woman came for water that would run out. It would not sustain her but for a moment. Jesus offered water that would sustain her for eternity, and it would never run dry. She came with a bucket with limitations. Jesus came with a well that was limitless. She came thirsty. Jesus came ready to fill that limit space and create what no man could ever do!

**Eternal fulfillment!** Shout right now fill me **one more time** Lord.

This is where our 40-day journey begins—not with our needs, but with our thirst. **How deep is your want too. Do you want Jesus to quench your thirst.** Not with our requests, but with our heartfelt worship: “God, I want You more than anything You can give me.” Fasting reveals the truth that we cannot live on natural resources alone. Lord, we need the Living Water that becomes a well within us. We need Your presence that restores the soul. We need Your Spirit that refreshes dry places.

Like the woman at the well, many of us have tried to satisfy our thirst in broken wells— in people, success, busyness, money, approval of others. But none of it lasts but for a moment. None of it fills those empty spaces. None of it heals or brings restoration. Only Jesus satisfies through divine fulfillment. As we begin this fast, our declaration is simple: **“Lord, give me this Living water again.** Do in me what You created in her. **Jesus, do it one more time.”** Your encounter with her at that moment at the well, transformed her life for eternity. As a result, her life transformed the city. And this fast is the doorway to your encounter... your transformation...your fresh filling... your **“one more time”** moment!

### **PRAYER — “Fill Me Again, Lord”**

Father, today I begin this fast with a thirsty heart. I come to the well like the woman in John 4—empty, tired, hungry for more of You. I confess that nothing in this world can satisfy the thirst in my soul. **Only You can.** Only You are Living Water that will bring me deliverance. Lord, do it again in me. Do what You have done before. Do

what only You can do. As I seek You over these 40 days, let this be a season of a fresh encounter, a fresh revelation, and a fresh inward filling.

Break every dependency on broken wells. Detach me from anything that is a substitute for Your presence. Awaken worship inside of me and stir an unquenchable hunger for you. Let my soul cry out like David, “My heart and my flesh cry out for the living God.”

Jesus, just as You turned ordinary water into miracle wine at Cana, turn the ordinary places of my life into extraordinary encounters. Turn this fast into a doorway of revival. Turn this prayer into a fountain that springs up with new life. Turn my thirst into a testimony. I ask You for Living Water—not just enough to survive, but an overflow. Abundant enough to transform me, refresh me, restore me, and send me into the world with Your power. Fill me one more time with fresh fire. Renew me again. Revive me, Lord. Do it one more time. In Jesus’ mighty name,

## **Day 2: Intentionality That Leads to Impact**

**FAITH DECLARATION:** Today, I choose to live with **intentionality, fully committing my heart, my hands, and my ways to honor God.** This is not an ordinary year—this is the year of God doing the unusual, and I am positioning myself to participate in what He is releasing. According to Colossians 3:23, everything I do, I will do wholeheartedly, as unto the Lord and not for people. I declare that as I live intentionally, God will release Ephesians 3:20 power in my life—doing exceedingly, abundantly, and beyond all I could ask, think, or imagine. I receive this season with expectation, and I walk forward aligned with God’s will, trusting Him to do the unusual in and through my life.

**Devotional Title:** Intentional Living, Incredible Impact\*\*

**Scripture Focus:** “And whatsoever ye do, do it heartily, as to the Lord...” — **Colossians 3:23**

“Now unto Him who is able to do exceedingly abundantly above...” — **Ephesians 3:20**

Intentionality is not merely a word—it is a divine-orchestrated strategy. It is the decision to live deliberately, prioritize purposefully, and pursue God passionately. In Scripture, God never blessed passivity; He blessed intentional movement, intentional obedience, and intentional devotion. Paul wrote to the Colossians; anchoring them toward one foundational truth: ***your impact is tied to your intention.*** The word “heartily” used in **Colossians 3:23** means “**from the core, with everything in you, with focus and purpose.**” “**Out of the soul**”, **this type** of intentionality will unceasingly attract divine power.

**Ephesians 3:20** reveals the other side of the equation—God’s great and powerful ability will always do exceedingly, abundantly above all we ask or think. But the verse does not end here. It says, “***according to the power that works in us.***”

Meaning:

- God’s unlimited ability is connected to our intentional availability.
- God’s abundance responds to our obedience.
- God’s greatness flows through our willingness to be used intentionally.

**“Intentionality”** is the bridge between human effort and divine empowerment. When we show up intentionally—praying with purpose, serving with joy, giving with expectation, worshiping with focus, building relationships with love—God **increases** the impact **greater** than our imagination.

**2026** is the year where your intentional decisions will shift the atmosphere around you. During this season, your intentional faith will produce supernatural results. This is the time where your intentional pursuit of God will unlock what eyes have not seen. It will be a moment of divine revelation. You are not just believing for greater—you **are positioning yourself for more.**

Intentionality aligns your life with heaven’s divine agenda. And when heaven’s agenda meets your prepared heart, **Ephesians 3:20 becomes your moment of reality.**

**Prayer:** Heavenly Father, I come before You with a heart open, hungry, and completely surrendered. I recognize that nothing meaningful happens by accident—impact requires intention. So today, I am making a consecrated decision to live with greater purpose, passion, clarity, and focus.

Father, align my motives, sharpen my vision, and strengthen my commitment. Strengthen my inner man to pursue You with intentionality, worshiping intentionally, serving intentionally, leading intentionally, and loving intentionally. Eliminate all distractions that attempt to dilute my purpose. Interrupt and terminate all cycles of passivity, hesitation, and inconsistency. Let the fresh fire of the Holy Spirit intentionally burn inside of me.

Lord, **according to Colossians 3:23**, I offer You the works of my hands, thoughts of my mind, and the desires of my heart. I choose to do all things unto You—not for applause, validation, or recognition, but for Your honor and glory. Let my life become a testimony of worship. May my actions be ministry. Let my spirit of excellence be a testimony before You.

And Father, as I walk with intentionality, I stand on the promises of **Ephesians 3:20**. I believe and know by faith that You are more than able to do exceedingly, abundantly, above all I can ask, think, or imagine. Let Your power work fervently in me. Let Your power flow through me. Let Your power transform everything that is inside and around me. I will always give you glory.

Lord, make this season a season of greater focus, greater breakthrough, and greater overflow as stated in Ephesians 3:20. Shape and mold me that I may be used for your purpose and glory. Position me for greater. I surrender my plans for Your plan and purpose, my thoughts for Your wisdom, my strength for Your power. Do exceedingly. Do abundantly. Do above and beyond. Release the greater working inside of me and I believe by faith it shall come



to pass. I give You praise for what is beginning, for what is aligning, and for what is manifesting. In Jesus' mighty and majestic name, Amen.

### Day 3: Intentional Faith Unlocks Miracles

**FAITH DECLARATION:** Father, I thank You that You are the God of miracles, and there is nothing too hard for You.

This is the Year of the Unusual, and I believe You are working in ways that go beyond my imagination and expectations. As I consecrate myself before You, I declare that You are positioning me for supernatural impact. I trust You to do exceedingly, abundantly, and unusually above all I can ask or think.

I step forward in faith, ready to receive everything You have prepared.

**Scripture: Matthew 14:15–21** <sup>15</sup> As evening approached, the disciples came to him and said, “This is a remote place, and it is already getting late. Send the crowds away, so they can go to the villages and buy themselves some food.” <sup>16</sup> Jesus replied, “They do not need to go away. You give them something to eat.” <sup>17</sup> “We have here only five loaves of bread and two fish,” they answered. <sup>18</sup> “Bring them here to me,” he said. <sup>19</sup> And he directed the people to sit down on the grass. Taking the five loaves and the two fish and looking up to heaven, he gave thanks and broke the loaves. Then he gave them to the disciples, and the disciples gave them to the people. <sup>20</sup> They all ate and were satisfied, and the disciples picked up twelve basketfuls of broken pieces that were left over. <sup>21</sup> The number of those who ate was about five thousand men, besides women and children.

### Devotional Title: Intentional Steps That Make Room for Miracles\*\*

**Scripture Focus:** “Bring them hither to me.” — Matthew 14:18

“They did all eat, and were filled.” — Matthew 14:20

Consecration is not only a season of sacrifice—it is a season of **intentional positioning** for miracles. The feeding of the five thousand teaches us that miracles do not happen randomly. They follow intentional steps of faith, obedience, surrender, and expectation.

Here are three intentional actions that positioned the disciples and the multitude to receive the supernatural:

**1. Intentional Surrender — They Gave What They Had** -The disciples looked at their lack: “We have here but five loaves and two fish.” It was not much. It was not impressive. It did not match the size of the need. But Jesus never asked them for what they *did not* have. He only asked for what was in their hands. **Intentionality begins where excuses end.** The miracle did not start when the bread multiplied—The miracle started when someone was *willing to give it*. **Faith is an action** Your “not enough” becomes “more than enough” the moment you release your faith.

**2. Intentional Obedience — They Followed His Instruction**- Jesus said, “Bring them here to Me.” He did not ask them to fix the crowd. He did not ask them to solve the problem. He did not ask them to figure out the outcome. He only asked for obedience. The people sat down. The disciples handed Him the loaves. They stayed in position even when they did not understand the process. **Obedience will strategically position you where miracles can find you.**-God multiplies what you are willing to submit.

**3. Intentional Expectation — They Prepared for What They Did Not Yet See** -Jesus looked up to heaven and **blessed** the little before it became much. Then He **broke** the little, and an act of faith by breaking the bread it became the doorway to greater blessing. What God breaks, He multiplies.

What God blesses, He increases. What God receives, He transforms. The multitude did not just receive a snack—but rather they received a feast. Not one fish per family. Not five crumbs and a prayer. Scripture says: *“They all ate and were filled.”* **This is Ephesians 3:20 in motion: exceedingly, abundantly, above all they could ask or think.**

So here is the truth in this season of consecration: Miracles are not accidental, they are intentional moments where your faith meets God’s power. If you will surrender what you have...

If you will obey what He says... If you will expect what He promised... Then you will see what only God can do.

This is the time to believe for miracle provisions, miracle breakthroughs, miracle healing, miracle opportunities, and miracle expansion. Your intentionality invites God’s supernatural impact.

**Prayer:** Father, in this sacred time of consecration, I come before You with a heart full of faith and expectation. I thank You that You are still the God who multiplies. You are still the One who takes small things and produces supernatural impact. Just as Jesus received five loaves and two fish and transformed them into overflow, I give You what I have today. Lord, I surrender my resources, my time, my abilities, my hopes, and even my fears. I place them in Your hands, knowing You can do more with them than I ever imagine. I refuse to despise small beginnings. I choose to believe that what I carry is abundant for You to use.

Teach me Lord to quickly obey, fully, and joyfully and completely. Surrendering all to you. When You say, “bring it to Me,” I will not hesitate. When You tell me to make room, I will trust Your process. When circumstances seem overwhelming or impossible, I will not forget but will be quick to bring in remembrance that You specialize in the impossible.

**Father, inspire my expectations.** Let me believe again. Let me dream again. Let me hope again. Let this season be one filled with miracles, breakthroughs become testimonies, and overflow becomes my God-given portion. Break in me what needs to be broken. Bless what needs to be blessed. Multiply what needs to be increased.

Today, Lord, I believe for miraculous provisions—unexpected resources, open doors, supernatural supply. I am believing You for miracle healings—restoration of the mind, body, emotions, and spirit. I am believing You for a season of miraculous opportunities—divine connections, God-ordained and orchestrated appointments, favor in unfamiliar places. Unlimited blessings that will overtake me. I trust You for divine inspired breakthroughs. Strongholds will be broken, cycles end, mountains moved, and testimonies will be released. Lord, let this be a season where my intentionality will meet Your divine capability. Turn my little into more. Turn my obedience into overflow. Turn my expectations into manifestations. Turn my consecration into transformation. I believe for miracles—signs and wonders for **You are the more than enough God!** In Jesus’ mighty name, Amen.

#### **Day 4: David and Araunah – Giving That Costs Something**

**Faith Declaration:** Today, I declare that my worship will not be discounted, casual, or convenient. I offer to you, God, what costs me something—my time, my obedience, my resources, my surrender, and my devotion. Like David, I refuse to give God my leftovers. Lord, I make a faithful decision to give You, my best.

**Scripture Reading: 2 Samuel 24:24 (NIV)** “But the king replied to Araunah, ‘No, I insist on paying you for it. I will not sacrifice to the Lord my God burnt offerings that cost me nothing.’ So, David bought the threshing floor and the oxen and paid fifty shekels of silver for them.”

**Devotional Thought:** During this powerful moment of leadership and repentance, King David stood on the edge of a decision that would either reflect cheap religion or costly worship. A plague had ravaged the land due to David's earlier disobedience, and God, in His mercy, gave David a chance to intercede through sacrifice. Araunah, the landowner, offered to give David the land, the oxen, and the tools—everything he needed—**free**. Numerous individuals would accept the gift with gratitude and relief, **but not David**.

David understood something that many overlook in today's culture of convenience: **real worship will cost you something**. David refused Araunah's free offer, he was not being rude—he was being reverential. He declared, "I will not offer to the Lord my God burnt offerings that cost me nothing." In essence, David was saying: ***If it does not cost me, it does not honor God.***

**1. True Generosity Requires Sacrifice-** Often, we are tempted to give God what is considered leftover—our spare time, spare coins, or spare energy. David teaches that authentic generosity demands something deeper. Sacrifice is the birthplace of significance. Whether it is your time, resources, gifts or obedience, when you give what costs you personally something—what stretches you—you will tap into the kind of worship that genuinely honors God. True generosity hurts a little... but rewards you abundantly more.

**2. Generosity Is a Heart Posture-** God does not need our things—He desires our full surrender and hearts. David could have taken the easier route and still performed the ritual. But God does not respond to routine—He responds to the posture of our faith, trust and our hearts. It is not about the size of the gift but the sincerity of the heart. David's attitude revealed deep reverence, humility, and honor toward God. When we give from a posture of love, not obligation, we begin reflecting the kind of heart that delights the Lord.

**3. Giving Changes the Atmosphere-** David's sacrificial offering did not only please God—it ***stopped a plague***. His gift did not alone honor the Lord—it saved a nation. The power of sacrificial generosity has the authority to break curses, shift atmospheres, and release healings. You may never know how your gift—your yes, your time, your tithes—can become the key that opens the door to someone's breakthrough, or maybe your own. When giving by faith and obedience, generosity becomes a supernatural blessing from God.

**Prayer:** Father, You are holy, worthy, and deserving of all that I have. Forgive me for the times I have offered You my remains. I presented what was easy, convenient, or comfortable. Today, I echo David's words: **I will not offer to You what costs me nothing!** I do not want my worship to be inexpensive or my offerings to be empty. You deserve more—You deserve my best.

Lord, help me to live with a heart that is quick to surrender and slow to withhold. Let my generosity reflect the depth of my love for You, not the state of my finances or calendar. Strengthen my faith and teach me to value what You value. Let my giving carry the fragrance of sacrifice—not solely duty, but delight. Whether it is money, time, obedience, or energy—whatever You ask, Lord, may I say "yes" without hesitation. I believe that giving changes things. That when I release what is in my hand, You release what is in Yours. Let my offering break spiritual droughts. Let it heal what is sick. Let it restore what is broken. Let it open new doors. Use my gift to stop plagues—in my home, in my church, in my city. Let my giving be a declaration of my faith, a healing seed, and a song of worship. Today, I choose to give with boldness and with joy. I choose to love You in words and deeds. I choose to love You with my actions, my generosity, and my life. In Jesus' name, Amen.

**Day 5: Power for Impact — Living Intentionally Through the Holy Spirit**

**FAITH DECLARATION:** Today, I declare that I cannot live, serve, lead, or walk in purpose without the power of the Holy Spirit. I choose to live intentionally, fully dependent on God's Spirit to strengthen, empower, and guide me.. I renounce spirit of self-reliance and embrace Spiritual reliance. This is my season of supernatural energy, supernatural filling, and supernatural impact.

**SCRIPTURE READING: Acts 1:8 (KJV)** “But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost will come upon you: and ye shall be witnesses unto me...”

**Ephesians 3:20 (KJV)** “Now unto him that is able to do exceedingly, abundantly, above all that we ask or think, according to the power that worketh in us...”

**Zechariah 4:6 (KJV)** “Not by might, nor by power, but by my spirit, saith the LORD of hosts.”

### **Devotional Title: Intentional Living Through the Power of the Holy Spirit**

One of the greatest truths in Scripture is this: The Christian life is impossible without the Holy Spirit. **The Spirit of the living God is not optional, He is essential.** He is not merely an experience. He is the empowerment of God. He is not just a presence. He is the power that turns your calling into greater impact. Jesus told His disciples in **Acts 1:8 that they would receive power—after the Holy Spirit came upon them.** In simple words, even though they walked with Jesus for three years, heard His teaching, witnessed His miracles, and received His instructions... they still lacked the anointed power until the Spirit came. Intentionality requires empowerment. Impact requires anointing. Purpose requires power.

**Ephesians 3:20** tells us God is able to do exceedingly, abundantly above all we ask or think—but not by our strength. The key phrase is: “...according to the power that works in us.” That power is the Holy Spirit. When the Spirit is working in you: You have clarity when life feels confusing. You have strength when you feel empty. You feel Holy Spirit boldness when you experience timidity. You have discipline when you feel distracted. You feel worship arising in your heart when negativity surrounds you.

This is why Paul commands in **Ephesians 5** to be filled with the Spirit. Spirit-filled believers will speak differently, think differently, worship differently, and react differently. Their lives will produce supernatural fruit because they are plugged into supernatural power.

**Zechariah 4:6** simply states: Our might is limited. Our talent is limited. Our wisdom is limited. But the Spirit of God is limitless. 2026 is the year to be intentional about remaining filled, continuing aligned, and staying connected to the source of supernatural strength. The Holy Spirit gives you life. The Holy Spirit gives you energy. The Holy Spirit gives you wisdom. The Holy Spirit gives you power for greater impact. Be intentional. Remain filled. Walk in power.

**PRAYER:** Father, in the name of Jesus, I come before You today with an open heart, humbled, and hungry for Your Spirit. I confess that I cannot fulfill your calling in my own strength. I cannot walk out my purpose with mere human ability. I need the power of the Holy Spirit working in me, through me, and around me.

**Holy Spirit, fill me one more time.** Saturate my mind. Strengthen my spirit. Revive my heart. Empower my hands for the work of the Lord. **Zech. 4:6 “This is the word of the LORD to Zerubbabel: ‘Not by might nor by power, but by my Spirit,’ says the LORD Almighty.**

Today, Lord, I choose to live not by might, not by power, but by Your Spirit. Let every place where I have become weary be renewed. Let every place where I have been empty be filled. Let every place where I have been uncertain be guided by Your wisdom.

**Lord, help me to be intentional in my walk with You.** Intentional in prayer. Intentional in worship. Intentional in obedience. Intentional in surrender. Let my life be marked not by human effort, but by a greater supernatural impact.

**Jeremiah 29:13** You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart. Lord, I seek you with my whole heart. Everything that is within me, I generously give You.

Father, according to **Ephesians 3:20**, let Your supernatural power work in me. Help me to do exceedingly, abundantly above what I can ask or imagine. I submit my life solely to be used to glorify You. Use my voice to testify of You. Use my hands to serve You. Use my life to bless others. Use my heart to reflect You. Holy Spirit, make me a witness—bold, compassionate, effective, and Spirit-led.

Ignite in me a fresh fire. Let worship rise in my heart. Let gratitude fill my mouth. Let spiritual songs flow from my spirit. Let me stay connected to Your presence daily, hourly, moment by moment.

I ask You for supernatural energy—energy to serve, to lead, to pray, to love, to forgive, and to build what You have assigned. Let Your Spirit breathe life into every dry place, every weary place, every discouraged place. Today, I embrace the Spirit-filled life. Fill me. Use me. Strengthen me. Empower me. Create in my life a testimony of what the Holy Spirit can do. In the mighty name of Jesus, Amen.

## **Day 6: Intentional Worship Through Giving — Honoring God With Your First and Best**

**FAITH DECLARATION:** Today, I declare that my giving is not a burden it is worship. I honor the Lord with my first fruits, my tithes, my offerings, and every resource He has placed in my hands. I place God first at the beginning of this year, trusting that as I honor Him, He will honor His Word. I declare that my seed is intentional, my worship is genuine, and my heart is aligned with heaven. I give God my greatest, not my surplus. I stand on the promise that when I open my hand, God promise to open the windows of heaven. I decree this is my season for supernatural provision, increase, and overflow.

**SCRIPTURE READING: Proverbs 3:9–10 (KJV)** “Honour the LORD with thy substance, and with the firstfruits of all thine increase: So, shall thy barns be filled with plenty, and thy presses shall burst out with new wine.”

**Malachi 3:10 (KJV)** “Bring ye all the tithes into the storehouse... and prove me now herewith, saith the LORD of hosts, if I will not open you the windows of heaven, and pour you out a blessing, that there shall not be room enough to receive it.”

**Romans 11:16 (KJV)** “For if the firstfruit be holy, the lump is also holy...”

**Romans 12:1 (KJV)** “...present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service.”

**Devotional Title: First Fruits, First Worship — Giving God Your Best**

The beginning of this new year is sacred. It will set the pace for my faith, focus, worship, and my giving. Scripture teaches that whatever we place first in our lives, our hearts will become the foundation that God blesses. God commands His people: “Honor the Lord with your substance and with the first fruits of all your increase.” **(Proverbs 3:9)**

First fruit giving is not just generosity—it is lordship. **It expresses: “God, You are first in my heart and life. You are first in my priorities. You are first in my finances. You are first in all that I do throughout this new year.”**

**Romans 11:16** reveals the spiritual principle behind first fruits: If the first is holy, all will become holy. If the first is surrendered, the remainder becomes blessed. If the first fruits are placed in God’s hands, everything will be preserved and multiplied.

**Romans 12:1** call giving and sacrifice our *reasonable service*—our intentional devotion unto the Lord. God is not after the money; He is after hearts that trusts Him first. Tithing is obedience to a God orchestrated principle. First fruits is honor. Offerings are worship.

Malachi 3 gives us one of the greatest invitations in Scripture: God says, “Prove Me”, “Test Me, Try Me and watch what I will do.” When we bring what belongs to Him, He responds by opening the windows of heaven pouring out greater.

#### **When you give in faith:**

- You break the spirit of fear.
- You break the grip of scarcity.
- You break the lie of insufficiency.
- You open doors in the supernatural.
- You activate divine supply in the natural.

Your giving becomes intentionality for greater impact. **Your worship becomes a weapon.** Your seed becomes the faith that you trust God with your future. As you step into this new year, giving God your first fruit is not an event—it is divine alignment. It is saying, “Lord, bless my year. Bless my income. Bless my decisions. Bless my family. Bless everyone connected to my ministry.” Intentionality in my giving builds intentional blessings. This is the year to honor God with your first and your best—whatever God receives, He multiplies in great abundance.

**Luke 6:38** “**Give, and it will be given to you.** A good measure, pressed down, shaken together and running over, will be poured into your lap. For with the measure you use, it will be measured to you.”

**PRAYER:** Father, in the name of Jesus, I come before Your Holy throne with a heart filled with worship, gratitude, and surrender. You have been faithful, generous, and more than good to me. You have sustained me, provided for me, protected me. I acknowledge that everything I have comes from Your hand.

Lord, today I choose to honor You with my first fruits, my tithes, and my offerings. I give with intentionality, not reluctantly. I give joyfully, and not grudgingly. I give worshipfully, not casually. I place You first in my finances and over them. You are first in my priorities, first in my plans, and first in my day, month and year.

Father, as I bring what belongs to You, let the windows of heaven open over my life. Open the windows over my home. Open the windows over my job. Open the windows over my ministry. Open the windows over my dreams. Open the windows over every area where there has been a need. Let there be an open heaven. Sanctify my year as I give You the first in obedience to your word. Sanctify my income as I give You my first and best. Sanctify my decision-making as I submit to You and the word. Let my giving break every spirit of fear, lack, and limitations. Let my sacrificial and intentional giving back spiritual darkness. Let my obedience attract supernatural supply. Let my worship release divine favor.

Father, I ask You to bless my barns with plenty and cause my presses to overflow. Bless me to be a blessing to others. Increase me that I may bless others. Prosper me so I may supply kingdom work through my giving. Empower me to increase my giving beyond what I have previously sown.

Lord, I present not only my finances, but my life as a living sacrifice, which is my reasonable service unto you. I give my heart because it belongs to You. All that I have is Yours Lord. My resources, time, worship and praise. All belongs to you.

Thank You for the privilege and opportunity to sow into the Kingdom. Thank You for the promise of provisions. Thank You for blessing that follows and chase after obedience. Thank You that this year will be marked by favor, abundance, and overflow. I honor You with my first and best. By faith I believe and trust You for the increase. In the Powerful name of Jesus, Amen.

## **Day 7 A HOUSE OF INTENTIONAL PRAYER WITH IMPACT**

### ***Intentionality With Greater Impact — ONE MORE***

**FAITH DECLARATION** — We declare and decree that AWCI is and will always be called a **House of Prayer**, a church that prays with intentionally, persistently, passionately, and with expectation. When we pray in faith, we recognize that **doors will open, chains will be broken and fall, angels in heaven will move, and miracles will manifest in our midst. Blessings will overflow.**

**SCRIPTURE EMPHASIS** — **Acts 12:5** “Peter therefore was kept in prison, **but constant prayer was offered to God for him by the church.**”

**Acts 12:7** “Now behold, an angel of the Lord stood by him... and his chains fell off his hands.”

**Acts 12:10** “They passed the first and the second guard posts; and came to the iron gate... which **opened to them of its own accord.**”

### **DEVOTION — Intentional Prayer Creates Greater Kingdom Impact**

**Acts 12** is a master class in how a praying church becomes a powerful church. Herod tried to silence the church by killing James and imprisoning Peter. Fear filled Jerusalem and the situation looked impossible. The church had no political influence, no social power, no legal leverage, and no earthly solution. **But they had prayer. And prayer was enough.** The Scripture says, “**BUT constant prayer was offered to God.**” That word **BUT** is Heaven’s interruption. It means: **The story is not over.** The enemy does not have the final say. Your current circumstances cannot cancel God’s plan. While Peter was surrounded by guards, chained between soldiers, and locked behind iron gates—the church was locked into prayer. They prayed continually. They prayed collectively. They prayed intentionally. And Heaven responded. **Intentional prayer released angelic intervention.**

Before Peter moved, an angel moved. **Intentional prayer broke impossible chains.** Before Peter stood up, the chains fell off. **Intentional prayer opened supernatural doors.** Before Peter reached the gate, it opened “of its own accord.” **The church did not push the door—the door responded to their prayer.** They prayed until the impossible became inevitable. This year, God is calling us to be a church like **Acts 12**—Intentional in prayer, unstoppable in faith, and impactful in the Kingdom.

**PRAYER** -Father, in the mighty name of Jesus, we come before You with hearts surrendered and spirits awakened. Just as You moved in the house in Acts 12, we ask You to move again in this house of God here at AWCI. Make us a church marked by intentional prayer, burning passion, and unshakable faith.

Lord, teach us to pray with the same boldness, unity, and perseverance that the early church possessed. Let our prayer altars burn with holy fire. Let intercession rise with power and purpose. Let our cries reach Heaven and shake the kingdom of darkness. Let this house be known not only for preaching, not only for worship, not only for outreach, but for **prayer that produces impact.**

God, make AWCI a place where angels are dispatched because we pray... A place where chains are broken because we pray... A place where iron gates open because we pray... A place where salvations multiplies because we pray... A place where miracles occur because of prayer. Give us intentionality in our prayer life—praying with focus, praying with faith, praying with expectation, praying with tenacity. Remove prayerlessness. Remove distractions, procrastinations and remove complacency. Make us a people who stand in the gap for others, carrying the burden and, who intercede with authority.

Unify our hearts, God. Heal every division. Restore all relationships. Bind us together in unity in prayer that no division can penetrate or break our bond of unity. Make us one voice crying out to Heaven—one church believing and interceding for greater, in expectation of MORE from You.

Let every prayer meeting become a God ordained visitation. Let every gathering become a spiritual encounter with the Holy Spirit. Let our altars become a sacred place to meet you and become a delivery room or breeding ground for miracles. Ignite AWCI leaders, stir our intercessors, strengthen our families, awaken our children, revive our youth, empower our men and women with a spirit of prayer that greater will bring revival to the land.

We declare AWCI will not be a silent church, it will become a praying church. It will be a faith-filled church. We will walk in Holy Spirit boldness, a place where miracles will explode. A Spirit-led, Spirit-empowered, and Spirit-saturated church. And we seal this prayer with boldness, with faith, and with prophetic authority: **It is so. It is done. It will come to pass. In Jesus’ mighty and powerful name—Amen. Miracle Prayers for The Deliverance of God**

### **Day 8 Devotional: When You Feel Like Giving Up – Lessons from Elijah in the Cave**

**FAITH DECLARATION:** There are moments in life when even strong faith feels tired. You’ve prayed. You’ve obeyed. You’ve stood boldly—and still, discouragement creeps in. That’s where we find **Elijah**.

This is the same prophet who called down fire from heaven on Mount Carmel. The same man who outran chariots by the power of God. Yet in **1 Kings 19**, Elijah is exhausted, afraid, and hiding in a cave, convinced that he is alone and finished.

What Elijah didn’t realize is this: **feeling empty did not mean he was finished.**



God met Elijah in the cave—not with rebuke, but with care. Before God corrected Elijah’s perspective, He restored Elijah’s strength. He let him rest. He fed him.

Then God spoke—not in the wind, not in the earthquake, not in the fire—but in a **still, small voice**. This teaches us something powerful: When you feel like giving up, **God is often closer than you think**. When the noise is overwhelming, **God may be inviting you to listen more closely**. And when you think your assignment is over, **God is often preparing your next step**. Elijah went into the cave believing it was the end. He came out with renewed direction, renewed purpose, and the reminder that he was not alone. The cave was not Elijah’s grave—it was God’s meeting place.

**Scripture: 1 Kings 19:4–9** “But he himself went a day’s journey into the wilderness, and came and sat down under a juniper tree: and he requested for himself that he might die... And as he lay and slept under a juniper tree, behold, then an angel touched him... And the word of the Lord came to him, and he said to him, What doest thou here, Elijah?”

**Devotional Thought:** Have you ever felt like throwing in the towel? Like the burden was too much, the pressure too heavy, and your strength too small? Have you ever whispered to God, “**I cannot do this anymore,**” then you are not alone. Elijah—the great prophet who had just called down fire from heaven—experienced a breaking point.

One moment, Elijah was standing boldly on Mount Carmel, proving that the Lord is God. Suddenly, he was running for his life, exhausted, afraid, and hiding in a cave. He had seen victory, but now he felt defeated. Have you ever experienced a sudden in your life that is how life works sometimes? We can go from mountaintop to wilderness in what feels like a heartbeat.

Elijah’s words under the juniper tree were raw: “***It is enough; now, O Lord, take away my life.***” (v. 4). This was not only a moment of weakness—it was a cry from a man who felt emptiness, overwhelmed, and finished. And what did God do? He did not rebuke Elijah. He did not dismiss his feelings. In its place, ***God met him right there***—under the tree, in the cave, in what Elijah felt was the lowest point of his life.

**God sees us in our low places.** He sent an angel to touch Elijah, to feed him, to let him rest, and to prepare him for what was coming next. Sometimes, the most spiritual thing you can do is rest and trust God. He knows your limitations. He understands burnout. And He cares about your mental, emotional, and spiritual health.

But the story does not end with sleep and bread. When Elijah made it to the cave and poured out his heart, God did something beautiful. He did not show up in the fire. He did not shout from Heaven. He did not shake the earth. As an alternative, He came in a **still small voice** (v. 12). Why? Because God’s deepest encouragement often comes in the quietness. It is in the whispers that we will hear His reassurance: ***You are not alone. I am still with you. There is still purpose in you.***

**God still had a mission for Elijah.** He told him to go back, to anoint the kings, and to raise the next prophet, Elisha. In other words, *God was not finished with him*. And neither is God finished with you and that cave is not your coffin. In that low place it is not your last place. If you are still breathing, you are still in a transformation of change.

You may feel like giving up—but do not forget: God knows how to find you, feed you, speak to you, equip and send you again. You are not forgotten. God is not finished, seek refuge in Him, listen to that still small voice, arise—*there is still more for you to do*.

**Prayer:** Father, thank You for being the kind of God who meets me even when I am running, even when I am hiding, even when I have reached a breaking point. Thank You for not turning away or abandoning me when I am exhausted or frustrated. Like Elijah, I have moments where I have wanted to quit, walk away. Moments where fear, anxiety, or despair have clouded my faith. But God still came close!

God, thank You for seeing me in the cave. When no one else understands what I am carrying, You do. When the weight gets heavy and I feel like I have nothing left to give, You send Your Spirit to strengthen me. You do not just speak through thunder or earthquakes; You whisper. And that whisper is enough to wake up my soul one more time.

Lord, I pray today for every weary heart—every person who has been faithful but may feel forgotten, who has worked hard but now feel weary and worn out. Lord, become the gentle voice that reminds them they are seen, loved, and still called with purpose. Help us to recognize Your voice in the silence. Let Your still small whispers penetrate through the noisiness of fear and fatigue.

Breathe fresh purpose into these dry bones. Wake up, shake up dreams that have been buried beneath discouragement. Re-ignite passion that has been dulled by pressure. Give us the grace to rest without guilt and to intensify without fear. You are not finished with us.

**Father, restore my soul.** Speak to the very essence of who I am and dispel anything that attempts to discourage places inside of me. Lord, bring back to my remembrance that I am not alone in this fight and that Your presence is more than enough to sustain me. Give me the courage to get up again, to return to the assignment You have placed on my life, and faith to trust that what lies ahead remains in Your hands. Thank You for the bread You provide, the strength You give, and the whispers that leads me forward. **I declare and decree by faith:** I may feel like giving up, but You have given me grace and strength to get up and declare again victory. In the name of Jesus, **Amen**.

### **Day 9: Stand Firm in the Fight**

**FAITH DECLARATION:** I declare that I will **war in the Spirit and not in the flesh**. I refuse to fight battles in my own strength, emotions, or understanding. I choose to be strong **in the Lord and in the power of His might**. I declare that the strength I need is not mine—it comes from God. His power sustains me, His grace covers me, and His Spirit leads me in every battle.

Word of God. I declare that when the day of evil comes, I will **stand my ground**. I am covered. I am equipped. I am victorious in Christ.

**Scripture: Ephesians 6:10–13 (NIV)** “Finally, be strong in the Lord and in his mighty power. Put on the full armor of God, so that you can take your stand against the devil’s schemes. For our struggles are not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers of darkness, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evilness in heavenly realms. Therefore, put on the full armor of God, so that when the day of evil comes, you may be able to stand your ground, and after you have done everything, to stand.”

## Devotional Thought:

**1. The Strength Is Not Yours—It is God’s** -Paul begins this powerful passage with a clear instruction: ***“Be strong in the Lord and in His mighty power.”*** That is great news—because life can become exhausting. Sometimes the demands of spiritual warfare, emotional struggles, and daily trials can leave us feeling spiritually and physically weak. But God has never asked us to rely on our own strength.

Our ability to stand firm does not come from discipline alone or even deep knowledge—it flows from the Spirit of God within us. His power is not partial, and His might is never lacking. When you lean on His strength, you tap into a supernatural supply that will never run dry. Your mighty power sustains us in every circumstance that we encounter. ***Zechariah 4:6 “This is the word of the LORD to Zerubbabel: ‘Not by might nor by power, but by my Spirit,’ says the LORD Almighty.(NIV)***

**2. Recognize the Real Enemy**-Verse 12 lifts the veil on reality: *“Our struggle is not against flesh and blood.”* Too often, we waste our energy fighting people—arguing with family, blaming coworkers, harboring bitterness toward others—when the real battle is unseen.

**The enemy is strategic**, manipulates, distracts, and sows discord. Understanding why spiritual discernment is vital to your defense. When you realize the fight is spiritual, your prayer life will change. You will stop fighting with individuals and start spiritual battling *for* them in prayer. You will stop wasting your time on surface-level battles and dive deeper into intercession and recognize your authority in Christ.

**3. Prepare Daily**, Not Occasionally-The command to ***“put on the full armor of God”*** is not a one-time action—it is a daily necessity. Armor does no good hanging in the closet. Paul is not speaking metaphorically he is issuing a call to spiritual survival.

No combat soldier would ever go into war unprotected and unprepared to fight. Why would we go into the spiritual battlefield of life without truth, righteousness, peace, faith, salvation, and the Word of God? Each part plays a vital role. Your victory today depends on your preparation yesterday. Be intentional. Be equipped. **Be ready. God is with you.**

**Prayer:** Father God, today, I rise not in my own strength, but in Yours. I recognize that I do not have the power within myself to overcome the battles that I face —so I will lean completely in Your power and might. Thank You that I do not have to be the strongest, the smartest, or the most perfect. It is imperative that I must remain connected to You.

I put on the full armor that You have provided. I wrap myself in the belt of truth—reminding me who You are and who I am in You. I put on the breastplate of righteousness—not because I am perfect, but because I am covered in Christ. I walk in the shoes of peace, standing steadfast, unmovable, and unshaken in a chaotic world. I lift up the shield of faith, deflecting every fiery arrow of doubt, fear, and attack that the enemy sends my way. I put on the helmet of salvation, guarding my thoughts and reminding me of the victory that has already been won through Jesus. And I pick up the sword of the Spirit, Your living and active Word, to cut through the lies and confusion with truth and power. Lord, open my spiritual eyes so that I may see what is going on. Help me not to fight the wrong battles or get entangled in offense, pride, or distractions. Teach me how to pray with precision and authority. Make me alert, awake, and armed in Your Spirit.

I pray for my home. I cover my entire family in this armor. I stand in the gap for those around me. Where there is confusion Lord, bring peace and clarity. Where there is weakness, bring your supernatural power and strength. Where there is a spirit of fear, let Your perfect love cast it out and replace it with peace.

**Today, I declare** that I will not retreat. I will not run. I will not be overwhelmed. I am not fighting *for* victory—I am fighting *from* victory because Christ has already overcome and I stand firm in victory. I am not shaken by the storm, not moved by the opposition, nor am I defeated by the pressure. Thank You, Lord, for giving me everything that I need to stand. You are my strength, my shield, my song, and my salvation. I give this day to You. Protect me, guide me, fight for me—and through me. In the powerful name of Jesus, I stand firm. Amen.

### **Day 10: Fear, Worry, and Anxiety**

**FAITH DECLARATION:** I declare that I stand firmly on the **Word of God**, unmoved by the winds, the rain, or the storms that rise around me. I declare that God is doing the **unusual** in my life. I believe that what You have spoken will not fail, and what You have promised will surely come to pass. I remain steady, confident, and at peace—trusting the Word, trusting the process, and trusting my God.

**Scripture: Matthew 14:22–33 (AV)** 22 And straightway Jesus constrained His disciples to get into a ship, and to go before Him unto the other side, while he sent the multitudes away. 23 And when he had sent the multitudes away, he went up into a mountain apart to pray: and when the evening had come, he was there alone. 24 But the ship was now in the midst of the sea, tossed with waves: for the wind was contrary. 25 And in the fourth watch of the night Jesus went unto them, walking on the sea. 26 And when the disciples saw him walking on the sea, they were troubled, saying, it is a spirit; and they cried out for fear. 27 But straightway Jesus spoke unto them, saying, be of good cheer; it is I; be not afraid. 28 And Peter answered him and said, Lord, if it be thou, bid me to come unto thee on the water. 29 And he said, Come. And when Peter was come down out of the ship, he walked on the water, to go to Jesus. 30 But when he saw the wind boisterous, he was afraid; and beginning to sink, he cried, saying, Lord, save me. 31 And immediately Jesus stretched forth his hand, and caught him, and said unto him, O thou of little faith, wherefore didst thou doubt? 32 And when they had come into the ship, the wind ceased. 33 Then they that were in the ship came and worshipped him, saying, Of a truth thou art the Son of God.

**Devotional Title:** *You are Going to Make It to the Other Side*

**Scripture Focus:** “And straightway Jesus constrained his disciples to get into a ship, and to go before him unto the other side...” — **Matthew 14:22 (KJV)**

“For God hath not given us the spirit of fear; but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind.” — **2 Timothy 1:7 (KJV)**

**DEVOTIONAL THOUGHT:** Jesus gave the disciples a direct assignment: **“Get in the boat. Go to the other side.”** There was no ambiguity—just clear instruction. But somewhere between obedience and arrival, a storm showed up. Now that is real life. You are doing exactly what God asked, and out of nowhere, the winds shift, and life gets loud. And yet—here’s what you need to know: The storm does not cancel the destination. It is part of the journey.

**Jeremiah 1:8** Do not be afraid of them, for I am with you and will rescue you,” declares the LORD.

**Here are three key principles powerful truths:**

## 1. Obedience Does not Eliminate Opposition—It Prepares You for Revelation

The disciples did not end up in the storm because they disobeyed—they were in the storm *because they obeyed*. Jesus *sent* them into the water knowing what would come. Why? For the reason that He was more interested in what they would *learn* about Him in the middle of the moment than what they *feared* in the moment.

In the turmoil, Jesus came walking on water. They saw Him in a manner they had never seen him previously. Your storm is not proof that God has left you—it is proof that He is trying to bring you more revelation of Himself to you.

## 2. Fear Will Try to Drown and Question Your Faith. God's Power Lives Stronger Within You

When Peter stepped out of the boat, it was not perfect faith, it was *risky* faith. And yes, he started sinking—but Jesus never let him drown. Fear will try to steal your momentum, your peace, and your clarity. **2 Timothy 1:7** reminds us: *God has not given us a spirit of fear*. He gave us power, love and a sound mind.

So when anxiety starts, when fear whispers lies, remember—you have got divine backup. Stir up the gift inside you. Do not let fear write your story.

## 3. Peace Is Not the Absence of Storms—It is the Presence of Jesus

When Jesus stepped into the boat, the storm did not just fade—it *ceased instantly*. This happens when Jesus enters your space. Peace will return. Focus is restored. And the storm loses its voice.

And guess what happened on the *other side* of the storm? They did not just survive, they *discovered*. The disciples fell at His feet, saying, *“Truly You are the Son of God.”* The storm prepared them for that revelation.

So yes, the winds may blow, and the water may rise. But if He said, *“Go to the other side,”* you can take that promise to heart:

**You will get there!**

**Prayer:** Heavenly Father, I come to You not attempting to figure everything out, but simply to rest in who You are. You are Jehovah Shalom—*the Lord my Peace*. In a world that constantly pulls me in a thousand directions, I choose to pause, breathe, and focus my thoughts on You. Thank You, Lord, for every moment You carried me through chaos. I have seen how Your peace shows up in the middle of storms. I have lived through sleepless nights, uncertain medical diagnoses, financial struggles, and deep heartbreaks—yet Your presence has never abandoned me. You did not just calm the storm *around* me, You calmed the storm *within* me.

Your Word says in **Philippians 4** that I do not have to worry about *anything*, but in *everything*, I can come to You with prayer and thanksgiving. So here I am, Lord, giving it all over to you. Every burden and concern. I give Every unknown detail. Every question without an answer. I place it in Your everlasting and eternal hands because Your peace is better than my limited control.

I thank You that even when circumstances do not make sense, Your peace transcends all understanding. It guards my heart from panic. It guards my mind from spiraling. It quiets the voices of fear and amplifies the whisper of faith.

God, I will keep my mind stayed on You, especially in moments when it wants to wander into worry. Let my thoughts return quickly to Your truth. Let me see every obstacle through the lens of Your sovereignty. When trouble escalates or becomes more intense let faith rise higher.

And now, God of hope, *fills me*—fill me with joy and peace to believe. Fill the empty spaces in my heart where fear once lived. Let hope rise, not just as a feeling, but as a powerful force. Let peace reign, not just for a moment, but as a lifestyle. Let joy bubble up, not because of what is around me, but because of who lives within me.

I receive the miracle of peace that is not based on a diagnosis, a bank statement, a deadline, or a headline. It is peace that lives in me because Your Spirit abides inside of me. Thank You, Lord, for the supernatural, soul-steadying, heart-calming miracle of peace. In the name of the One who speaks “*Peace, be still*”—Jesus Christ, my Savior, Amen.

### **Day 11: Emotions ( do not React, Respond)**

**FAITH DECLARATION:** I declare that my faith is strong, anchored, and unwavering—because my hope is in God alone. By the power of the Holy Spirit, I believe God to do the **unusual and the supernatural**. I speak life into every dead place, hope into every broken situation, and restoration into every area that seemed impossible. I decree God’s promises for my life are true His plans are settled and His word in my mouth is powerful.

**Scripture: Matthew 15:21–28 (KJV)** 21 Then Jesus went thence and departed into the coasts of Tyre and Sidon. 22 And, behold, a woman of Canaan came out of the same coasts, and cried unto him, saying, have mercy on me, O Lord, thou Son of David; my daughter is grievously vexed with a devil. 23 But he answered her not a word. And his disciples came and besought him, saying, send her away; for she crieth after us. 24 But he answered and said, I am not sent but unto the lost sheep of the house of Israel. 25 Then came she and worshipped him, saying, Lord, help me. 26 But he answered and said, it is not meet to take the children’s bread, and to cast it to dogs. 27 And she said, Truth, Lord: yet the dogs eat of the crumbs which fall from their masters’ table. 28 Then Jesus answered and said unto her, O’ woman, great is thy faith: be it unto thee even as thou wilt. And her daughter was made whole from that very hour.

### **Devotional Title: A Determined Faith That Will Not Quit**

**Scripture Focus:** “Then came she and worshipped him, saying, Lord, help me.” — **Matthew 15:25 (KJV)**  
“Be ye angry, and sin not: let not the sun go down upon your wrath: Neither give place to the devil.” — **Ephesians 4:26–27 (KJV)**

**Devotional Thought:** The Canaanite woman in Matthew 15 was desperate. She was determined because her daughter was tormented, and it seemed that Jesus was ignoring her. Others tried to silence her. Even Jesus’ response seemed harsh—she would not give up. **This is the kind of faith that is determined not to quit! It believes that all things are possible.**

**I seek God during my desperate times.** When life feels heavy, and the answers seem to be delayed, **do not walk away, but press in.** The Canaanite woman let her desperation and determination lead her to a deeper faith, not discouragement. Faith is a firm foundation that stands no matter what it sees! It is a belief in a higher God that sustains you no matter the situation you will prevail!

**Do not grow weary or wear out.** Just because it has not happened yet does not mean it will not. Faith is often tested while we are in the waiting room of life. By faith continue to ask, maintain your belief, and keep worship with a heart of thanksgiving. God sees honors and your persistence.

**Do not make a permanent decision based on a temporary situation.** Emotions can mislead you when you are tired, angry, or afraid. As Ephesians remind us, do not give the enemy access through unresolved emotions. Stay focused on the promise, not the problem.

In the end, Jesus honored the woman's *great faith* it was not her background, not her social status, but her relentless belief. Her faith sustained her beliefs that God was more than able. Your miracle is on the other side of your persistence. Do not quit. Keep

**Prayer:** Heavenly Father, I come to You today with an honest heart, acknowledging that life sometimes leaves me emotionally depleted, stressed and on the verge of reacting to things that I should surrender to You. The pressures that I face, whether they are personal, relational, spiritual, or emotional. They create within me a feeling as if I am trapped between a rock and a hard place. But even now, I know that You are present. Therefore, I will not fear.

Lord, Your Word says to *“be angry and sin not.”* You understand that emotions are realistic. You are not asking me to bury them, but You *are* calling me to manage them. And so today, I ask You to help me respond with faith and not react with fear. Teach me to pause before I speak, to listen before I act, and to pray before I decide.

Increase my faith to trust that even when things feel out of control, *You are still in control.* When I am tempted to lash out, shut down, or make impulsive decisions out of frustration, remind me: this is temporary, but Your truth is eternal. Lord, do not let me make a permanent decision in a temporary moment of pain.

I surrender my emotions to You—every frustration, every unanswered question, every disappointment. I give You the fear I have masked as anger. I give You the bitterness that has tried to build up in my heart. I give You the anxiety that creeps in during the night. I refuse to allow negative emotions to open the door for the enemy to gain ground in my mind or my relationships. I will not give place to the devil.

Help me to slow down and see You in the storm. Let me be led by the Spirit, not by offense, impatience, or exhaustion. Even when I am weary, help me to remember that weariness is not weakness. You promised that *in due season*, I will reap if I do not faint. So I will not grow weary in well doing. I will not let frustration rob me of faith. I will not let anger destroy my ability to be an effective witness.

Lord, build in me a strength that is rooted in Your Word. When life presses me, let what comes out to be faith, not fear. Hope, not hostility. Praise, not panic. I choose to respond with the miracle of self-control—not because I am strong, but because *Your Spirit lives in me.*

Thank You for protecting me, as **Psalm 121 declares.** “You are the keeper of my soul.” You are the One who watches over my going out and my coming in. Even when I feel lost or overwhelmed, You are steady, constant, and faithful. Lord, I will lean on You—not my emotions, not my assumptions, not my past experiences—but on You alone.

I decree and declare that I will not be ruled by what I feel.

- **I will not allow** momentary tension to destroy lifelong purpose.

- **I will not forfeit** peace for the sake of a reaction.
- **I will trust You with my heart**, my mind, and my emotions.

Fill me now with Your calming presence. Wrap me in Your peace. Saturate me in wisdom. Let my life reflect not just what I have been through but let my light shine to reflect the God who brought me through. I ask it in matchless name in the strong, faithful name of Jesus, Amen.

## **Day 12: Having Faith That Overcomes**

**FAITH DECLARATION:** I declare that I am committing myself to the discipline of **prayer and fasting** as a regular and vital part of my spiritual life. Through prayer, I stay aligned with God’s will. Through fasting, I make room for God to do the **unusual and the supernatural** in my life. I declare that my prayers are powerful and effective, and my fasting sharpens my spiritual authority. As I pray and fast, strongholds are broken, clarity is released, and heaven responds with divine intervention. I Every spiritual battle is subject to the lordship of Christ, and I stand firm in His strength and power. I declare that God is doing the **unusual** on my behalf—releasing This is my season of **unusual victory through prayer and fasting**, and I receive it by faith. **In the mighty name of Jesus, Amen.**

**Scripture: Mark 9:17–29** (AV) 17 And one of the multitude answered and said, Master, I have brought unto thee my son, which hath a dumb spirit; 18 And wheresoever he taketh him, he teareth him: and he foameth, and gnasheth with his teeth, and pineth away: and I spake to thy disciples that they should cast him out; and they could not. 19 He answereth him, and saith, O faithless generation, how long shall I be with you? how long shall I suffer you? bring him unto me. 20 And they brought him unto him: and when he saw him, straightway the spirit tare him; and he fell on the ground, and wallowed foaming. 21 And he asked his father, how long is it ago since this came unto him? And he said, of a child. 22 And often it hath cast him into the fire, and into the waters, to destroy him: but if thou canst do anything, have compassion on us, and help us. 23 Jesus said unto him, if thou canst believe, all things are possible to him that believeth. 24 And straightway the father of the child cried out, and said with tears, Lord, I believe; help thou mine unbelief. 25 When Jesus saw that the people came running together, he rebuked the foul spirit, saying unto him, thou dumb and deaf spirit, I charge thee, come out of him, and enter no more into him. 26 And the spirit cried, and rent him sore, and came out of him: and he was as one dead; insomuch that many said, He is dead. 27 But Jesus took him by the hand and lifted him up; and he arose. 28 And when he had come into the house, his disciples asked him privately, Why could not we cast him out? 29 And he said to them, this kind can come forth by nothing, but by prayer and fasting.

**Romans 12:1–2** (AV) 1 I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service. 2 And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God.

**Devotional: Mark 9**, states that a desperate father brought his son to Jesus. The boy is tormented by an unclean spirit, and the father is out of all options. Even Jesus' states the disciples had tried and failed. The father’s words are deeply honest: *“Lord, I believe—help my unbelief.”* This is where many lives are caught **between faith and fear**, between belief and doubt. Jesus was not offended by the man’s confession. As a substitute, He responded with compassion and power. The boy was healed, and the father’s weak faith turned into a testimony of God’s strength. **This story reminds us: it is not the size of our faith, but the source of our faith that matters.**



**1. Be Honest About Your Struggle.** The father did not fake it. He did not pretend to have unshakable faith. He told Jesus exactly where he stood: *“I believe—help my unbelief.”* And that honesty opened the door for healing. Sometimes, the first step in overcoming doubt is admitting it is there. God can handle our questions, our weakness, and even our uncertainty. He’s not looking for perfection—He’s looking for surrender.

**Application:** God does not need your performance. He wants your trust—even if it is shaky.

**2. Believe That All Things Are Possible** Jesus responds to the father’s desperation with one of the most powerful truths in Scripture: *“If you can believe, all things are possible to him who believes.”* Faith is not pretending things are okay—it is believing that **God can make them okay**, even when you do not see exactly how. When we shift our eyes from the problem to the promise, our perspective changes.

**Application:** Stop rehearsing the problem and start declaring the promise. All things are possible.

**3. Defeating “This Kind” Requires Another Level** Later, Jesus explains to the disciples that *“this kind”*—that deep, tormenting oppression—only comes out through **prayer and fasting**. There are some battles in life that cannot be fought casually. They require spiritual discipline and deeper surrender. Prayer and fasting are not rituals; they are power tools. They clear the noise and help us hear God clearly. They strengthen our faith and weaken the control of doubt and fear.

**PRAYER:** Heavenly Father, today, I come before You fully aware that I am living in a world that attempts to conform me daily—through fear, compromise, distraction, and doubt. But I thank You that by Your mercy, I do not have to settle for a life shaped by this world. I can live transformed and my mind renewed, my heart purified and bold in my spirit.

Lord Jesus, I recognize that there are some spiritual battles of *“this kind”* of spirit that will not be defeated through a surface-level prayers or casual Christianity. There are strongholds in our generation that require more than emotion or intellect but, a living sacrifice, a life laid down, a renewed mind, and a heart fully surrendered to Your will.

I present myself to You, God. My body, thoughts, desires, and emotions, and place them on the altar. Not out of obligation, but as an act of reasonable worship. I do not want to just give You a part of me but live in total consecration. Purge me from anything that dilutes my faith or distracts me from my purpose. Lord, make me holy, set me apart for Your glory.

Father, in this faithless and perverse generation, I declare that I will not follow cultural opinions or political pressure. Nor will I bend to worldly convenience, fear, or compromise. Father, I ask You to transform my mind to begin thinking differently, speak with boldness and live a life that is pleasing to you.

Lord, I admit there are moments when my faith is weak. In *Mark 9*, I cry out unto you: “Lord, I believe—help my unbelief.” I do not want to live in unbelief. I do not want to speak with power but pray without doubt. I do not desire to go through the motions while battling secretly unbelief. So today, I ask You to **increase my faith**. Strengthen it. Stretch it. Root it in Your Word so deeply that no lie, no delay, and no disappointment can uproot my faith.

Jesus, I thank You that through the power of Your Spirit, I have authority over every *“this kind”* of ungodly spirit trying to operate in or around me. Whether it is fear, doubt, addiction, depression, pride, lust, insecurity, apathy,

or confusion they must all bow to the name of Jesus. I speak to every invisible battle in my life and declare that the miracle of deliverance is already at work in me.

I will not be a prisoner to generational patterns. I will not carry the weight of shame. I will not be bound by spiritual laziness. **I will fight the good fight of faith.** I will fast when my flesh says quit. I will pray when my emotions are speaking fear. I will speak life when I feel surrounded by death. Because I know that *“this kind”* is defeated not by might, nor by power, but by Your Spirit.

God of patience and consolation, as **Romans 15:5-6** says, unify me with Your heart. Let me be like-minded with those who are pursuing righteousness. Surround me with believers who speak faith, live holy, and walk in victory. And may everything I do my worship, my witness, my words—bring glory to the Father through Jesus Christ.

**Today, I am choosing transformation over conformity.** I choose faith over fear. I choose Your Word over my feelings. I choose to surrender control. I choose power over passivity. I choose You.

**Thank You for the miracle You are producing in me**—a life strong enough to defeat *this kind* of spirit, boldness to stand in truth, and surrendered to the glorify of Your name. In the mighty name of Jesus, Amen.

### **Day 13 Devotional: Faith for the Fire – Elijah on Mount Carmel**

**Scripture:** 1 Kings 18:38 (KJV) – *“Then the fire of the Lord fell, and consumed the burnt sacrifice, and the wood, and the stones, and the dust, and licked up the water that was in the trench.”*

**Devotional Thought: 1. Faith Stands Even When You Stand Alone.** There are times in life when your faith will be tested not by external danger, but by isolation. That was Elijah’s reality. He stood on Mount Carmel surrounded by 450 prophets of Baal, an indifferent king, and a nation that had lost its way. No one backed him up. No one spoke out in agreement. He stood—alone—but not uncertain. Elijah’s boldness did not come from the size of the crowd behind him but from the God he knew stood with him.

You may find yourself in seasons where your values, your convictions, or your calling make you the **“odd one out.”** You may be the only person in your family, friends, or the workplace willing to take a stand for the truth of God’s word. But know this: **faith is not validated by popularity—it is proven by obedience.**

Elijah’s confidence came from knowing that if God sent him there, God would show up there. So, when you are outnumbered and overwhelmed, do not focus on who left you. Focus on who sent you, if God gave you the word speak it and you do not need people to cheer you on. Just remain steadfast, unmovable and unshakable in your faith. Allow your stand to become a platform for God’s glory.

**2. Faith Prepares for What It Believes God Can Do**—Before Elijah ever said a prayer; he rebuilt the altar that had been torn down. He placed the wood in order, laid the sacrifice, and then—against all human logic—poured water over it three times. The entire altar was drenched. If fire had a natural chance to light it, Elijah made sure that chance was gone. Why? Because he did not want anyone to think this was a setup. He wanted it clear: if fire came, it was God, nothing and no one else.

That is the kind of boldness and faith that God is calling us to. The kind that says, ***“I am going to get things ready before I see results.”*** It is the kind of faith that gets your resume ready before the job interview, starts packing before the move, studies the Word before the battle, and sets the table before the blessing arrives.

Elijah showed us that preparation is not a waste of time, it is a prophetic act. When you prepare with expectation, you declare, ***“I believe God is going to move, and I am making room for His miracle.”***

**3. Faith Prays with Confidence, Not Performance** -When it was finally Elijah’s turn to pray, he did not put on a show. He did not scream or attempt to excite the crowd. He prayed a simple, heartfelt prayer: ***“Lord, let them know You are God, and that I have done all of this at Your word.”*** That was it, no drama! No drawn-out declarations. Just pure trust in the relationship he had with God. And in response, God did not hesitate. The fire fell swiftly, consuming, undeniable.

There is a deep lesson here. In a world obsessed with appearance and performance—even in spiritual spaces—God is not looking for perfect words or dramatic gestures. He responds to authentic hearts. Elijah knew God intimately, so he did not need to persuade God to move. He just needed to *invite* Him. So often, we think we have to say the “right” things in prayer, or that we need a spiritual resume for God to show up. But Elijah reminds us: you do not have to impress God—you just have to trust Him.

**Prayer:** Father, thank You for the power that comes when we stand in bold faith, even when we stand alone. Thank You for the story of Elijah—a man who did not bow to pressure, who did not draw back in the face of a spiritual showdown, and who trust was completely in You. Lord, I want to walk in that same kind of boldness and confidence—not in my ability, but in Your faithfulness.

In a world full of noise, distractions, and compromise, give me the courage to be set apart. When others bow to popular opinions or conform to culture, help me to stand on the truth of Your Word. Let my life reflect unwavering trust in You, even when the odds look impossible. God, remind me that my boldness is not about being loud, it is about being rooted.

**God, I ask that You help me to rebuild the altar of my heart.** Forgive me for the times that I have allowed fear or complacency to replace fire. Cleanse my heart, soul and ungodly motives and root out everything that is not of you. Let Your fire fall—not just around me, but within me. Burn away every doubt, every insecurity, every excuse. Burn away contentment, pride, and fear. Let there be nothing left but surrendered worship and holy trust.

Like Elijah, I come to You with a simple but sincere prayer: *Show Yourself strong, O God. Reveal Your glory—not so I can boast, but so the world will know that You alone are God.* Let my life point others back to You. Let every answered prayer, every breakthrough, every testimony declare, ***“The Lord, He is God!”***

And when I am feeling as if I am standing alone, I remind myself that I am never alone and You are with me. You go before me and fight for me. You answer by fire. I choose today to live with faith for the fire—to believe that You still move, still speak, and still consume everything that is surrendered to You. In Jesus’ mighty name, I pray. Amen.

## **Day 14: Authority and Victory In Spiritual Battles**

**FAITH DECLARATIONS:** I declare that I am a child of the Most High God, redeemed by the blood of Jesus Christ and empowered by the Holy Spirit who lives within me. I do not fight for victory—I fight from victory, because Christ has already overcome. What the enemy meant for harm, God is turning for good and for His glory. This is my season of unusual victory, and I receive it by faith.

**Scripture: Matthew 8:28–32** (AV)28 And when he was come to the other side into the country of the Gergesenes, there met him two possessed with devils, coming out of the tombs, exceeding fierce, so that no man might pass

by that way. 29 And, behold, they cried out, saying, What have we to do with thee, Jesus, thou Son of God? art thou come hither to torment us before the time? 30 And there was a good way off from them a herd of many swine feeding. 31 So the devils besought him, saying, if thou cast us out, suffer us to go away into the herd of swine. 32 And he said unto them, Go. And when they were come out, they went into the herd of swine: and, behold, the whole herd of swine ran violently down a steep place into the sea, and perished in the waters.

**Scripture: Joshua 23:10** (NLT) Each one of you will put to flight a thousand of the enemy, for the LORD your God fights for you, just as he has promised.

**1 Thessalonians 3:12** (NIV) May the Lord make your love increase and overflow for each other and everyone else, just as ours does for you.

### **Devotional Title: Fighting Fire with Faith**

**1. Face the Fire— do not Flee from It.** When Jesus stepped into the region of the Gergesenes, He did not turn back when two violent, demon-possessed men approached Him. These men had terrorized the area, so fierce that no one dared pass through. But Jesus did not avoid the confrontation. **He walked directly into it.** That is what faith does, it does not retreat when darkness shows up. Faith stands its ground, knowing God holds the authority.

We live in a time when spiritual boldness is needed more than ever. Evil does not ask for permission to disrupt your peace, your family, or your future, it moves forward hoping that you will back down. But Jesus modeled what it looks like to carry spiritual fire: He faced the enemy, rebuked the spirits, and cast them out with a single word **“Go.”**

**2. Do Not Fight Alone—There is Power in Agreement** Jesus never called us to fight spiritual battles solo. **Matthew 18** reminds us that *where two or three are gathered in His name, He is in the midst.* Agreement multiplies power. **Joshua 23:10** says that *one can put a thousand to flight, but two can chase ten thousand.* There is exponential strength in unity.

Too often, we isolate ourselves when we are under demonic attack. However, real spiritual victory comes when we lock arms in prayer, intercede for one another, and call on Heaven together. Jesus did not hesitate to confront the demonic spiritual realm and neither should we, especially when we join our faith together as believers.

**3. Love Is a Weapon—Let It Overflow** -It may sound unexpected in a conversation about spiritual warfare. **Love is one of the most powerful weapons we carry.** The enemy thrives in division, fear, and isolation, but God’s love destroys his agenda.

**1 Thessalonians 3:12** reminds us that God desires our love to *increase and overflow*—not just for those we like, but for *everyone*.

When we operate in love, it creates an atmosphere that invites the Holy Spirit to come in and abide. Love brings healing and breaks barriers. Love restores what hell tries to steal and destroy. But when we fight with spiritual authority and God’s love, battles are won and lives are changed to the glory of God.

**Prayer:** Heavenly Father, I lift my voice not in fear, but in faith-filled warfare. I recognize that I am not just living in a world with physical challenges—I am in the middle of a spiritual battle. Your Word reminds me **Ephesians 6:12** states **we wrestle not against flesh and blood but against principalities, powers, and spiritual wickedness in high places.** So, in the power of the Holy Spirit, I stand boldly ready to endure the battle and will not retreat. Victory belongs to me!

Lord, I understand that unclean spirits are not just trying to inconvenience me, they are trying to destroy my destiny. They attack minds to cripple vision, attack families to divide legacy, and attack faith to rob my future. But I understand that I am not powerless. I have been given the authority to trample over serpents, to tear down strongholds, and to cast out every spirit that does not come from You.

So, I will not fight this battle with passive prayers or weak faith declarations. I will fight with Holy Ghost power and fire. I will lift up the name of Jesus like a banner in the battle. I will plead the blood of Jesus over my home, my mind, my health, my finances, and my church family. I will pray strategically with unity. One can chase a thousand—but *two can put ten thousand to flight*.

Father, thank You for the miracle of partnership in prayer. Thank You for every intercessor, every prayer warrior, every brother and sister in Christ who links arms with me in the Spirit. I thank You that when we come together in agreement, *something shifts in the atmosphere*. I thank You that when we gather in Your name, You show up with power, and darkness cannot stay where Your light dwells.

We are not just praying, we are advancing. We are not just hoping—we are pushing back darkness. With every prayer we lift together, every unclean spirit must bow. Every stronghold must fall. Every scheme of the enemy must be dismantled. Even legion—that spirit that comes with confusion, torment, and layers of oppression—must flee at the name of Jesus.

Make us a church that does not only sing songs but speaks with authority. Make us believers who do not only attend services but engage in spiritual battles. Make us warriors who know how to stand on the front lines, not in fear, but in faith that the Lord our **God fights for us, just as You promised in Joshua 23:10**.

Lord, ignite a fire in me that the enemy cannot extinguish. Fill me with Holy Spirit inspired boldness that will not back down. Surround me with people who know how to pray and prevail in prayer. Let unity unlock heaven's strategy. Let our agreement bring divine acceleration. Let our prayers be like arrows that hit the target every time.

**Today, I declare:**

- Every unclean spirit must go in the name of Jesus.
- Every assignment of the enemy is canceled by the power of our agreement.
- Every breakthrough we're believing for is already in motion, because we fight together in faith.

**This is not just survival—it is spiritual victory.** We will not be outnumbered or overwhelmed, because we are backed by the armies of heaven, and we are led by the undefeated King. In the name of Jesus—the name above all names—Amen.

## **Day 15: GATHER NEW VESSELS**

### **FAITH DECLARATIONS: Making Room for the Unusual**

I declare that I will believe God for the **unusual** in what He has already placed in my hands. I choose to make room by trusting Him more deeply, and I receive the capacity to steward and receive **more** according to His will. By the grace of God, I will be diligent, consistent, and committed to completing what He has entrusted to me. I receive this by faith, believing God for the **unusual increase, unusual impact, and unusual fruit** in my life.

**Scripture Reading: 2 Kings 4:1-7(NIV)** **1**The wife of a man from the company of the prophets cried out to Elisha, “Your servant my husband is dead, and you know that he revered the LORD. But now his creditor is coming to take my two boys as his slaves.” **2**Elisha replied to her, “How can I help you? Tell me, what do you have in your house?” “Your servant has nothing there at all,” she said, “except a small jar of olive oil.” **3****Elisha said, “Go around and ask all your neighbors for empty jars. Don’t ask for just a few.** **4**Then go inside and shut the door behind you and your sons. Pour oil into all the jars, and as each is filled, put it to one side.” **5**She left him and shut the door behind her and her sons. They brought the jars to her and she kept pouring. **6**When all the jars were full, she said to her son, “Bring me another one. “But he replied, “There is not a jar left.” Then the oil stopped flowing. **7**She went and told the man of God, and he said, “Go, sell the oil and pay your debts. You and your sons can live on what is left.”

### **Devotional Title: Make Room for the Miracle**

**1. God Will Always Start with What You Already Have:** The widow came to Elisha broken, grieving, and fearful. Her husband—a faithful man who had served the Lord—had died and left behind a financial burden that was crushing her home. Now, her sons were in danger of being taken as slaves to satisfy the debt. Can you imagine the fear and hopelessness that gripped her heart? But Elisha did not offer pity—he asked a powerful question: “*What do you have in your house?*” To her, the answer was discouraging: “*Nothing except a small jar of oil.*” In her eyes, it was insignificant. But in God’s economy, **your “only” is more than enough when it is surrendered to Him.** This is a powerful reminder: God never asks us for what we do not have. He works with what is already in our hands, even if it feels small, broken, or useless. That jar of oil was all she had left—and it became the very thing God used to unlock a supernatural overflow. The little oil, when placed in the hands of God, became a river of provision.

**2. Preparation Makes Room for God's Provision** Elisha did not lay hands on the jar. He did not instantly multiply the oil in front of the widow. Instead, he gave her a clear and bold instruction: “*Go borrow vessels from everywhere—from all your neighbors. Empty vessels. And do not gather just a few.*” The implication was obvious: the miracle’s measure would match her level of **faith-filled preparation.**

**Faith comes alive.** The oil did not flow *before* the widow acted—it flowed *as she obeyed.* She and her sons went out to gather vessels, one after another, filling their house with empty jars that served as containers for the coming blessing. The more vessels she brought, the more oil God provided. The size of her harvest was determined by the size of her preparation. This principle still applies today: **God will not fill what you are not willing to prepare.** You cannot pray for overflow and live with a scarcity mindset. You cannot ask God to enlarge your territory while being unwilling to stretch your faith. Miracles often begin in the mundane knocking on neighbors’ doors, gathering vessels, preparing in expectation.

**3. The Flow Stops Where Capacity Ends.** The oil flowed. Miracle after miracle happened in that small house as each vessel was filled. The widow and her sons must have watched in amazement as the oil just kept coming. But then came a pivotal moment. She turned to her son and said, “*Bring me another vessel.*” He replied, “*There are no more.*” And just like that—the oil stopped. The miracle did not stop because God was out of supply. It stopped because **they were at full capacity.** The flow was tied to the room they had made. God’s provision is endless, but He will not pour into places we have not prepared. This was not punishment, it was principle. The oil stopped because there was nowhere else for it to go.

This challenges us to think deeply: **Have we limited the flow of God in our lives because we have reached the edge of our faith or comfort zone?** Maybe God wants to pour out more peace, more wisdom, more influence—

but we have stopped gathering vessels. We have stopped learning. We have stopped believing. We have stopped expanding.

God is generous, but He is intentional. **He does not waste oil. He pours where there is room.** If we want to keep experiencing His miracles, we must keep increasing our capacity—not specifically for blessings, but for stewardship.

**Prayer:** Heavenly Father, Thank You for being the **God of more than enough**—the God who sees our needs before we even speak to them and prepares overflow when we least expect it. Today, I come before You with a humble heart, asking You to help me make room for what You desire to pour into my life.

Lord, I confess that sometimes I have settled for small thinking and limited vision. I have allowed fear, doubt, and past disappointments to shrink my capacity to believe in greater things. Today, I hear Your word “Go, borrow vessels, and do not gather just a few.” You are calling me to prepare for an increase. You are inviting me to make room, not just for what I see now, but for what You have already purposed for my future. Teach me, Father, how to build spiritual, emotional, and practical capacity. Show me how to stretch beyond what feels comfortable. Help me to let go of the clutter—of unforgiveness, doubt, pride, and fear—that is taking up space in my heart. Create in me an open, teachable spirit so I can learn from those around me, just like the widow went to her neighbors to gather vessels. I do not want to miss a single drop of what You are doing because I failed to prepare or refused to grow.

Holy Spirit, give me wisdom to recognize the areas of my life that need expansion. Teach me how to steward the relationships, resources, and revelations You are bringing my way. If I need to go back to school, motivate me. If I need to forgive, help me by cleansing my heart. If I need to take a bold step of faith, strengthen me. Let nothing in me block the flow of what You want to pour. I declare that I will no longer be a leaky vessel. I will not waste the blessings, the opportunities, or the favor You send. I will build systems that sustain the flow of oil. I will nurture relationships that strengthen and cultivate faith that grow. I will be ready not just to receive the oil but carry it.

And Lord, when the oil begins to flow, help me to remember that the miracle did not begin with the oil. It began with obedience. It began with a woman who took You at Your word. Today, I choose that same faith. I choose to go gather. I choose to make room. I choose to trust that as long as I prepare, You will provide. Let my life be a vessel that honors You—clean, open, and ready. In Jesus’ powerful name, **Amen.**

## **Day16: The Storms of Life**

**FAITH DECLARATIONS:** I declare that this is the **Year of the Unusual**, and I will live victoriously over every storm that rises against me. The storm does not have authority over my life—**the Savior does.** I refuse to be ruled by circumstances, emotions, or opposition. I am governed by faith, anchored in truth, and carried by the power of God. This is not a season of survival—this is a season of **supernatural victory.** I will not be shaken, delayed, or defeated, because Christ is with me and He always brings me through.

**Scripture: Matthew 8:23–27 (AV)** 23 And when He was entered into a ship, His disciples followed him. 24 And, behold, there arose a great tempest in the sea, insomuch that the ship was covered with the waves: but He was asleep. 25 And his disciples came to him, and awoke him, saying, Lord, save us: we perish. 26 And he saith unto them, why are ye fearful, O ye of little faith? Then he arose and rebuked the winds and the sea; and there was a great calm. 27 But the men marveled, saying, what manner of man is this, that even the winds and the sea obey

him! **Hebrews 13:5:** (AV) 5 Let your conversation be without covetousness; and be content with such things as ye have: for he hath said, I will never leave thee, nor forsake thee.

**Psalms 22:3** (AV) 3 But thou art holy, O thou that inhabits the praises of Israel.

### **Devotional Thought: *Faith in the Middle of the Storm***

The disciples were following Jesus, and yet a storm still approached. That is a powerful reminder: even when you are walking in obedience, storms may appear. But the storm does not mean God has left you—it is an opportunity for you to deepen your trust in Him.

**Regardless of the storm, know that God is always with you.** Jesus was right there in the boat—not panicked, but at peace. His presence is your promise. He said, *“I will never leave you nor forsake you.”* That means even in your most chaotic moments, you are never alone.

**Do not allow the intensity of the storm to increase the level of your fear.** The waves may roar, but they do not outrank the Word. When fear rises, remember: **God is not shaken by your storm. He reigns over it.**

**To overcome fear, you must unwaveringly increase your faith.** Faith is not denying the storm—it is choosing to trust the One who can speak *peace* into it. Like the disciples, cry out—but do not stop there. Praise Him. He inhabits your praise, even in the midst of your pain.

Let your fear turn into faith, your worry into worship, and your panic into praise. **God is in the boat—and He’s still in control.**

**Prayer: Father God,** Thank You for being the unshakable anchor in the middle of my storm. Life does not always make sense, and the winds do not always feel fair, but today I remind my soul that You are in the boat with me. When the waves rise and the wind howls, help me not to panic, but to remember that You have not left my side.

Lord, sometimes I admit—I forget that storms do not mean You have abandoned me. I cry out in fear, wondering if You hear me, wondering if You care. But Your Word is clear. You said You would *never* leave me nor forsake me. And that promise still stands—even when the thunder rolls and the sky turns dark.

Jesus, just like the disciples, I have followed You into unfamiliar waters. I obeyed, and still, the storm arose. But today, I realize the storm does not cancel Your presence—it reveals it. It shows me where my faith ends and where Yours begins. And even when my faith feels small, You are still big enough to calm the storm.

Give me the courage to rest when everything around me says panic. Help me to worship instead of worrying and remind me that You do not just send peace, you *are* peace. You speak to winds. You command waves. You are not surprised by what I am going through—you are sovereign over it.

Teach me to stop measuring Your presence by my comfort and start trusting Your presence in the chaos. You are not sleeping because You do not care—you are sleeping because You already have the situation under control. Help me to sleep in the storm the way You did: full of trust, secure in purpose, resting in power.

And Lord, when I do feel afraid, remind me that praise is my weapon. You dwell in my worship. So, even if my voice is trembling and my hands feel weak, let me lift them up anyway. Because when I praise You, the atmosphere changes. When I praise You, fear has to flee. When I praise You, I am reminded that no storm is stronger than You.



Thank You, Lord, for being the calm in my chaos, the peace in my pressure, and the strength in my struggle. Today I choose faith—not because I see the whole picture, but because I trust the One who does. In Jesus’ mighty and peace-speaking name, Amen.

## **Day 17: Power Over The Enemy**

**FAITH DECLARATIONS: Walking in Authority, Victory, and Unusual Favor—I declare that I walk in the authority given to me through Jesus Christ.** I live victorious over every assignment, strategy, and plot the enemy attempts to bring against me. **No weapon formed against me will succeed, and no plan of darkness will prevail.** I declare that I am blessed and highly favored. I move forward with confidence, faith, and authority, fully persuaded that God is working all things together for my good.

**Scripture: Matthew 12:22–29 (AV)** 22 Then was brought unto him one possessed with a devil, blind, and dumb: and he healed him, insomuch that the blind and dumb both spake and saw. 23 And all the people were amazed, and said, Is not this the son of David? 24 But when the Pharisees heard it, they said, This fellow doth not cast out devils, but by Beelzebub the prince of the devils. 25 And Jesus knew their thoughts, and said unto them, every kingdom divided against itself is brought to desolation; and every city or house divided against itself shall not stand: 26 And if Satan cast out Satan, he is divided against himself; how shall then his kingdom stand? 27 And if I by Beelzebub cast out devils, by whom do your children cast them out? therefore they shall be your judges. 28 But if I cast out devils by the Spirit of God, then the kingdom of God is come unto you. 29 Or else how can one enter a strong man’s house, and spoil his goods, except he first binds the strong man? and then he will spoil his house.

**Philippians 2:9–11 (AV)** 9 Wherefore God also hath highly exalted him and given him a name which is above every name: 10 That at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of things in heaven, and things in earth, and things under the earth; 11 And that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

**Devotional Thought:** In a world where darkness seems loud and spiritual confusion is rising; Jesus reminds us that there is **no devil strong enough to overpower the Spirit of God**. In **Matthew 12**, Jesus heals a man possessed by a devil—someone who could not speak or see. With one encounter, the man begins to talk and see clearly. The crowd is amazed, but the religious leaders accuse Jesus of operating by satanic power. Jesus responds with undeniable truth: **A kingdom divided cannot stand**, and He boldly declares that **He casts out devils by the Spirit of God**.

This story reminds us that we are not powerless against evil. When we walk in the authority of Jesus, **we have power over devils, darkness, and every demonic plan**.

**1. Jesus Breaks Every Chain** The man in this story was held in silence and darkness—physically and spiritually bound. But when Jesus steps in, every limitation is lifted. The same Jesus who delivered that man is still delivering today. Whatever has muted your voice, clouded your vision, or oppressed your family—Jesus has the power to break it. **You are not stuck. You are one encounter away from total freedom.** “...he healed him, insomuch that the blind and dumb both spake and saw.” (v. 22)

**2. Do Not Be Distracted by Critics.** As soon as the miracle happens, the Pharisees try to discredit it. The enemy works this way; he wants to confuse what God has clearly done. Jesus did not argue or defend, He declared truth. When you start walking in power, do not be surprised if people try to challenge your anointing.

Stay focused. **God's confirmation outweighs man's criticism.** *"If Satan casts out Satan... how shall his kingdom stand?"* (v. 26)

**3. Bind the Strong Man—Then Take Back What is Yours** Jesus ends with a powerful principle: **Before you take back territory, you must first bind the strong man.** meaning before you recover your peace, your family, your purpose, you must confront and bind the enemy trying to hold it hostage. **The good news:** through Christ, you have that authority! You have been given power—not only to survive spiritual warfare, **but to win.** Jesus gave us the authority to silence devils, push back darkness, and recover what has been lost. Do not let fear lie to you. You are not powerless. You are a blood-covered, Spirit-filled child of God, and the enemy has already been defeated.

**Prayer:** Heavenly Father, I stand in the confidence of Your Word and the authority You have given me through Jesus Christ. I do not come in my own strength. I do not speak with my own power. I stand firm and speak boldly in the name that is above every name—Jesus, the One who conquered death, defeated hell, and rose with all power in His hands.

Lord, I thank You for the cross. Because of Adam's fall, the enemy once claimed dominion—the strong man ruled, and darkness had legal ground. But Jesus, You humbled Yourself and became obedient unto death—even death on a cross. And through Your humility came heaven's authority. Through Your sacrifice came victory. You bound the strong man and plundered his house. You took back the keys of death and hell, and now all authority in heaven and on earth belongs to You—and You have entrusted that authority to us.

I thank You that I have been *quicken*ed—made alive—by the power of the Holy Spirit. The same Spirit that raised Jesus from the dead now lives in me. And because of that, I no longer live under the influence of fear, torment, or spiritual intimidation. I walk in kingdom authority.

So right now, in the name of Jesus, I bind every unclean spirit that has been working against my life. Every assignment of the enemy—every serpent, every scorpion, every demonic voice, every generational curse, every cycle of chaos, every tormenting spirit trying to attack my mind, my home, my family, or my purpose—I bind you now in Jesus' name.

Your Word says that what I bind on earth will be bound in heaven and what I loose on earth will be loosed in heaven. So, I do not speak with hesitation I speak with heaven's authority. I declare that freedom is loosed. Peace is loosed. Healing is loosed. Favor is loosed. Power is loosed. I speak the authority of Christ into every place where darkness has tried to remain hidden.

Lord, I thank You for **the gift of agreement.** You said in **Matthew 18** that when two of us come into agreement on earth, it will be done by our Father in heaven. So, I join my faith with believers around the world, and I call on heaven to move. Not tomorrow, not later but now. Let strongholds break in the name of Jesus. Let breakthrough come now! Let deliverance manifest itself now! Let heaven invade the earth now!

Father, I ask You to teach me to walk daily in this power not only on Sundays, or when I feel spiritual but every moment of my life. Help me to remember that authority is not about sizes, it is about position. I am seated with Christ in heavenly places. I am not beneath but, I am above. I am not the tail, but I am the head. I am not weak, but I am empowered by the Holy Ghost.

**Today, I place the enemy on notice:** You have no access. You have no dominion. You have no legal right. I cancel your plans over my life, family and my future. I expose your tactics. And I declare that every weapon formed against me will not prosper—because I walk in miracle-working authority by the Spirit of the Living God.

Holy Spirit, empower me to live like one who has been filled with power. Let me not shrink back, but rise up. Let me pray with boldness, serve with fire, speak with clarity, and move with confidence. I do not fight for victory—I fight from victory. Because of Jesus, the strong man is already bound. And I give You all the praise for the victory that is already mine. In the mighty, matchless name of Jesus, Amen.

## **Day 18 ONE MORE: Walking into a Season of Supernatural Increase”**

**DEVOTIONAL SCRIPTURE:** Ephesians 3:20 (NIV) *“Now to Him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to His power that is at work within us.”*

**Colossians 3:23** (NIV) *“Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord...”*

**FAITH DECLARATION:** I declare that I will partner with the Holy Spirit to bring **“one more” into the Kingdom**. I declare that I will fill one more seat, reach one more neighbor, invite one more coworker, and believe for one more family to be transformed through Agape Worship Center International. I declare that this year, God will do exceedingly and abundantly above all I ask or imagine, because His power is working in me.

### **DEVOTION — Woven Into One Flow**

**Part 1 — ONE MORE Requires Believing God for More** (Ephesians 3:20) A **“One More”** season begins in the heart before it ever touches the harvest field. The early disciples remained small in number, but Jesus gave them a promise beyond their imagination. He said the gospel would go from Jerusalem to Judea, Samaria, and the ends of the earth—not because they were gifted, but because God was able.

**Part 2 — ONE MORE Requires Working with All Our Heart** (Colossians 3:23) A vision from God becomes reality only when the people of God partner with it. **“One More”** is not accidental—it is intentional. It requires prayerful focus, consistent effort, and a church family committed to giving their best to God.

**Colossians 3:23** tell us that whatever we do, do it with all our heart. This means:

- If I serve, I will serve with excellence.
- If I give, I will give joyfully.
- If I greet, teach, worship, or lead, I will do it with passion.
- If I witness, pray, or invite, I will do it with conviction.

**“One More”** requires each of us to carry the heart of Jesus:

**“I came to seek and save the lost.”**

**Part 3 — ONE MORE Requires Stepping Out for Souls** (Acts 2:41–47) In Acts 2, the church grew because the people were devoted to God, one another, and the mission. They prayed, they worshiped, they fellowshiped, they served, and they evangelized—and Scripture says: *“...and the Lord added to the church daily those who were being saved.”* **“One More”** is not simply about numbers—it is about impact, influence, and intentionality. A church in a **“One More”** season lives with spiritual urgency. We do not wait for souls to come—we go into the

highways and byways and compel them to come in.  
We do not hope for baptisms—we prepare for them.  
We do not pray for revival, we develop revival. This year at AWCI, we declare that “One More” will not be a number—it will be a lifestyle of intentional impact.

**PRAYER — Lord, Make This My Year of ONE MORE-** Father, in the name of Jesus, I thank You for calling me into a season of supernatural increase. I thank You that Your Word declares You are able to do exceedingly and abundantly above all I could ever ask or imagine. Today I partner with Your promise. Today I step into Your plan. Today, I align my heart with Your vision. Lord, make me intentional in every area of my life. Stir my heart to pray for “**one more.**” Give me compassion to reach “one more.”  
Give me boldness to invite “one more.” **Give me passion to serve so that “one more” will come to Christ.**

**Let this be a year where AWCI experiences:** one more soul saved, one more baptism, one more restored marriage, one more miracle, one more breakthrough, one more leader rising, one more family joined, and one more outpouring of Your Spirit. Give me the discipline to work with all my heart, the faith to believe for more, and the courage to step beyond my comfort zone.

Let my seat never be empty—let it be filled with “one more” whom I have invited and prayed for. And Lord, let Agape Worship Center International walk boldly into this year with unity, passion, excellence, and Spirit-filled intentionality. Let us see miracles, salvations, growth, and revival—not by might nor by power, but by Your Spirit. **THIS** is our year of Intentionality With Impact—ONE MORE. And we receive it by faith. In Jesus’ mighty name—Amen.

## **DAY 19: SPIRITUAL DISCERNMENT**

### **FAITH DECLARATIONS: Discernment, Light, and the Unusual Move of God**

I declare that the Lord is my strength and my song, and His name is my strong tower and my refuge. I am safe, secure, and empowered because I dwell in His presence. I declare that as I pray and meditate on the Word of God, **a fresh spirit of discernment is released in my life.** My spiritual eyes are open, my ears are attentive, and my heart is fully persuaded to believe God for the **unusual and the supernatural.** This is not an ordinary year—this is a year of **supernatural impact and unusual harvest.** I receive it by faith.

**Scripture: Matthew 21:18–22** (AV)18 Now in the morning as he returned into the city, he hungered. 19 And when he saw a fig tree in the way, he came to it, and found nothing thereon, but leaves only, and said unto it, let no fruit grow on thee henceforward forever. And presently the fig tree withered away. 20 And when the disciples saw it, they marveled, saying, how soon the fig tree withered away! 21 Jesus answered and said unto them, Verily I say unto you, if ye have faith, and doubt not, ye shall not only do this which is done to the fig tree, but also if ye shall say unto this mountain, be thou removed, and be thou cast into the sea; it shall be done. 22 And all things, whatsoever ye shall ask in prayer, believing, ye shall receive.

**Matthew 24:11–13** (AV)11 And many false prophets shall rise and shall deceive many. 12 And because iniquity shall abound, the love of many shall wax cold. 13 But he that shall endure unto the end, the same shall be saved.

**Matthew 7:15–17** (AV)15 Beware of false prophets, which come to you in sheep’s clothing, but inwardly they are ravening wolves. 16 Ye shall know them by their fruits. Do men gather grapes of thorns, or figs of thistles? 17 Even so every good tree bringeth forth good fruit; but a corrupt tree bringeth forth evil fruit.

**1 John 4:1** (AV)1 Beloved, believe not every spirit, but try the spirits whether they are of God: because many false prophets are gone out into the world.

**Devotional Thought:** In this age of deception and distraction, we must learn to **discern what is real and what is fake**—especially when it comes to spiritual leadership and truth.

**1. Appearance Is not Always Proof of Anointing** -The fig tree had leaves but no figs. It looked fruitful but had no real evidence. Jesus was teaching a lesson: **Do not be fooled by the outside**. Numerous voices today wear spiritual clothing but speak lies. Jesus said in **Matthew 24:11** that **many false prophets will deceive many**. Just because someone quotes Scriptures or use God’s name does not mean they are truly from Him. You need the Holy Spirit and discernment to see the difference.

“He found nothing thereon but leaves only...” (**Matt. 21:19**)

“And many false prophets shall rise and shall deceive many.” (**Matt. 24:11**)

**2. Faith-Filled People Must Be Fruit-Filled People**-Jesus did not just rebuke a tree—He was calling out hypocrisy. In a time where “**faith talk**” is popular, Jesus says it is not about what you say alone, **but what your life produces**. Real prophets produce real fruit—love, truth, righteousness, and repentance. False ones promote hype, division, and pride. You and I are called not to declare faith, but to **live it out daily with fruit that remains**. “If ye have faith and doubt not... it shall be done.” (**Matt. 21:21**) “Because iniquity shall abound, the love of many shall wax cold.” (**Matt. 24:12**)

**3. Endurance is the Test of What is Real**-Jesus said it plainly—**he who endures to the end will be saved**. False prophets will not last and their lies will crumble. But those rooted in truth, grounded in love, and walking in real faith will stand. Do not get caught up in trends or voices that sound good but do not lead to Jesus. Stay grounded. Stay prayerful. Stay in the Word. **You are called to endure and bear real fruit in a world of fake leaves**. “But he that shall endure unto the end, the same shall be saved.” (**Matt. 24:13**)

**Prayer:** Lord, in a world full of noise and busyness, give me an ear to hear Your voice. Help me not to be impressed by outward appearance or emotional hype but rooted in truth and filled with discernment. Teach me to test every spirit and measure the fruit, not only the words. Strengthen me to endure through deception, distraction, and disappointment.

So today, I ask You to open my spiritual eyes and sharpen my discernment, so I may not only identify false prophets but also stand courageously in the truth of Your Word. Lord Jesus, thank You for the miracle of Your Word—a Word that is alive, sharp, and able to divide truth from error. Thank You for the power of the Holy Spirit, who leads us into all truth. Together, Your Word and Spirit are my divine compass in a world filled with distractions, confusion, and deception. Help me not to be swayed by charisma or crowds, but to test every spirit, every teaching, every voice, against the foundation of Scripture.

Your Word says that false prophets come in sheep’s clothing but inwardly are ravenous wolves. I do not want to be impressed by gifts—I want to be anchored by fruit. Teach me to look beyond titles and platforms and examine the spiritual fruit that flows from a life. Lord, give me the courage to speak truth when lies are loud. Give me the grace to expose what is false, not with arrogance, but with conviction and love. Let my words carry weight because they are rooted in Your Word, not in opinion or fear. When false prophets arise to divide, manipulate, or lead people into spiritual confusion, let me be bold enough to say, **“This is not of God.”**

Father, Your Word tells us in **2 Peter 1** that Your divine power has already given us everything we need for life and godliness. Meaning that I do not need to walk in ignorance but, I can walk in divine revelation. Lord, I do not have to be afraid instead, I can be alert and equipped with mission. And through the knowledge of Jesus Christ, I have been called to glory and virtue, and I will not let the noise of this age dull my spiritual hearing.

So today, I commit myself to the discipline of Your Word. I will study the truth of your words and not only for performance, but for supernatural power. I will pray—not only to speak, but ears to hear. I will not seek temporary hype, but Your eternal truth. I will stay connected to those leaders who reflect Your heart and exemplify Your holiness. I will not chase signs, but with my whole heart, I will chase after You.

And by faith, I declare and decree that I will be an overcomer! I will not be deceived. I will not be spiritually lazy. I will not be led astray by emotionalism. I will not be seduced by flattering speeches or distorted doctrine. I will walk in truth, holiness, and spiritual discernment. I will stand for what is right—even when it seems unpopular.

Father, let my life be a light in the darkness. Let my voice echo the truth of the gospel. Let my example refute every lie that false teachers try to spread. And let my love be authentic, not overshadowed by blindness, but godly firmness and graciousness not compromise.

Thank You that grace and peace are multiplied as I grow in the knowledge of God. Thank You that I am not defenseless but, I am equipped. I am not confused, I am covered. I am not alone but led by the Spirit of Truth. In the mighty and matchless name of Jesus, Amen.

The Lord wins for us both physically and spiritually. The routine, however, is that after spiritual battles are won, we must continue to fight the physical battles. We must fight a good fight of faith.

Prayer Heavenly Father, Thank You for being the God who **goes before me**. Thank You for not only seeing the battles that I face but fighting them long before I step into the ring. I stand in awe that You, the Almighty, have already dealt with the **spiritual forces behind the opposition**. You have released angelic hosts to clear pathways that I could never overcome on my own. You have gone before me, driving out darkness, dismantling demonic strongholds, **canceling all assignments of the enemy**.

Lord, I believe that behind every physical obstacle, there is a spiritual influence, and I thank You for giving me victory in all areas. Your Word reminds me that the nations occupying the land were backed by false gods, but before Israel picked up one sword, **You, confronted the spiritual realm**. You struck down powers that man could not visually see, and You are still doing that for me even today. So first and foremost, I praise You for the **unseen victories**—for the doors You opened that I did not have knowledge were locked. for the divine protection You gave me from the battles I never saw coming and for the favor You released before I aware to ask.

**You are my shield, my strong tower, and my deliverer.** But Father, I also recognize that while You handle spiritual concerns, You have called me to move in the physical. You told Israel, “You will dispossess the nations.” That meant action! That meant faith must be followed by movement. You! Do not bless passivity but obedience. So, I rise today not just as a prayer warrior but as a **faith-filled doer**. I will go where You send me. I will show up to the battlefield knowing that the victory has already been secured in the spirit. Lord, give me **strength for the fight**. Give me endurance when the journey is long. Give me courage when the enemy looks bigger. Help me remember that I do not fight **for** victory instead, I fight **from** victory. Because You have already declared the outcome. I will not settle for less than what You died on Calvary to give me. I will not be passive in the face of resistance. I will not retreat when pressure comes. Because You have gone ahead of me, **I will take position.** I will walk into boardrooms, classrooms, family rooms, and ministry spaces knowing that You have made the way of victory. I can step into uncomfortable places with confidence that You are still my defender.

Lord, help me to remember that spiritual victories are not the end—they are the **foundation** for physical obedience. And every time that I take a step in faith, every time I act in obedience, every time I show up with expectation, I am honoring the victory You have already won. So today, I fight the good fight of faith. I wage war in prayer, but I build, serve, speak, work, give, and move with intentionality. I will not confuse answered prayer with the absence of responsibility. You have provided the way and now I will **walk steadfast and unshakeable the path.**

Thank You for being both the **God who fights for me** and the **God who fights with me.** I will dispossess the land. I will overcome the opposition. I will take hold of every promise. Because **You have already conquered the spiritual realm—and now, I will conquer in the natural.** In the mighty, matchless name of Jesus, **Amen.**

## **DAY 20 — *Committed to the Five Pillars of a Healthy Church***

**FAITH DECLARATION:** I declare that I am fully committed to the mission, mandate, and ministry of Agape Worship Center International. ### **Miracle Prayers For the Healing of God.**

#### **Day 21: It is Not What You See, it is What You Believe.**

**FAITH DECLARATIONS:** I declare that the rest of my life will be my best life. And I will testify of God's goodness this year. I will walk daily with the Lord. My family and I will be like a well-watered garden. We will experience divine encounters that will bring joy and gladness in Jesus name. Amen.

**Scripture: John 4:46–50** (AV) 46 So Jesus came again into Cana of Galilee, where he made the water wine. And there was a certain nobleman, whose son was sick at Capernaum. 47 When he heard that Jesus was come out of Judaea into Galilee, he went unto him, and besought him that he would come down, and heal his son: for he was at the point of death. 48 Then said Jesus unto him, except ye see signs and wonders, ye will not believe. 49 The nobleman saith unto him, Sir, come down here before my child die. 50 Jesus saith unto him, Go thy way; thy son liveth. And the man believed the word that Jesus had spoken unto him, and he went his way.

**Scriptures: John 4:50** – “Jesus saith unto him, Go thy way; thy son liveth. And the man believed the word that Jesus had spoken unto him, and he went his way.”

- **2 Corinthians 5:7** – “For we walk by faith, not by sight.”
- **Hebrews 11:6** – “But without faith it is impossible to please him...”
- **Romans 10:17** – “So then faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the Word of God.”
- **3 John 1:2** – “Beloved, I pray that you may prosper in all things and be in health, just as your soul prospers.”
- **2 Corinthians 13:11** – “Strive for full restoration... and the God of love and peace will be with you.”

**Devotional:** This story is a reminder that the real miracle begins not when we see it, but when we believe it.

**1. Faith Starts Where Sight Ends** -The nobleman had no proof. No text message from home. No evidence his son was better. All he had was a word. **And yet—he believed.** That is what true faith exemplifies. When your situation has not changed yet, but your heart has peace. When your reality does not match your promise, but your spirit says, **“It is done.”** You do not have to see it to believe it. **You must believe it to Receive it!**

**2. God Responds to Bold Belief, Not Begging.** The nobleman asked Jesus to *come* with him, but Jesus simply *spoke a word*. And rather than beg again or panic, the man obeyed and walked away trusting the word over the circumstance. That is the kind of faith that pleases God (**Hebrews 11:6**). Not faith that pleads out of fear, but faith that stands on God's character and His promise. If you can trust His word, you can walk in His results.

**3. When You Believe What God Said, You will Receive What God Promised.** The healing did not happen when the nobleman saw Jesus perform a miracle—it happened the moment the man believed. Jesus did not need

to be physically present. His Word carried enough authority and power to reach the boy from miles away. That is the same Word you have access to today.

**Prayer:** Heavenly Father, Today, I pause to thank You—not just for what I have already seen, but for what I believe by faith is already on the way. Your Word tells me that faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the Word of God. So, I lean in to listen—not to the noise of my pain, not to the whispers of fear, but to the truth of what You have said.

**Your Word is life.** Your Word is healing. Your Word is the seed that produces faith—and I receive it today, fully and without hesitation. I believe that the moment Your Word is spoken, the miracle is set in motion. Healing does not begin with a symptom disappearing, it begins with a decision to have faith to believe.

**Lord, I thank You for the miracle of faith.** I thank You that I do not need to see the evidence to believe Your promise. Faith is not about what I feel, it is what I firmly know to be truth. I do need to wait for confirmation in my body but I stand in confidence because You have already declared that healing belongs to me.

Jesus, You are the Living Word, and You said that healing is the children's bread. So, I take my seat at the table. I will not let doubt, delay, or disappointment persuade me away from what You have prepared for me. **When You say it, I believe it and that settles it.** That is true faith. And because I believe it, I speak it, I stand on it, and I declare it over my life.

Thank You for the Word that states in **3 John 1:2** that You desire I prosper and be in health, even as my soul prospers. So, I declare that my soul is prospering—in peace, in joy, in confidence, and in alignment with Your will. And as my soul prospers, I expect my body, my mind, and every area of my life to come into alignment with that prosperity.

I speak healing over every organ, every muscle, every joint, every system in my body. I declare that inflammation must go, pain must leave, and restoration must come. I bind the spirit of infirmity and release the power of the Holy Spirit to flow through my body like a river of healing. I declare that my body is the temple of the Holy Spirit, and every invader has to go in Jesus' name.

**Father, I also thank You for emotional healing.** I surrender anxiety, fear, depression, and trauma to You. I declare that I am being made whole not only physically, but mentally and emotionally. I receive the peace of God, which surpasses understanding, to guard my heart and mind through Christ Jesus.

And Lord, help me to live in unity and encouragement, just as You have written in **2 Corinthians 13:11**. I want to be a person who not only receives healing but releases it—through my words, my attitude, and my compassionate love. Use my testimony of healing as a weapon to build the faith of others. Let my life point people to the God who still heals, still restores, and still makes all things new.

**So today I say: I believe. I receive. I speak and declare Healing is mine.** Not because of who I am, but because of Who You are. You are **Jehovah Rapha—the Lord who heals**. And I thank You for the miracle of faith to believe in the miracle of healing that is already at work in my life. In the mighty, healing name of Jesus, Amen.

**Day 22: I Believe, Lord Help My Unbelief**

**FAITH DECLARATIONS: Victory Over Doubt & the Unusual Work of God** I declare that my steps are ordered by the Lord, and I refuse to be led by doubt, fear, or unbelief.

God Himself is directing my path, and He is leading me into **divine connections and godly relationships** that strengthen my faith and expand my vision. I declare **supernatural provision and unusual increase**. What could not happen naturally will happen by the hand of God. I am fully persuaded that God is able to do the **unusual** in my life.

**Scripture: Mark 9:14–29** (AV) 14 And when he came to his disciples, he saw a great multitude about them, and the scribes questioning them. 15 And straightway all the people, when they beheld him, were greatly amazed, and running to him saluted him. 16 And he asked the scribes, what question ye with them? 17 And one of the multitudes answered and said, Master, I have brought unto thee my son, which hath a dumb spirit; 18 And wheresoever he taketh him, he teareth him: and he foameth, and gnasheth with his teeth, and pineth away: and I spoke to thy disciples that they should cast him out; and they could not. 19 He answereth him, and saith, O faithless generation, how long shall I be with you? how long shall I suffer you? bring him unto me. 20 And they brought him unto him: and when he saw him, straightway the spirit tare him; and he fell on the ground, and wallowed foaming. 21 And he asked his father, how long has it ago since this came unto him? And he said, of a child." 22 And oft times it hath cast him into the fire, and into the waters, to destroy him: but if thou canst do anything, have compassion on us, and help us. 23 Jesus said unto him, if thou canst believe, all things are possible to him that believeth. 24 And straightway the father of the child cried out, and said with tears, Lord, I believe; help thou mine unbelief. 25 When Jesus saw that the people came running together, he rebuked the foul spirit, saying unto him, thou dumb and deaf spirit, I charge thee, come out of him, and enter no more into him. 26 And the spirit cried, and rent him sore, and came out of him: and he was as one dead; insomuch that many said, He is dead. 27 But Jesus took him by the hand and lifted him up; and he arose. 28 And when he had come into the house, his disciples asked him privately, why could not we cast him out? 29 And he said unto them, this kind can come forth by nothing, but by prayer and fasting.

### **Devotional Title: Faith for the Impossible**

**Scripture Focus:** “Jesus said unto him, if thou canst believe, all things are possible to him that believeth.” — **Mark 9:23 (KJV)**

“Lord, I believe; help thou mine unbelief.” — **Mark 9:24 (KJV)**

“Howbeit this kind goeth not out but by prayer and fasting.” — **Matthew 17:21 (KJV)**

**Devotional: 1. Faith is Trusting God When Logic Runs Out** -In **Mark 9**, we meet a desperate father whose son was tormented by an unclean spirit. He had tried everything. Doctors could not fix it. Time had not healed it. Even the disciples had prayed—and yet nothing had changed. But then Jesus showed up, and everything shifted.

Jesus did not shame the father for his doubt. He did not disqualify his fragile faith. Instead, He met him in the middle of his struggle and gave him an invitation: “***If you can believe, all things are possible.***” What a powerful promise. Jesus was not asking for perfection, He was asking for belief.

The father’s response is so sincere: “*Lord, I believe—help my unbelief.*” Is this not the tension we all may live in sometimes? We believe, but then we struggle, we hope, but hesitate. Faith is not pretending you are never afraid—it is choosing to believe even when the odds are stacked against you.

**2. Faith Grows Through Prayer and Fasting** -Jesus later explained to the disciples that ***some breakthroughs only come by prayer and fasting*** (**Matthew 17:21**). Why? Because there are certain spiritual battles that require more than surface-level belief. They demand focused surrender—an intentional pressing into God.

Prayer and fasting are not religious duties—they are spiritual disciplines. When we pray, we communicate with God, who holds all power. When we fast, we silence distractions and tune into God's frequency. Together, they awaken our spirit, realign our heart, and activate our faith.

The father's breakthrough did not come from effort—it came from alignment. During these seasons you may feel spiritually stuck, fasting and prayer can become the doorway to clarity, power, and breakthrough. Some victories will not be won uncaringly—they require that you must seek God intentionally!

**3. Faith Looks Beyond the Problem and Declares the Promise-** Too often, we are focused on what appears to be wrong instead of what God has said. We look at the sickness, the delays, fears, the closed doors—and we forget that God still speaks in storms, and His word overrides the waves.

**Faith refuses to be silenced by circumstances.** It lifts its voice and speaks in alignment with Heaven: **“Healing is coming.” “This battle belongs to the Lord.” “All things are possible.”** Even when you do not see movement, faith speaks as if the miracle has already happened. Why, because in the super-natural realm, it has already been done. **All that it needs, is your belief!**

In the story, when Jesus rebuked the unclean spirit, the boy fell as if he were dead. But Jesus took him by the hand and lifted him up. What looked like death was really the moment before deliverance. Faith does not flinch at final-looking moments. It speaks resurrection. It believes in restoration. It expects the impossible to bow to the name of Jesus.

**Prayer:** Believing for the Impossible Heavenly Father, Today I come to You, not with perfect words or flawless faith, but with an open heart and a real desire to see You move in impossible ways. Thank You that You are the God who still does miracles, who still parts seas, raises the dead, restores the broken, and does what no one else can do.

**You said, “If you can believe, all things are possible.” So today I choose to believe—through the tears, through the questions, through the silence,** I still believe. And when my belief gets weak, I cry out like the man in Scripture, *“Lord, I believe—help my unbelief.”*

**Stretch my faith,** God. Not only in emotional moments, but in my everyday decisions. Give me the kind of faith that prays bold prayers, expects impossible answers, and refuses to be moved by what I see. Teach me to seek You not just when I want something, but because I know You are everything.

Lord, I choose to fast—not as a ritual, but as a spiritual reset. Let it tune my ears to Heaven. Let it strengthen my spirit to stand in the gap. Let my hunger for You be greater than anything I give up.

I believe You for healing where doctors have no answers.

I believe You for provision where resources have dried up.

I believe You for peace where there has been anxiety and chaos.

I believe You for restoration where there has been brokenness.

I believe You for joy where grief has remained too long.

Today, I speak to every “impossible” in my life and declare:

You must bow down to the name of Jesus.

I may not have the full picture, but I trust the One who holds it.

I may not have all the answers, but I trust God who is never confused.

Let my faith be elevated. Let my hope be restored. Let miracles break out in my life, in my family, in my church, and in my community. I pray this not in my own strength, but in the name that is above every name—the name of Jesus.

**I boldly declare today:**

- **I believe** that all things are possible.
- **I will pray** with passion and expectation.
- **I will fast** with purpose and power.
- **I will speak** what Heaven says, not what fear says.
- I will walk in faith and testify that the impossible is becoming possible—because You, O God, are still doing miracles.

In the mighty, healing, miracle-working name of Jesus Christ, Amen.

**Day 23 The Testimony of Healing**

**FAITH DECLARATIONS: God Is Bringing About the Unusual**

I declare that the **presence of God is my portion**, and His Spirit rests upon my life. According to His promise, He goes before me, walks with me, and abides with me wherever I go. I receive divine grace to succeed—not naturally, but **supernaturally**—in every area of my life. What could not be accomplished by human strength will be fulfilled by God’s power. I declare that every limitation, restriction, and generational barrier over my family is **broken now in the name of Jesus**. I declare that **unusual doors** are opening—doors of good health, divine provision, financial increase, and kingdom prosperity. This is not an ordinary season—this is the season of the **unusual move of God** in my life. I receive it. I walk in it. I expect it.

**Scripture: Mark 9:14–29** (AV)14 And when He came to the disciples, He saw a great multitude around them, and scribes disputing with them. [15](#) Immediately, when they saw Him, all the people were greatly amazed, and running to *Him*, greeted Him. [16](#) And He asked the scribes, “What are you discussing with them?”

**Scripture: Mark 1:40–45** (AV)40 And there came a leper to him, beseeching him, and kneeling down to him, and saying unto him, if thou wilt, thou canst make me clean. 41 And Jesus, moved with compassion, put forth his hand, and touched him, and saith unto him, I will; be thou clean. 42 And as soon as he had spoken, immediately the leprosy departed from him, and he was cleansed. 43 And he straitly charged him, and forthwith sent him away; 44 And saith unto him, see thou say nothing to any man: but go thy way, shew thyself to the priest, and offer for thy cleansing those things which Moses commanded, for a testimony unto them. 45 But he went out, and began to publish it much, and to blaze abroad the matter, insomuch that Jesus could no more openly enter into the city but was without in desert places: and they came to him from every quarter.

**Devotional Title: Mercy, the Move, and the Miracle**

**Scripture Focus:** “*It is of the LORD’S mercies that we are not consumed, because his compassions fail not.*

*They are new every morning: great is thy faithfulness.*” — **Lamentations 3:22–23 (KJV)**

“*And they overcame him by the blood of the Lamb, and by the word of their testimony...*” — **Revelation 12:11 (KJV)**

**Devotional:** A New Morning, A New Mercy- Some days may feel like survival. The weight of life presses down, and we wonder if we'll make it through. But then the sun rises again. A new morning breaks. And with it arrives something miraculous happens, mercy. Not reused mercy. Not discarded grace. But fresh, tailor-made, Heaven-sent mercy for today.

Lamentations remind us that we are not consumed—not because we're strong, but because **God is faithful**. His mercy keeps showing up, not because we deserve it, but because He cannot stop loving us. Even when we feel forgotten, we are seen. Even when we feel trapped or overwhelmed, God is still moving.

You may not feel that a miracle is in the making—but every step you take in faith is proof that God is not done. His mercy will carry you. His move will shift you. And your life will testify to His miraculous power.

**1. The Mercy: God Sees You, Covers You, and Carries You—**Mercy is more than a second chance—it is a daily covering. Every time we wake up, it is mercy that keeps us. Mercy says, *“I know what you have been through—and I am not holding it against you.”* Mercy sees your mistakes, your fears, your fatigue—and offers compassion instead of condemnation.

In Lamentations, the prophet Jeremiah is weeping the destruction of Jerusalem. Hope seems lost, judgment has fallen, and darkness surrounds him. Yet, in the middle of his sorrow, he remembers one unshakable truth: *“It is of the LORD's mercies that we are not consumed.”* The city may be in ruins, but mercy remains.

That same mercy is available to you. Maybe you are tired. Maybe life has not gone the way you expected. But if you are still breathing, God's not finished. His mercy did not run out last night—and it will not run out today.

**2. The Move: When God Shifts Everything—Suddenly—**We often expect God to move on our timeline, but Scriptures reveals something different: God does not move in a hurry—but when He moves, it is often sudden. We serve a God of **“suddenly.”** One moment there is nothing, the next moment everything shifts. The waiting may feel long, but the breakthrough can happen in an instant.

Jesus did not only recognized people's pain—He was *moved* by it. His compassion was not passive. It triggered action. It opened blind eyes, healed broken bodies, and raised the dead. And that same compassion moves Him today—on your behalf.

You may be in a season where nothing appears to be different. The prayers look like they are unanswered. The doors remain closed. But do not mistake the silence for absence. God's character has not changed. When the appointed time comes, God will move—and when He moves, everything changes.

**3. The Miracle: Your Life Is the Testimony Hell Cannot Silence—Revelation 12:11** reminds us that our victory comes not just from the blood of Jesus—but from our story. The word of your testimony is your weapon. Every time you share how God kept you, healed you, lifted you, or saved you—you are pushing back darkness.

You may not realize it, but the fact that you are still standing is miraculous. You have walked through fire and yet not burned. You have cried but never fell apart or destroyed. You have bent but did not break. That is the miracle. It is not always the flashy moment or dramatic deliverance—it is the quiet strength to keep going, knowing God is holding you.

Your miracle might not look like somebody else's, but your survival is sacred. Your progress matters. Your persistence has power. You are the living proof that God's mercy and grace produced miracles that speak louder than fear.

**Final Encouragement:** So, hold on and **Do Not give up**, His mercy is forever. His move is coming. And your miracle is already in motion. Even if today looks like yesterday, trust that He's doing something fresh inside of you. Keep standing. Keep believing. And when you cannot see the full picture, rest in the truth that God's hand is still writing your story.

**Prayer:** Heavenly Father, it is because of your compassionate mercy that I have not been destroyed. As a result of the many miracles, you have already given me, I am a living testimony of your **Miracle Working Power**. I thank you for your continuous and endless supply of mercy and grace towards me, and as a result of every **Miracle Healing** in my life, I have the power to overcome the enemy. I come to You today in awe of who You are—faithful, compassionate, and full of mercy. You are the One who sees me, knows my condition, and yet never turns away. Instead, You draw near with love that heals, restores, and lifts me out of the pit.

Father, Your Word declares that we overcome by the precious blood of the Lamb and by the word of our testimony. God, I thank You for the blood of Jesus that covers me, cleanses me, and gives me the authority to stand in victory. It is not my strength, not my record, and not my perfection—but the finished work of Christ on the cross that makes me more than a conqueror.

And Lord, I have a testimony. I may have scars, but they are signs of survival. I may have stories of struggle, but they are proof that You brought me through. Every trial I have faced, every pit I have fallen into, every moment when I could have been consumed—you stepped in. You redeemed me. You crowned me with Your love and mercy. You proved again and again that You are the God who saves and delivers.

Occasionally, God, I am confessing that I grow weary in waiting. I question why the answer has not come, why the healing has not manifested, or why the breakthroughs feel delayed. But You remind me that while You may not move when I want You to, You always move at the right time. And when You do—it is sudden. It is undeniable. It is miraculous.

Today, I choose to believe You for a **“suddenly.”** I choose to believe You are still writing my testimony even in silence, You are working. Even in the pain, You are present. Even in waiting, Lord You are weaving together something glorious. My life is not a string of random events—it is a living, breathing testimony of Your miracle-working power.

God, I release fear, doubt, and discouragement. I silence the voice of the enemy that tells me it is too late, that I have messed up too badly, or that You have forgotten me. I declare: **I am an overcomer**. By Your blood, by my testimony, and by my surrender, and Faith, I walk and dwell in victory today.

Thank You for redeeming my life from destruction. Thank You for crowning me with lovingkindness and tender mercy. Thank You for satisfying my life with good things and renewing my strength like the eagle.

Let my mouth never grow silent in giving You praise. Let my life always point back to Your grace. I do not live for myself—I live to reflect Your glory. **I am Yours, Lord**. Use every part of my story for Your purpose and glory. In Jesus' mighty name, **Amen**.

**Day 24: Authority of Healing**

**FAITH DECLARATIONS:** I declare that every stronghold in my life is cast out in Jesus name. Every limitation that stands in my way is removed. As I work, I will prosper in all I do, my capacity increases daily because of the grace of God at work in my life. I am well able to complete all I start in Jesus name. Amen.

**Scripture: Matthew 8:5–13 (AV)** 5 And when Jesus was entered into Capernaum, there came unto him a centurion, beseeching him, 6 And saying, Lord, my servant lieth at home sick of the palsy, grievously tormented. 7 And Jesus saith unto him, I will come and heal him. 8 The centurion answered and said, Lord, I am not worthy that thou shouldest come under my roof: but speak the word only, and my servant shall be healed. 9 For I am a man under authority, having soldiers under me: and I say to this man, Go, and he goeth; and to another, Come, and he cometh; and to my servant, Do this, and he doeth it. 10 When Jesus heard it, he marveled, and said to them that followed, Verily I say unto you, I have not found so great faith, no, not in Israel. 11 And I say unto you, that many shall come from the east and west, and shall sit down with Abraham, and Isaac, and Jacob, in the kingdom of heaven. 12 But the children of the kingdom shall be cast out into outer darkness: there shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth. 13 And Jesus said unto the centurion, go thy way; and as thou hast believed, so be it done unto thee. And his servant was healed in the selfsame hour.

**Devotional Title: Dwelling in Power—Faith, Authority, and the Secret Place**

**Scripture Focus:** “Speak the word only, and my servant shall be healed.” — **Matthew 8:8 (KJV)**

“He that dwelleth in the secret place of the most High shall abide under the shadow of the Almighty.” — **Psalm 91:1 (KJV)**

“Let us therefore come boldly unto the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy, and find grace to help in time of need.” — **Hebrews 4:16 (KJV)**

**Devotional:** Covered by Power, Strengthened by Grace- In a world filled with chaos, uncertainty, and spiritual warfare, many live under the constant shadow of fear—fear of disease, failure, rejection, and limitation. But for those who walk by faith, there is a deeper reality: God offers a covering. Psalm 91 calls it “**the secret place of the Most High**”—a place not of escape, but of divine empowerment.

To dwell in that place is to live under the authority and protection of a sovereign God who speaks healing with a word, casts out fear with His presence, and strengthens His people with mercy. The Roman centurion in Matthew 8 understood something many believers miss: faith is rooted not just in asking—but in understanding the power of spiritual authority.

**1. Bold Faith Begins with Knowing God’s Authority**-The Roman centurion did not have a background in Jewish law or temple worship, but he had a revelation many in Israel missed: Jesus had authority that surpassed all earthly power. The centurion did not ask Jesus to touch his servant. He did not beg Him to come to his house. Instead, he said, “**Just speak the word, and my servant will be healed.**”

**That is bold faith.** He understood that Jesus operated like a military commander—when He gave an order, heaven obeyed. That understanding caused Jesus to marvel. Imagine that—the Son of God astonished by someone’s faith.



Many approach God with unsurely, hesitantly, or fearfully. **Hebrews 4:16** calls us to come boldly to the throne of grace—not because of who we are, but because of who God is. When you know His authority, you can trust His Word without needing to see evidence first.

**2. Miracles Begin Where Mercy Meets Belief**—When the centurion cried out for his servant, Jesus did not respond with judgment or questions. He answered with mercy. “I will come and heal him,” Jesus said—no hesitation, no prerequisites. That is the nature of our Savior: compassionate, responsive, and always moved by sincere faith.

Mercy is what keeps us when we fall short. It is not earned, it is extended. And it flows unconditionally when faith starts. The servant was healed “in the selfsame hour,” not because of his own faith, but because someone stood boldly in the gap for him.

This is what intercessory faith is when you pray for your children, your coworkers, your city—you are standing like that centurion, calling on Jesus to move. And He does. Miracles break out when faith-filled people tap into mercy-filled power.

**3. God’s Shadow Is Not a Place to Visit**—It is where You Dwell. **Psalms 91** gives us one of the most beautiful promises in Scripture: “**He that dwells in the secret place...** shall abide under the shadow of the Almighty.” This is not about a quick devotional moment or a Sunday morning experience, it is a lifestyle of continuous surrender and communion.

To dwell is to remain. It means you carry God’s presence into your home, your workplace, your decisions, and your struggles. When you dwell, you do not panic in the storm—you rest under God’s covering. You do not fear bad news—you trust the One who is never surprised. You do not live bound by limitations—you live empowered by grace.

This kind of dwelling life leads to divine acceleration. As you work, you prosper. As you stretch, your capacity grows. And as you believe, your strongholds break.

**Prayer:** Today, I declare that every stronghold in my life is cast out in Jesus’ name. Every limitation and barrier that stands in my way is removed by the authority of God. As I work, I will prosper. As I trust, I will see breakthrough. My faith is not based on sight—it is rooted in His Word. I live under the shadow of the Almighty. I walk in boldness, I operate in grace, and I finish what I start. I am well able, fully equipped, and covered by divine protection. Lord, there are moments when I feel worn out. Life can be challenging. Pain lingers and fear tries to take over. But Your Word prompts me that I have a Savior who understands. Jesus, my High Priest, who knows every emotion I have felt. You have experienced heartaches, You have felt what it is like to be human. And because of that, You invited me to bring everything to You! All, my fears, my confusion, my pain, and my hope.

So today, I run to You—not as a stranger, but as Your child. I am not begging for leftovers; I am receiving what You have already freely given: **mercy and grace**. I come to You for healing in body, mind, soul, and spirit. I need You in every part of me.

God, You are Almighty. No sickness, no fear, no demonic force is greater than You. Nothing catches You off guard. Your power is not just a promise; it is called truth. When I rest in You, I am protected. According to Psalm

91, when I dwell in Your presence, I am safe under Your shadow. That is not just poetry, it is a shield that holds firmly against every storm.

So, I speak healing in Jesus' name—not just for myself, but for those I love. I declare peace over every anxious thought. I declare strength where I feel weak. I decree and declare that every disease, every diagnosis, every dark force must bow to the authority of Jesus Christ. I thank You for doctors and medicine—but my ultimate faith will always remain in the Great Physician.

You are my refuge. You are my fortress. You are my God—and I trust You completely. Today, I choose to stand in faith—not because I have earned it, but because Jesus made a way for me to come boldly. I receive Your mercy. I embrace Your grace. I rest in the truth that You are working, even when I do not see the full picture. You are healing what is broken, restoring what is lost, and surrounding me with love I can never be separated from. In the strong and beautiful name of Jesus I pray, In Jesus' name, amen.

## **Day 25: Faith of Intercession**

**FAITH DECLARATIONS:** I declare that the Lord of increase is my God. The Lord guides our feet into places of honor and glory. I declare that my family, business, church, and nation will see an increase on every side. I decree that the earth shall yield her increase to me and my house daily as we serve and live for God in Jesus' name. Amen.

**Scripture: Luke 5:19–26** (AV) 19 And when they could not find by what way they might bring him in because of the multitude, they went upon the housetop, and let him down through the tiling with his couch into the midst before Jesus. 20 And when he saw their faith, he said unto him, Man, thy sins are forgiven thee. 21 And the scribes and the Pharisees began to reason, saying, who is this which speaketh blasphemies? Who can forgive sins, but God alone? 22 But when Jesus perceived their thoughts, he answering said unto them, what reason ye in your hearts? 23 Whether is easier to say, thy sins be forgiven thee; or to say, Rise up and walk? 24 But that ye may know that the Son of man hath power upon earth to forgive sins, ( he said unto the sick of the palsy,) I say unto thee, Arise, and take up thy couch, and go into thine house. 25 And immediately he rose up before them, and took up that whereon he lay, and departed to his own house, glorifying God. 26 And they were all amazed, and they glorified God, and were filled with fear, saying, we have seen strange things today.

## **The Power of Standing Together**

**Scripture Focus:** *“We then that are strong ought to bear the infirmities of the weak, and not to please ourselves.” — Romans 15:1 (KJV)*

*“Two are better than one... for if they fall, the one will lift up his fellow... and a threefold cord is not quickly broken.” — Ecclesiastes 4:9–12 (KJV)*

**Devotional: Strength Measured by Togetherness**—In the world, strength is often measured by how self-reliant and independent we can be—how much we can do without help. But in the kingdom of God, true strength is measured by how well we stand together. It is not about how much we can carry alone, but how willing we are to help carry the burdens of others.

We were never meant to walk this journey of faith in isolation or alone. Scripture reminds us that two are better than one—because there will come a time when everyone falls, grows weary, or feels overwhelmed. And in those

moments, victory is found not in independence, but in interdependence—in the hands that lift, the hearts that intercede, and the shoulders that help carry the weight.

**1. Compassion That Moves You to Intercede-** Compassion is not just an emotion—it is a holy reaction. When **Romans 15:1** tells us that the strong ought to bear the infirmities of the weak, it is not suggesting pity, it is inviting us to participation. It is not enough to see someone hurting; God calls us to respond.

True compassion does not stay silent when someone is drowning in discouragement or overwhelmed with grief. It gets in the boat with them. It kneels beside them. It lifts them through prayer and encouragement.

Jesus constantly modeled this kind of compassion. When He saw the crowds, He was moved—not to judge, but to heal, feed, teach, and pray. Likewise, when we see someone struggling with their faith, a crisis, or even personal failure, we are called not to criticize, but to intercede.

**2. Faith That Reaches Beyond the Obstacle-**There are moments when people lose sight of hope. Their situation looks too big, too broken, too far gone. That is when your faith can carry them. That is the beauty of standing together in the Spirit—we can believe on behalf of others when they no longer have the strength to believe for themselves.

In **Luke 5**, four friends tore through a roof just to lower a paralyzed man into the presence of Jesus. Scripture says, “*when Jesus saw their faith,*” He healed the man. The miracle came not because of the man’s own belief—but because someone else’s faith stood in the gap.

That is what intercession is, it presses through barriers. It lifts those who cannot strengthen themselves. It declares God’s promises even when the situation screams otherwise. Faith for others is an act of love and spiritual warfare.

**3. Strength in Unity That Cannot Be Broken-**Ecclesiastes reminds us that a threefold cord is not easily broken. There is divine strength in unity—when we walk together, fight together, and lift one another in prayer, we become spiritually unbreakable.

The reward of standing together does not only go to the one being lifted. It edifies the one doing the lifting as well. Every time you invest your strength into someone else, you sow into your own future strength. God honors those who carry others when they are down.

And when you need help, the very ones you have stood for will stand for you. That is the cycle of kingdom community: giving, lifting, and growing together.

Today, look around. Someone needs your strength, your prayer, your faith. And together, you will discover the reward of a cord that cannot easily be broken.

**Prayer:** Lord Jesus, today I intercede on behalf of those you have assigned to my life. I recognize that there are times when they are weak and need me, and during times when I am weak and need them. Thank you for the **Miracle Power of Intercession** that you have given us to lift one another up, encouraging and supporting one another in prayer. Lord Jesus, Thank You for inviting me to stand in the gap for others. What a gift it is—not just to pray for myself, but to carry the burdens, battles, and breakthroughs of those You have placed in my life. Today, I step into the ministry of intercession—not as a duty, but as a divine privilege.

You have given me eyes to see the struggle in others and a heart that feels what they feel. You have placed compassion within me—not to be overwhelmed, but to be activated in prayer. Just like You intercede for us at the

right hand of the Father, I choose to follow Your example and intercede for those who are weary, wounded, or in need of a breakthrough.

God, I know there are moments when the people around me do not have the strength to pray for themselves. Their faith may feel fragile, their hearts are heavy, and their hope is barely holding on. But that is when You call me to increase and to be the one who lifts them up, speaks life over them, and stands in the gap until they can stand again. Give me the compassion to intercede with empathy and love. So, I do not just pray with words, but with understanding. Give me the faith to press past obstacles—even when answers seem delayed, even when the situation looks impossible. Let me be a person who refuses to give up praying, even when others do.

Strengthen me with the power to prevail with the kind of intercession that does not quit, does not back down, and does not let go until the miracle comes. I believe You are still the God who hears, heals, and answers. So, I intercede for the sick to be healed, for the lost to be found, for the bound to be set free, and for the weary to be refreshed. Lord, thank You for the reward that comes with persistent prayer. Not always in the form we are expecting, but always in alignment with Your perfect will. Help me celebrate every small shift, every answered prayer, every ounce of peace that comes as a result of lifting others up.

And Lord, I thank You for the people who intercede for me. For those who pray when I do not have the words. For those who cover me in faith when I am full of fear. For every whisper of encouragement, every declaration of hope, and every spiritual battle fought behind the scenes—I am grateful. **1 Thessalonians 5:11 reminds me**, I will choose to encourage and build up others, just as others have done for me. I will, speak life, pray in faith, and stand with boldness—because intercession is not just a practice, it is a lifestyle of love. In Jesus' name, Amen.

## **Day 26: ENLARGE THE PLACE OF YOUR TENT**

**FAITH DECLARATIONS:** I declare the joy of the Lord is my strength. I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me. I declare that my going out and coming in is blessed. I am well able to accomplish every goal. I set out to accomplish and no weapon formed against me shall prosper. Doors of opportunities are opened to me, and every crooked path is strengthened in Jesus' name. Amen.

**Scripture Reading: Isaiah 54:1-5** **1** “Sing, barren woman, you who never bore a child, burst into song, shout for joy, you who were never in labor; because more are the children of the desolate woman than of her who has a husband,” **2** “**Enlarge the place of your tent, stretch your tent curtains wide, do not hold back; lengthen your cords, strengthen your stakes.**

**DEVOTIONAL:** After seventy years of living in captivity, Israel returned to a devastated land. As a result of the devastation, both those who returned and those who had remained behind felt defeated. When they started to rebuild the nation, they built small homes and dwelling places. They could not dare to dream or construct big things. The Lord looked at what His people were building and charged them to step out of their self-imposed limitations. He told them to enlarge, stretch, and lengthen.

**Enlarge the place of your tent.** Although the land was large, they chose to build their homes on tiny plots of land. As a result, they limited themselves to a small part of the land. God was unhappy with their attitudes. He told them to build on larger plots of land. Like Israel's returnees, numerous times we have push ourselves into small corners when God has given us so much more room to grow! To enlarge the place of our tents, we must take these steps.

**Open your mind.** When things are closed, they are not able to receive or increase in any area of our lives. As people of God, we must be open to receiving more from the Lord. Many times, past disappointments can close our minds to future possibilities. A mind that is closed cannot receive new ideas or be inspired to have a bigger vision. No matter our past experiences, God wants to give us new experiences. We must open our minds and hearts to the new things that God is bringing our way.

**Make room for God.** When God makes a promise to us, that promise must be accommodated in our hearts. God's promises and plans must be firmly planted comfortably inside of us. Therefore, we must count God as part of the plans. We cannot simply count what we have in our hands and see that as all that we have. No! We have exceedingly, abundantly more. We have God. Make room for Him in your plans. He is an Ephesians 3:20 God!

**Stretch yourself.** The concept here is something that is narrow and must be pulled out. Stretching requires an effort on our parts which means that no matter how hard it is for us to do the things that God wants us to do, we must make the sincere and godly effort to do it. We must place ourselves where the Lord wants us to be.

**Prayer:** Thank You for being the God of increase, expansion, and new beginnings. You are not a God of limitations, and You never called me to live in a small corner of what You have promised. Today, I hear Your invitation to **enlarge the place of my tent**—to step out of the narrow places I have settled for and to step into the wide-open spaces of Your purpose for my life.

Lord, I confess that at times I have chosen safety over stretching. I have built small when You called me to dream big. I have allowed past failures and disappointments to shrink my expectations. But today, I choose to believe that there is more. There is more grace, more growth, more opportunity, and more territory You want me to claim.

So right now, I **open my mind and my heart**. I open them to the new things You want to do. I refuse to be stuck in old patterns of thinking or locked in fear of the unknown. I let go of the mindset that says, "This is all there is." Because with You, Lord, this is not all there is. You are the **Ephesians 3:20** God, who does exceedingly, abundantly above all I can ask or imagine. So, I lift the lid off my thinking. I make space for fresh vision, fresh faith, and fresh fire.

God, I choose today, to **make room for You** in my life, intentional room. **I will be intentional in all that I do. Father that includes my time. Not just leftover room or moments of convenience, but intentional room.** Let every plan, every decision, every dream start with You. Remind me that what I hold in my hands is never the full picture—because I also have You in my heart, and You are more than enough. Teach me to trust what You have spoken more than what I see. Teach me to plan with expectation, to prepare with faith, and to move forward with confidence in Your promises.

**Ephesians 5:15 -17 I will move with strategy, clarity and wisdom.** [15](#) So be careful how you live. Don't live like fools, but like those who are wise. [16](#) Make the most of every opportunity in these evil days. [17](#) Don't act thoughtlessly but understand what the Lord wants you to do.

**And Lord, I say yes to the stretching.** Even when it is uncomfortable and even when it costs me. Although, I may feel out of place or unsure. Stretch my thinking. Stretch my capacity. Stretch my faith. Give me the courage to go beyond what feels easy so I be able to grow into who You created me to be. I know stretching comes with resistance, but I know it leads to strength. **I will be intentional in every area of my life.** Strength me, so I will move intentionally. I am a winner; my steps are ordered of You.

Today, I reject the lies that I am too late, too old, too inexperienced, or too limited. I declare that I am open, available, and willing. I will take intentional bold steps forward into new territories, new levels of faith, and new assignments that You have prepared for me. I will move forth with Godly wisdom, clarity and intentionality in my prayers and movements.

So, Father, enlarge my tent. Expand my vision. Strengthen my stakes. And let my life be a reflection of Your limitless power working through a surrendered heart. In the mighty and matchless name of Jesus, **Amen.**

## **Day 27: Faith Over Fear**

**FAITH DECLARATIONS:** I declare in the name of Jesus; I draw divine strength to grow in character and faith. I come against every agenda of the enemy to destabilize my walk with the Lord and declare that I grow from strength to strength and from glory to glory in Jesus' name. Amen.

**Scripture: Luke 8:49–56** (AV) 49 While he yet spake, there cometh one from the ruler of the synagogue's house, saying to him, thy daughter is dead; trouble not the Master. 50 But when Jesus heard it, he answered him, saying, Fear not: believe only, and she shall be made whole. 51 And when he came into the house, he suffered no man to go in, save Peter, and James, and John, and the father and the mother of the maiden. 52 And all wept, and bewailed her: but he said, Weep not; she is not dead, but sleepeth. 53 And they laughed him to scorn, knowing that she was dead. 54 And he put them all out, and took her by the hand, and called, saying, Maid, arise. 55 And her spirit came again, and she arose straightway: and he commanded to give her meat. 56 And her parents were astonished, but he charged them that they should tell no man what was done.

**Scripture Focus:** “For God hath not given us the spirit of fear; but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind.” — **2 Timothy 1:7**

“He that hath an ear, let him hear what the Spirit saith unto the churches... To him that overcometh...” —

**Revelation 2:7**

“If any man has ears to hear, let him hear... unto you that hear shall more be given.” — **Mark 4:23–25**

## **Devotional Title: He Maketh Me Bold**

**Devotional: When Fear Speaks Loudly—Listen for the Voice of the Spirit**—We are living in a world that is louder than ever—headlines scream panic, uncertainty floods our timelines, and bad news travels faster than ever before. In the middle of the noise, fear tries to dominate the atmosphere. It tells us things will never change. It questions God's promises. It whispers lies to cloud your faith. But as believers, we must remember this: **fear is not from God.** It is not your inheritance. It is not your destiny.

God has equipped you with a spiritual toolkit: **power to act, love to endure, and a sound mind to discern.** These are not just spiritual ideas—they are weapons against fear's grip. But if we are going to walk in that reality, we must train our ears and hearts to **tune in to the voice of the Spirit**, especially when everything else is screaming for our attention. In Luke 8, we see two powerful stories—one of a woman who refused to be ruled by fear, and another of a father who dared to believe for resurrection. These stories remind us that even when fear is loud and circumstances look hopeless, **Jesus is still moving, still healing, and still calling us to rise.**

**1. Fear May Speak First, But Faith Has the Final Word**—Jairus came to Jesus with desperation in his voice—his daughter was dying. But before Jesus could even reach her, a woman interrupted the moment. She was bleeding. Isolated. Rejected. And she had every reason to stay hidden in fear. But she pushed through the crowd

anyway, saying to herself, *“If I can just touch His garment, I will be healed.”* This woman teaches us something crucial: **faith is not about the absence of fear—it is moving forward despite it.** Her condition said, “stay home,” society said, “stay away,” but her spirit said, “press in.” And the moment she touched Jesus, virtue flowed, and healing came. When Jesus asked, *“Who touched me?”* she could have run away. But instead, she came forward trembling—**afraid, yet full of faith.** And Jesus called her *“daughter.”* He did not just heal her body—He restored her identity.

**2. Be Careful What You Hear—Your Faith Is Fed by Your Focus-** As Jesus continued toward Jairus’ house, messengers came with bad news: *“do not bother the teacher. Your daughter is dead.”* Fear had found its way into the story again. But Jesus immediately responded with a bold word: *“Fear not. Only believe, and she shall be made whole.”* Jesus did not allow that bad report to dictate the atmosphere. He took control of the narrative. And then, He only allowed Peter, James, and John—and the girl’s parents—to go in with Him. Why? **Jesus understood the power of atmosphere, agreement, and what you allow into your ears and heart.** Mark 4 reminds us to be careful what we hear—because the measure you give to what you hear will determine what comes back to you. If you feed your faith with fear, you will be anxious. But if you guard your hearing and tune in to what the Spirit is saying, your faith will grow stronger—even in impossible moments.

**3. Power, Love, and a Sound Mind—Your Tools for the Battle** When Jesus arrived, the house was filled with wailing. Mourning. Hopelessness. But Jesus said something radical: *“She is not dead but sleeping.”* The crowd laughed at Him. They could not see what He saw. But He was not moved by their doubt. Jesus took the girl by the hand and spoke simple words: *“Arise.”* And she got up. Just like that. Death was reversed. Hope was restored. And a family’s mourning turned into joyous celebration. This is what happens when we operate not from fear, but from the **power, love, and sound mind** that 2 Timothy 1:7 promises. Power gives us the authority to speak and act. Love anchors us when we want to quit. And a sound mind keeps us focused when chaos surrounds us. Fear tries to paralyze you. But faith says, *“Get up.”* Jesus is still raising dead things. And He’s still using His people to speak life into hopeless situations.

**Final Encouragement:** You are not a slave to fear.  
You are a child of God—**called, covered, and courageous.**  
do not let all the noise drown out the Spirit as a whisper.  
Do not let fear shut down your faith.  
You were made to rise, to speak, to believe, and to overcome.

**Prayer:** Lord Jesus, I thank you for the faith that You have given me to hear your voice of your good news above all the voices of bad news. Every day that I read, study, and meditate on your Word, my faith increases over my fears. Regardless of the news that I receive, I will not fear but use the **Miracle ears you have given me to hear and believe what you say.**

Thank You for being the voice of truth in a world filled with noise. Today, I come to You grateful that even when bad news surrounds me, **Your Good News still speaks louder.** I admit there are days when the headlines are heavy, the reports are grim, and fear tries to grip my heart. But Your Word reminds me: *“If anyone has ears to hear, let them hear.”* And I choose to tune my ears to You.

God, I acknowledge that fear often disguises itself as **false evidence appearing real**—but it has no place in my life. I refuse to let fear rob me of peace, silence my praise, or paralyze my purpose. Instead, I lean into **faith**—the

kind of faith that rises even when the world is shaking. The kind of faith that is not blind, but clear-eyed and anchored in Your promises.

Every time I open Your Word, I meditate on Your truth, my spirit is strengthened. You are retraining my ears, Lord not just to hear what is loud, but to recognize what is **truth**. You have given me a **miracle ear**—one that filters out the noise of panic, negativity, and lies, and tunes into the frequency of Heaven.

Jesus, I ask You to guard my heart from fear and **help me to take heed to what I hear**, just as You taught. Help me discern what is worth holding onto and what needs to be released. do not let me give weight to words that do not align with Your truth. Let me measure my life by faith, not fear—by promise, not pressure—by Your voice, not the world’s volume.

Today, I make a conscious choice: **I will not fear**. Even when I get unexpected news, even when the future feels uncertain, I will choose to **listen to the voice of the One who holds my future in His hands**. I believe that what I hear from You, I will see come to pass. And the more I hear, the more You promise to give. So increase my hunger for Your Word. Increase my ability to listen with spiritual ears. Let me live by what You say, not just by what I see. I declare that my ears are open, my heart is soft, and my faith is active. I reject fear, I receive peace, and I rest in Your power. In Jesus’ name, **Amen**.

## **Day 28: According To Your Faith**

**FAITH DECLARATIONS:** I declare the unfailing promises of God toward me. God is faithful, and His promises are sure and steadfast. I declare the peace of God, which surpasses human understanding, will guard my heart and mind through Jesus Christ

**Scripture Reference:** “Then touched he their eyes, saying, according to your faith be it unto you.” — **Matthew 9:29 (KJV)**

“For we walk by faith, not by sight.” — **2 Corinthians 5:7 (KJV)**

“And when Jesus departed thence, two blind men followed him, crying, and saying, Thou Son of David, have mercy on us.” — **Matthew 9:27 (KJV)**

## **Devotional Thought: Crying Out in Faith**

**1. Cry Out for What You Need—Faith Is not Silent**—Two blind men, unable to see where they were going, followed Jesus by the sound of His presence. They cried out loudly—not timidly or passively—but with desperation and boldness: “*Thou Son of David, have mercy on us.*” They could not see Jesus with their physical eyes, but their hearts saw something deeper hope.

Their condition did not stop their pursuit. Their weaknesses did not silence their voices. Even when others may have seen their efforts as pointless, they pressed forward. Why? Because real faith does not wait for perfect conditions. It cries out in the middle of the storm, in the middle of the pain, in the middle of not knowing how or when God will respond.

Jesus did not respond to them at first and it was not because He was ignoring them, but because He was drawing out the kind of faith that keeps calling even when it does not get an immediate answer.

**2. Cry Out for Who You Need—Jesus Is the Source**—These men were not crying for a quick fix. They were not chasing after healing alone. They were crying out for **Jesus**— “*Thou Son of David...*” This was not just a cry of



pain; it was a cry of worship, a cry of recognition. They acknowledged Jesus not just as a healer, but as the promised Messiah, the One who could make everything right.

There is a difference between wanting relief and wanting a relationship. Many people cry out for what Jesus can *do* without really pursuing *who He is*. But these men were different. Their hearts were after Him—not just His hand. And that changes everything.

When you pursue Jesus for who He is, you find that **He is more than a healer—He is your hope, your peace, your answer, your source**. And when you make Him the goal, not just the solution, you will find that healing flows naturally from His presence.

### 3. Cry Out with Belief—Faith Opens the Door

When Jesus finally asked them, “*Do you believe that I am able to do this?*” it was not a trick question. It was an invitation to activate their faith. And their response was simple but powerful: “*Yes, Lord.*”

That short phrase held deep trust. They still could not see, but they believed. They did not have evidence, only expectation. And Jesus responded immediately, touching their eyes and saying, “*According to your faith be it unto you.*” And their eyes were opened.

This was not just about healing—it was about trust. They walked by faith before they ever walked by sight. They followed a voice, clung to a promise, and cried out in belief. And it was **their faith**, not their condition, that moved Jesus to act.

**Final Encouragement:** You may not see how the answer will come. You may not know when breakthrough will arrive. But if you cry out with persistence... Cry out for the Person, not just the power... Cry out with faith, even in the dark... **God will answer**. He’s not just listening for need—He’s listening for *faith*. And when your cry is laced with trust, it moves the heart of Heaven.

**Prayer:** Jesus, I thank you for the faith to believe and cry out even when I cannot see it. I cry out beyond the lusts of this world which blinds me through my flesh, my eyes, and my pride. Although I cannot see it, I am confident that you are giving me **Miracle sight** to see according to my faith in you Lord Jesus,

Today, I come before You with a heart humbled by the reality that I often cannot see what lies ahead. Life sometimes feels like a journey through thick fog—uncertain, unclear, and unpredictable. But Your Word reminds me in **2 Corinthians 5:7** that *we walk by faith, not by sight*. And so, I choose today not to be guided by what my physical eyes perceive, but by what my spiritual eyes believe.

I cry out not only for the things I *need*, but for the **God** that I need. I need You, Lord. I need Your wisdom when I feel confused. I need Your peace when I feel overwhelmed. I need Your strength when I am weak. And even when I cannot trace Your hand, I will trust Your heart.

I cry out beyond the distractions of this world that try to blind me—the lust of the flesh, the pride of life, the craving for what is temporary. These things try to steal my focus, but today I lift my eyes to the hills, from whence comes my help. My help comes from the Lord. I cry out in faith, not because I see the outcome, but because I have faith in the One who holds the outcome in His hands. You are the God who hears the cry of the brokenhearted, and You answer not by what we see, but by Your spoken Word. Your promises are truth. Your

timing is perfect. Your ways are higher. Even when nothing around me confirms it, I firmly believe You are working all together for my good.

I thank You, Lord, for **miracle sight**—the ability to see by faith what has not yet manifested. I see healing even when the diagnosis remains unchanged. I see restorations even when relationships are still broken. I see provisions even when my bank account speaks differently. I see peace even when the storms are raging. Why? Because You have opened the eyes of my heart and understanding to see beyond the ordinary into the supernatural realm of faith.

Father, Your Word in **Romans 15:13** declares: *Now the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, that you may abound in hope through the power of the Holy Ghost.* So, I ask You now—fill me with that kind of hope. Not hope that fades with feelings or changes with circumstances, but enduring hope that is rooted in Your unchanging character.

Let joy bubble up where sorrow has tried to settle. Let peace overflow in the midst of my waiting. Let hope rise until it spills out of me and affects others. Holy Spirit, breathe into me again, refresh me, revive me, re-align me. Empower me to walk by faith when it is tempting to retreat in fear. Teach me to live from the inside out and not driven by what I see, but anchored in what I trust and believe.

**I declare today:** I will not be shaken or moved. I will walk forward anchored in faith. I will cry out with confidence, not in desperation. I will believe, even in the darkness, You are the Light that leads me.

Thank You for giving me spiritual clarity, supernatural faith, and enduring hope. In Jesus' powerful name, **Amen.**

#### **Day 29: Call those things that be not as if they were!**

**FAITH DECLARATIONS:** I declare and proclaim God's supernatural favor over my life. What I could not do on my own, God will perform for me. I declare supernatural opportunities; healing restoration and breakthrough are coming my way. I decree and declare that I am getting stronger, healthier, and wiser.

**Scripture: Key Scriptures:** "And when the devil was cast out, the dumb spake: and the multitudes marveled, saying, It was never so seen in Israel." — **Matthew 9:33 (KJV)**  
"...God, who quickeneth the dead, and calleth those things which be not as though they were." — **Romans 4:17 (KJV)**

"Eye hath not seen, nor ear heard... the things which God hath prepared for them that love him." — **1 Corinthians 2:9 (KJV)**

"A thousand shall fall at thy side... but it shall not come nigh thee." **Psalms 91:7 (KJV)**

**Devotional Title: When God Does What is Never Been Done**—When Silence Meets the Savior. The man in **Matthew 9** had never spoken a word. His condition was more than physical—he was both mute and spiritually oppressed. For those around him, his story seemed settled. His silence was final. His limitation was accepted. No one expected anything more.

Until Jesus stepped in, without hype, without delay, Jesus casted out the spirit that had silenced the man, and immediately, *his voice was released*. The people who witnessed it were stunned. Scripture says they *marveled* and exclaimed, "*We have never seen anything like this in Israel!*"

That is what happens when the God of the impossibilities show up. He repairs what is broken, He does what has never been done. When individuals see limitations, God sees potential. When others say, “This cannot happen,” God says, “*Watch Me.*”

**1. God Speaks Life into Silence-This man had lived in silence**—no words, no voice, no way to express what was happening inside. His muteness was not just physical; it was spiritual bondage. But the moment Jesus intervened, what had been silent for a lifetime was suddenly released.

That is the kind of power Jesus carries. He speaks life into places that have been quiet for too long—dreams that died in the dark, callings buried under fear, identities silenced by shame. He heals what is visible, but breaks what is invisible.

In the same way, Jesus spoke into the man’s silence, He wants to speak into yours. Maybe, you have not been able to find your voice in this season. Maybe trauma, fear, or spiritual warfare has tried to mute you. But Jesus restores. And when He speaks, silence does not a chance against an “Almighty and Eternal God”.

**2. God Creates What Has Never Existed Before**-The crowd said it best: “*We have never seen anything like this before.*” That is how God operates. He does not just repeat old miracles—He creates new ones. He’s not just the God of restoration. He is the God of creation.

**Romans 4** reminds us of Abraham, who believed in a God “*who gives life to the dead and calls those things which do not exist as though they did.*” Abraham was nearly a hundred years old. His body and Sarah’s womb were as good as dead—but God was not looking at their limitations. He was focused on the promise.

God is even creating today. He speaks into barrenness and brings forth life. He whispers into nothing and causes something to form. What has never been seen before is not too big for Him. What has never happened in your family, your body, or your history—*God can and is able to do it.*

**3. God Breathes Life into What is Lifeless**-Maybe you have been in a season where everything feels empty. Your joy is dried up, purpose buried, energy gone. You may not even have the strength or courage to hope again. But here is the truth: God’s breath still quickens dead things. One breathe into a dead situation, life returns

**In Ezekiel 37**, God asked the prophet, “*Can these dry bones live?*” And then He commanded the wind to breathe life into what was once dead. That same breath—the breath of God—is what raised Jesus from the grave. And it is the same power available to you today. God can breathe on your broken spirit and restore your peace. He can breathe on a struggling marriage and resurrect love. He can breathe on a hopeless situation and release strategy, breakthrough, and favor.

**Final Encouragement:** You are not waiting for something ordinary. You are positioned for something extraordinary. If God said it even if it has never been seen or done before it can happen! God is never bounded by what has been. **He is the God of all possibilities.**

**So, declare it:**

- My voice is coming back.
- My promise is not dead.
- My life is still under divine construction.

- And my God is doing something in me that will cause others to marvel.

**Prayer:** Today, Lord, I thank You for the miracle of **spiritual sight**—the ability to see what others cannot see, to hope for what has not happened yet, and to believe in what seems beyond reason. While the natural eye is limited by circumstances, my spiritual eye is enlarged by faith. Though a thousand may fall at my side and ten thousand at my right hand, I will not fear, because You, O Lord, are my shield and my covering. I will watch with my own eyes and see the justice of the Lord, the vindication of the righteous, and the reward of those who walk uprightly before You. Lord, I declare today that I am walking in divine protection, supernatural provision, and prophetic fulfillment. I believe that no matter what chaos may surround me, it shall not come near me. I believe that while others may faint from what they see, I will rise by what I believe. Your promises are my anchor and my assurance.

And Father, I thank You that every promise You have made is “*Yes*” in *Christ*, and the “**Amen**” is declared through me for Your glory. So today, I boldly say **Amen** to healing, **Amen** to restoration, **Amen** to provision, **Amen** to peace, **Amen** to purpose, and **Amen** to breakthrough. I call forth those things that have been lying dormant. I speak life into dead situations, dreams, and relationships, knowing You are the God who brings dry bones back to life.

Even when my eyes cannot see it, I trust that You have already worked it out behind the scenes. I thank You in advance for doors I did not know were opening, for miracles I have not yet received, and for favor that is about to find me. Lord, make my life a living testimony of what happens when someone dares to believe that You can do what has never been done before.

I do not walk by what I see but I walk by what You have said. So today, I walk in victory. I walk in purpose. I walk in promise. In Jesus’ mighty and matchless name, Amen.

### **Day 30: Rise Up**

**FAITH DECLARATIONS:** I declare Father in the name of Jesus you are the Lord who knows all things, and everything belongs to you. I thank you for surrounding me with goodness and mercies. I declare this day that I have eyes to see beyond the surface, the mind of obedience to do what you ask of me. By faith, I declare supernatural increase in my life, the nation, and the body of Christ. In Jesus' name. Amen.

**Scripture: John 5:1–9** (AV) 1 After this, there was a feast of the Jews; and Jesus went up to Jerusalem. 2 Now there is at Jerusalem by the sheep market a pool, which is called in the Hebrew tongue Bethesda, having five porches. 3 In these lay a great multitude of impotent folk, of blind, halt, withered, waiting for the moving of the water. 4 For an angel went down at a certain season into the pool and troubled the water: whosoever then first after the troubling of the water stepped in was made whole of whatsoever disease he had. 5 And a certain man was there, which had an infirmity thirty and eight years. 6 When Jesus saw him lie, and knew that he had been now a long time in that case, he saith unto him, wilt thou be made whole? 7 The impotent man answered him, Sir, I have no man, when the water is troubled, to put me into the pool: but while I am coming, another steppeth down before me. 8 Jesus saith unto him, Rise, take up thy bed, and walk. 9 And immediately the man was made whole, and took up his bed, and walked: and on the same day was the sabbath.

**Isaiah 40:31** (AV) 31 But they that wait upon the LORD shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings as eagles; they shall run, and not be weary; and they shall walk, and not faint.

**Deuteronomy 28:2–6 (AV)** 2 And all these blessings shall come on thee, and overtake thee, if thou shalt hearken unto the voice of the **LORD** thy God. 3 Blessed shalt thou be in the city, and blessed shalt thou be in the field. 4 Blessed shall be the fruit of thy body, and the fruit of thy ground, and the fruit of thy cattle, the increase of thy kind, and the flocks of thy sheep. 5 Blessed shall be thy basket and thy store. 6 Blessed shalt thou be when thou comest in, and blessed shalt thou be when thou goest out.

**Scripture Focus:** *“Jesus saith unto him, Rise, take up thy bed, and walk.” — John 5:8 (KJV)*

**Devotional Title: Rise Up**—Because He Said So-Introduction: Stuck for Too Long Imagine lying in the same place for thirty-eight years. Every day, the same mat. The same crowd. The same longing. That was the reality of the man at the pool of Bethesda. He was waiting—waiting for the right moment, the right person, or the right condition. Waiting for healing to come from a stirred-up pool. But year after year, he remained stuck, defined by his condition, limited by his past, and paralyzed by the hopelessness of delay. Then one day, Jesus walked in—not with a plan to help him into the water, but with a word that would bypass the system altogether. Jesus did not ask him how long he had been there to discourage him. He asked to show him that time does not limit God. And with one powerful command— *“Rise, take up your mat, and walk”*—everything shifted.

**1. Rise Up—No Matter How Long It is Been**-Thirty-eight years is a long time to be stuck and long enough to grow weary. Long enough to stop expecting change. But Jesus’ presence declared something radical: it is never too late for God to move. The man had grown accustomed to delays, and delay had practically become his identity. But Jesus did not see him as a case too far gone. He saw him as a man prepared and waiting for his miracle.

Some of us have waited so long that we have made peace with the matter. We have adjusted our dreams to fit our disappointments. Mainly, because something has been delayed does not mean it has been denied. God is not limited by clocks or calendars. One moment with Jesus can redeem years of losses. When Jesus said, *“Rise,”* He was not just speaking to the man’s legs. He was speaking to his spirit, his identity, and his future. It was a divine reset.

**2. Rise Up—Even If No One Is There to Help**-When Jesus asked the man if he wanted to be made well, the man did not say “yes.” Instead, he gave an excuse: *“I have no one to help me into the water.”* His miracle had become dependent on human assistance. He was looking horizontally when the answer had just walked in vertically.

Many individuals do the same thing by giving excuses. We wait for someone to sponsor us, open a door, or validate our worth. But the truth is when people walk out, Jesus steps in. He does not need a team to lift you, a platform to promote you, or a committee to agree with Him. When Jesus speaks, He brings everything you need with Him.

God does not need your situations to be flawless. He does not need the approval of others to move in your life. He just needs your ears and faith to listen, and your heart to trust Him.

**3. Rise Up—Because God’s Word Has Power**-Jesus did not pray a long prayer. Jesus did not perform a dramatic healing. He simply stated, *“Rise, take up your mat, and walk.”* That was it. Just a word. But it was enough—because when God speaks, things must and will change.

His Word carries resurrection power. It breaks cycles, lifts burdens, and releases miracles. And when God says “rise,” the only appropriate response is obedience. The man did not argue. He did not ask how. He did not say

“thank you” at first. He simply obeyed. He got up. He carried what once carried him. And he walked away from a place he thought he’d never leave.

**God’s Word does not return empty.** It accomplishes what He sends it to do. So, if He’s speaking to your heart today and saying, “get up,” “believe again,” “try again,” “move forward”—do not delay and do not negotiate. JUST obey and move.

**Final Encouragement:** Do not settle on your mat, do not live in delays when destiny is calling. Do not believe the lies or deceptions that your time has passed. **Jesus is still speaking.** And His voice carries the power to restore what life has attempted to take.

**So today, rise:** Regardless of how long it seems—He’s not finished.

- Regardless of who did not help you—He is still present.
- Because He said it—and His Word never fails. That is final.

You are not imprisoned. You are not too late. You are one word away from a new walk and freedom.

**Prayer:** Almighty God, you have already declared that regardless of my circumstances, I am blessed. Thank you for the **Miracle that causes me to rise above** what this world has said about me and into the blessings you have decreed and declared for me. Regardless of how long, how hard, or how bad it has been, today I rise! Lord Jesus, I come before You today with a heart wide open and faith stretched toward Heaven. Like the two blind men in Matthew 9, I cry out—not because I see clearly, but because I believe deeply. I may not have physical blindness, but I recognize that there are areas in my life where my spiritual vision has been limited—blurred by doubt, clouded by discouragement, and dimmed by disappointment.

Even in the darkness, I choose to follow You. Even when I do not understand, I will pursue You because I believe You are the One who opens eyes, restores hope, and makes all things new. I cry out to You, not only for what I need, but for who I need. I need You, Jesus. Not just Your hand to bless me, but Your presence to lead me.

You asked the blind men, “Do you believe that I am able to do this?” And today, You are asking me the same question. And my answer is, “Yes, Lord. I believe.” I believe You are able to heal what is broken. I believe You are able to restore what was lost. I believe You are able to do the impossible in my life. I believe and trust, not based on what I see, but on who You are.

Your Word reminds me that we walk by **faith**, not by **sight**. So, I will not wait for the evidence to praise You. I will not wait for clarity to trust You. I will not wait for the outcome to worship You. I choose to believe now! Faith does not require proof, it requires trust and belief.

So today, Lord, touch the eyes of my heart. Let me see beyond my situation and into Your promise. Let me see through the lens of Your love, not the filter of my fear. Give me **miracle vision**. Vision that does not come from my flesh but from the Spirit of a Living God. Open my spiritual eyes to see what You are doing behind the scenes. Even when the door is closed, even when the answer is delayed, help me to keep crying out in faith, believing that You hear and Your response will be in perfect timing.

Lord, forgive me for the moments I have allowed the world’s distractions to blind me from Your presence. Cleanse my vision from the lust of the flesh, the pride of life, and the deception of what seems real but is spiritually empty.

Let my cry not be in desperation, but in bold confidence that You are near. You are listening and You are moving on my behalf.

Jesus, I surrender my doubts, my timelines, and my need to see before I believe. Strengthen my faith today. Like the blind men, I say, “**Yea, Lord.**” I believe. Touch my life again and let it be **according to my faith in You.** In Jesus’ name I pray, **Amen.**

### **Day 31: Stretch Forth**

**FAITH DECLARATIONS:** I boldly declare that I shall walk in signs and wonders. The grace to succeed in every area of my life has been granted to me. I declare every power of limitation over my life is broken in Jesus' name. I declare doors for economic and spiritual growth are opened in my life in Jesus' name. Amen.

**Mark 16:16-18:** (NKJ) 16 He who believes and is baptized will be saved; but he who does not believe will be condemned. 17 And these signs will follow those who believe: In My name they will cast out demons; they will speak with new tongues; 18 they will take up serpents; and if they drink anything deadly, it will by no means hurt them; they will lay hands on the sick, and they will recover.

**Scripture: Matthew 12:10–13** (AV) 10 And, behold, there was a man which had his hand withered. And they asked him, saying, is it lawful to heal on the sabbath days? that they might accuse him. 11 And he said unto them, what man shall there be among you, that shall have one sheep, and if it falls into a pit on the sabbath day, will he not lay hold on it, and lift it out? 12 How much then is a man better than a sheep? Wherefore it is lawful to do well on the sabbath days. 13 Then saith he to the man, Stretch forth thine hand. And he stretched it forth; and it was restored whole, like as the other.

**Philippians 3:13 - 14** (AV) 13 Brethren, I count not myself to have apprehended: but this one thing I do, forgetting those things which are behind, and reaching forth unto those things which are before, 14 I press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus.

### **Devotional Title: “Stretch Forth – The Call to Move Beyond Limitations”**

**Scripture Focus: Luke 6:10** – *“And looking round about upon them all, he said unto the man, Stretch forth thy hand. And he did so: and his hand was restored whole as the other.”*

**Devotional: Picture this moment:** a man with a withered, lifeless hand stands in the synagogue. His deformity is no secret. The stares, whispers, and judgmental glances have become his normal. It is the Sabbath—a day bound by strict religious rules—and the room is filled with critics waiting to trap Jesus in a misstep. Yet in the tension of that moment, Jesus does not avoid controversy, and He steps right into it. He looks at the man and says something bold, almost unreasonable: “**Stretch forth your hand.**” This was not simply physical instruction; it was a spiritual confrontation.

**Do not Let Your Accusers Stop You.** The man could have hesitated. The religious leaders were watching. The atmosphere was not exactly warm or welcoming. Maybe he had heard the whispers: “Why is *he* here?” “He must have sinned to end up like that.” But Jesus was not concerned with the opinions of the crowd, and neither should you be. People may try to force you in with their opinions, assumptions, and accusations. But God’s voice over your life outweighs any human verdict. Stretch forth anyway. Obedience is not about popularity, but it is about obedience and trust.

**Do Not Let Traditions Stop You.** Jesus chose to heal on the Sabbath, not by accident, but on purpose. Why? Because the Kingdom of God always confronts lifeless religion. Traditions have their place, but when they hinder healing, God overrides them. Many of us have been trained by routines, cultures, or even religious doctrine or experiences to keep things “as they are.” But God calls us out of comfort zones of traditions into the realm of supernatural transformation. Stretching means moving beyond what you have always known and believe by faith there is more. Take a bold step of faith and stretch forth.

**Do Not Let Conditions Stop You.** Let’s be realistic, stretching a withered hand is not just hard, it appears impossible. The man could have said, “Jesus, you are asking for something that I cannot physically do.” But in the asking came power. The moment he tried it, God moved. And the same is true for us. Maybe your finances are “withered.” Your hope feels all dried up. Your relationships are strained. But God is not asking you to fix it, He’s requiring you to act and move in faith. Miracles often begin with small, trembling steps of obedience. Stretch anyway.

**The Restoration Comes in the Stretch.** The moment he obeyed and stretched, something shifted. Bones aligned. Nerves reconnected. Strength returned. The hand that once hung lifeless became whole and was healed. Jesus did not touch him physically He touched him through His word. And His word still heals today.

Sometimes healing is not found in waiting—but in *stretching*.

Stretching beyond fear.

Stretching beyond shame.

Stretching beyond limitations.

God is calling you out of paralysis and into faith-filled purpose. Out of withering and into wholeness. **The question is: Will you stretch forth in obedience?**

**Prayer:** Father, I declare that I will stretch beyond fear and failure. I will stretch beyond the opinions of others, beyond the limits of my own thinking, and beyond every excuse that tries to hold me back. I thank You for the miracle of faith that allows me to see past my present struggles into the victory You have already ordained. Just as Jesus spoke to the man with the withered hand, commanding him to stretch it forth and be healed, I hear Your voice telling me to stretch into my new season. I will not shrink back; I will stretch my faith and believe in the impossible.

Lord, I ask that You give me courage to stretch forth into unfamiliar places, where tradition says “**stay**,” but Your Spirit says “**move**.” Help me to walk with confidence even when conditions seem unfavorable. You are the God who turns impossibilities into testimonies. You are the God who fulfills every purpose You have spoken over my life. So, I stretch forth in faith, believing that every step I take brings me closer to the destiny You have designed for me. I stretch forth into victory. I stretch forth into joy. I stretch forth into divine purpose. Thank You for giving me the strength to keep pressing, reaching, and believing. In Jesus’ mighty name, **Amen**.

## **Day 32: Manifestation**

**FAITH DECLARATIONS:** I declare and proclaim that the Spirit of the Lord is upon me. Lord, I receive this morning a fresh release of your grace and power by Your Spirit. My life will never be the same again, I will continue growing from strength to strength and from glory to glory in Jesus' name. Amen.



**Scripture: John 9:1–7** (AV) 1 And as Jesus passed by, he saw a man which was blind from his birth. 2 And his disciples asked him, saying, Master, who did sin, this man, or his parents, that he was born blind? 3 Jesus answered, neither hath this man sinned, nor his parents: but that the works of God should be made manifest in him. 4 I must work the works of him that sent me, while it is day: the night cometh, when no man can work. 5 As long as I am in the world, I am the light of the world. 6 When he had thus spoken, he spat on the ground, and made clay of the spittle, and he anointed the eyes of the blind man with the clay, 7 And said unto him, Go, wash in the pool of Siloam, (which by interpretation, Sent.) He went his way therefore, and washed, and came seeing.

**Romans 8:28** (AV) 28 And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to his purpose.

**Romans 8:18** (AV) 18 For I reckon that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy of being compared with the glory which shall be revealed in us.

**Devotional Title: “The Gift Hidden in the Pain”**  
**Scripture Focus:** “Rejoice always. Pray continually. Give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God’s will for you in Christ Jesus.” — **1 Thessalonians 5:16–18 (BSB)**

**Devotional Thought:** Pain—nobody asks for it, but everybody will face it. It finds us in hospital rooms, silent nights, broken relationships, and unanswered questions. Pain comes when plans fall apart, when people leave, when prayers feel unheard. But here is the truth: **pain, in the hands of God, is never pointless. It becomes a tool for transformation, a catalyst for character, and a connection to breakthroughs.**

There is work in my pain, and often it does the kind of work prosperity never could. It digs deep and uncovers what is beneath the surface. In our pain, pride is stripped, control is surrendered, and faith becomes real. It is during these painful places that God refines us like gold in fire. When everything is shaking, we finally discover what we stand on. Pain becomes the place where strength is built and foundations are established, regardless of the struggle, but largely *because* of it. God is not wasting the ache, but He is cultivating something eternally endless in the soil of your suffering.

There is purpose in my pain and nothing you are going through has surprised Heaven. God does not cause all pain, but He never allows it to be wasted. Every tear, every disappointment, every long sleepless night is part of a story far greater than what you can see. The brokenness is producing something beautiful that you have not been revealed yet. Joseph had to be betrayed to reach the palace. Jesus had to endure the cross to bring resurrection. As a result, your pain is not punishment but preparation! A moment of revelation is that what hurts today is only shaping who you will become tomorrow? Give God a shout in the pain knowing greater glory is on the way!

**There is glory from my pain.** When you have walked through the fire and come out not smelling like smoke, that is “**glory**”. When the thing that almost crushed you becomes the reason somebody finds hope, that is glory. The wounds you carry become holy when they point to the God who heals. And one day, you will reflect on the past, and dispel bitterness, as you stand in awe at what God brought you out of what the enemy meant for harm. **Romans 8:18** reminds us, *“the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory which shall be revealed in us.”* Your story will become a testimony of God’s glory.

So, today, do not despise the pain and do not dismiss it or bury it instead, invite God in. Discover His nearness in the tears, His strength in the weakness, His wisdom in the waiting. He's not just going to bring you through this But He's going to bring something *out* of this in situation.

**Prayer:** Lord Jesus, I come to You today with honesty and open hands. The pain that I am carrying is real. Some of it, I was aware, was coming, and some blindsided me. But in the middle of it all, I make a choice by faith to know that You are working it out for my good. You are the God who turns ashes into beauty, mourning into joy, and tears into testimonies.

Thank You for reminding me that even when life hurts, God has never abandoned me. You are not only with me in the valley, but you are shaping me in it. I thank You that my pain is not wasted. There is work being completed that I cannot see the results, but I know you are with me and for me in it. **You are refining my heart, stretching my faith, and anchoring my hope more deeply in You.**

I declare by faith that there is purpose in this pain. You are writing a story greater than what I feel in this moment. **Help me to trust the Author, even when I do not understand the chapter. Give me courage to wait patiently, strength to endure faithfully, and eyes to see what You are developing and establishing in me.**

And Lord, I praise You because I know there is *glory* coming from this. I do not want to only survive this season, but I desire to emerge out of it stronger, wiser, and more like You. Let the scars become signs of Your healings. Let my testimony bring light to someone else darkness and use what broke me, to build newness in within me. Create inside of me a clean heart and a right spirit!

So today, even in pain, I will always rejoice in Your salvation. I will endure through the tears always to give thanks to a merciful God. Even with unanswered questions, I will remain steadfast in trusting You. Because You are faithful. You are good. And You are not finished with me! In Jesus' mighty and merciful name, Amen.

### **Day 33: Loosed**

**FAITH DECLARATIONS:** I declare that through Jesus Christ I am loosed, free, and positioned for the **unusual work of God** in my life. I walk boldly in the freedom Christ has secured for me, and I step fully into the purpose God has intentionally ordained for my destiny. I declare that every chain is broken, every stronghold is dismantled, and every assignment of darkness is canceled. I now take possession of what belongs to me as a child of God— unusual favor, supernatural breakthrough, divine access, and kingdom authority.

**Scripture: Luke 13:10–12** (AV) 10 And he was teaching in one of the synagogues on the sabbath. 11 And, behold, there was a woman who had a spirit of infirmity eighteen years, and was bowed together, and could in no wise lift herself. 12 And when Jesus saw her, he called her to him, and said unto her, Woman, thou art loosed from thine infirmity.

**John 15:16** (AV) 16 Ye have not chosen me, but I have chosen you, and ordained you, that ye should go and bring forth fruit, and that your fruit should remain that whatsoever ye shall ask of the Father in my name, he may give it you.

**Matthew 16:18–19** (AV) 18 And I say also unto thee, that thou art Peter, and upon this rock, I will build my church; and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it. 19 And I will give unto thee the keys of the kingdom of heaven: and whatsoever thou shalt bind on earth shall be bound in heaven: and whatsoever thou shalt loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven.

**Devotional Title: “God Saw, Chose, and Delivered Me”**

**Scripture Focus:** *“You did not choose Me, but I chose you and appointed you so that you might go and bear fruit—fruit that will last.” — John 15:16 (NIV)*

*“He lifted me out of the slimy pit, out of the mud and mire; He set my feet on a rock and gave me a firm place to stand.” — Psalm 40:2 (NIV)*

**Devotional Thought:** Before you were ever seen by others, before anyone celebrated your gifts, acknowledged your pain, or understood your struggle, God saw you.

He saw you when you were overlooked by people. He saw you crying behind closed doors, wrestling silently with fears that no one else knew. He saw every layer of your life not only the polished parts you presented in public, but the hidden pain and the potential buried underneath. When others saw mistakes or messes, God saw His promise.

You were never invisible to Him. From your first breath, He knew your name and numbered every hair on your head. His eyes never deserted you, even when you strayed, even when you doubted, even when you broke down. He saw you not as you were, but as what He created you to become. But He did not stop at seeing you, but that God chose you.

Out of the billions on this earth, He pointed at *you*. Not because you were perfect, but because He loved you with a perfect love. When life disqualified you, His grace qualified you. When shame whispered you were not enough, He declared you more than enough because you were His.

Maybe, you have been through seasons feeling passed over, unwanted, or unworthy. But God chose you not based on popularity, performance, or pedigree but, it based on purpose. He saw His greatness inside of you when you could barely see hope for tomorrow. He chose you when you felt unlovable. Remember, His choosing is permanently sealed by His blood, anchored in His heart and established for eternity.

Therefore, when you were at your lowest, entangled by sin, crushed by anxiety, paralyzed by fear, God delivered you.

He did not send anyone else to rescue you, He reached out Himself. Whether it was addiction, depression, rejection, insecurity, or shame. God reached down into the pit you could not climb out of and broke the chains, lifted you up, and set your feet on solid ground. You are not who you used to be because His love stepped in and made all things new.

He did not simply pull you *out*, He’s bringing you into greater and giving you a new identity. Placing you into a deeper relationship. A life filled with purpose and freedom. Your past may have left a negative mark, but it does not or will never have the final say! Your deliverance is not about what you came out of but, what you now walk in God’s greater glory.

**So today, walk in this truth:**

- **You are not forgotten.** You were never hidden from God's eyes.
- **You are chosen.** You have been handpicked by Heaven for such a time as this.
- **You are free.** The chains are gone. The door is open. Your future is bright.

**Prayer:** Jesus, when I was a lost wretch, not fit to live and certainly not ready to die, you performed a **Miracle in my life and loosed me** from my infirmities. When life discarded me, you saw me, chose me, and delivered me. Lord, I thank you that the keys to the kingdom that you have given to me that now I have the power to access, bind, and loose things on earth, and you will also grant to me in heaven. Lord Jesus, I come before You today in awe of Your mercy, humbled by the truth that You saw me when no one else did. You looked beyond my faults, my failures, and my frailty, yet You still saw value in me. When I was at my lowest, feeling hidden to the world and to myself, God, you called me by my name. You did not just glance my way, You Lord, looked with great compassion, with purpose, and with divine intention.

**You chose me** not because I was strong, perfect, or deserving, but because You are rich in love, mercy and overflowing with grace. While others may have passed me by, **You** stopped! While life may have labeled me broken, rejected, or too far gone to turn around, Lord, you re-wrote my story and stamped it with Your seal of redemption. I was bound by sin, shame, insecurity, and pain and You delivered me. You reached into that pit and lifted me out. You took my filthy rags and clothed me with righteousness. You gave me joy and freedom, delivering me out of pain and bondage.

**Thank You, Lord,** that You delivered me and did not leave me empty-handed but gave me *authority*. You handed me the keys to Your Kingdom. According to Your Word in **Matthew 16:19**, what I bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and what I lose on earth will be loosed in heaven. That means, I no longer live beneath my circumstances, I speak to them with “Kingdom” authority. I bind the spirit of fear and ignite my faith. I bind the spirit of confusion and release clarity. I bind depression and loose the joy of the Lord over my life.

Because You saw me, chose me, and delivered me, I no longer walk in shame, silence, or second-guessing. I walk in the authority of Your Word. I speak boldly, pray confidently, and live intentionally, knowing that Heaven is backing me up. You have not only called me out, but You have called me into a greater purpose.

So today, I thank You not only for what You brought me out of, but for what You are bringing before me. I walk forward with the keys to the kingdom in my hand, faith in my heart, and the name of Jesus on my lips. You are my Deliverer, Defender, and Destiny Maker. In Jesus’ name I pray, Amen.

### **Day 34: BORN TO OVERCOME**

**FAITH DECLARATIONS:** I declare and affirm that I am qualified by Jesus Christ for the best. I will walk in divine favor for supernatural increase. The doors that were once closed are now opened to me in unexpected places. Where I was deemed unqualified, I am confirmed by God as qualified. I take advantage of all opportunities that God brings my way as I walk in the path of my destiny, fulfilling God’s best plans for me in Jesus’ name. Amen.

**Devotional Title: “Born to Overcome”**

**Scripture Reading:** “For whatever is born of God overcomes the world. And this is the victory that has overcome the world—our faith. Who is he who overcomes the world, but he who believes that Jesus is the Son of God?” — **1 John 5:4–5 (NKJV)**

**Devotional Thought:** Life in this world can be overwhelming. There are forces seen and unseen, that press on every side: fear, sin, temptation, doubt, anxiety, injustice, failure, and spiritual warfare. But the great news is this: if you are born of God, you are not powerless. You are an overcomer.

You do not overcome because of your strength. You do not overcome it because of your education, resources, social status or pedigree. You overcame because of who your Father is, and what He has planted inside of you. The seed of God in you is infused with victory. When John wrote that “*whatever is born of God overcomes the world,*” he was not offering wishful thinking. He was declaring a spiritual law—everything that truly comes from God carries His overcoming DNA.

Let’s break this truth down:

**1. It Is Inspired by God.** To be inspired means “**God-breathed.**” It is when the wind of Heaven fills your lungs, your life, your dreams, your calling. When God inspires, it carries His essence, His authority, and His breath. It cannot be defeated because it flows from His nature. As believers, we are filled with the Holy Spirit. That means you live with God’s divine breath inside of you. When God places an idea, vision, or calling inside of you, it is more than human ambition it is God-saturated and heaven-backed. No force of darkness, no lie from the enemy, and no system of this world can extinguish what God has breathed into existence. So, do not abandon what God has called and inspired only because it is challenging. Stand in faith. If God breathed it, it will certainly thrive!

**2. It Is Initiated by God-** **initiate** means to start or originate. When something is born of God, it did not start in your imagination—it began in His heart. Meaning God is not only the author, but He is also the architect and builder. He started the work in you, and He finishes what He starts (**Philippians 1:6**). Whatever God initiates—He back and funds it, He fuels it and He fights for it. Occasionally, we will grow weary or discouraged when what God starts does not immediately look like success. Be encouraged: the same God who spoke the universe into existence has spoken victory over your situation. What He starts is destined to overcome, even when it faces resistance It shall come to pass.

**3. It Is Inhabited by God-** This is where many people miss it. They receive inspiration and witness initiation. And yet, they stop making room for God’s continuous presence. God does not need to just start something in you; He wants to live and becoming a vital part of it. God desires to dwell in your decisions, guide your journey, and shape your character every step of the way. Victory is not a one-time event, but it is a daily walk of faith. As a result, dwelling in the presence of God, learning from His wisdom, obeying His word, and fully depending on His Spirit. When your life is inhabited by God, you carry authority. You live differently. You endure storms without drowning, because God is in your boat. Faith Is the key, everything that is born of God is destined to overcome—but only through faith. Faith is the currency of the Kingdom. It is the lens through which we can see the unseen, the bridge between what God says and what we perceive.

If you believe in Jesus Christ and trust Him as Savior, Lord, and Victor—you step into a realm where *the impossible becomes possible*. Faith does not deny reality rather it declares that God’s reality is greater. It is not enough to know God inspired something. It is not enough to believe He initiated it or even that He inhabits it. Your faith must be activated by belief. Speak His word boldly. Stand on His promises confidently. Move forward even when you cannot see the full picture.

**Closing Challenge:** Whatever you are facing today, remind yourself: I was born of God. I am not here by accident. I am inspired by Heaven, initiated by the Spirit, inhabited by the Almighty, and walking by faith. Therefore, I am an overcomer.

**Prayer:** Heavenly Father, I know this victory does not come from human strength or effort. The key to overcoming is *faith*. Not a feeling, not a back-up plan—but a confident trust in who You are and what You have

spoken. Let my faith be rooted in Your Word. Let it structure how I speak, how I pray, how I walk, and how I respond to every challenge. When doubt whispers, help me declare Your truth boldly, and if fear knocks, faith will always answer the door.

I decree and declare today: **I am an overcomer.** I am not defeated. I am not defined by my past, my pain, or my problems. I am defined by my new birth in Christ Jesus. The same power that raised Jesus from the dead lives in me—and because of that, I walk in victory. I overcome discouragement with praise. I overcome worry with trust. I overcome temptation with obedience. I overcome every worldly system because I am born of God. Lord, let this truth settle deep into my spirit: if You inspired it, initiated it, and inhabit it—then I will not fail. I walk by faith, and not by sight. I press forward not in my strength, but with Heaven supporting me up. Thank You for giving me the keys to overcome. Thank You for making me more than a conqueror through Christ, who loves me. I give You all the glory. In Jesus' victorious name I pray, **Amen.**

### **Day 35: Thanksgiving**

**FAITH DECLARATIONS:** I declare that God's promised provision for my life, family, and ministry will manifest. My steps are ordered by the Lord into Godliness, and I surrender my heart totally and completely to the Lord because of God's mercies and amazing kindness toward me. I will enjoy the supernatural provisions of the Lord in Jesus' name. Amen.

**Scripture: Luke 17:11–19 (AV)** 11 And it came to pass, as he went to Jerusalem, that he passed through the midst of Samaria and Galilee. 12 And as he entered into a certain village, there met him ten men that were lepers, which stood afar off: 13 And they lifted up their voices, and said, Jesus, Master, have mercy on us. 14 And when he saw them, he said unto them, Go shew yourselves unto the priests. And it came to pass that, as they went, they were cleansed. 15 And one of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, and with a loud voice glorified God, 16 And fell on his face at his feet, giving him thanks: and he was a Samaritan. 17 And Jesus, answering, said, were there not ten cleansed? but where are the nine? 18 There are not found that returned to give glory to God, save this stranger. 19 And he said unto him, Arise, go thy way: thy faith hath made thee whole.

**Scripture Focus:** “I will bless the LORD at all times: His praise shall continually be in my mouth.” — **Psalms 34:1 (KJV)**

“And He spake a parable unto them to this end, that men ought always to pray, and not to faint.” — **Luke 18:1 (KJV)**

“Give thanks to the LORD, for He is good; His loving devotion endures forever.” — **Psalms 118:1 (BSB)**

**Devotional Title: “Anchored in Every Season”**

**Devotional Thought:** Life does not stand still. Seasons shift and circumstances evolve. Emotions rise and fall like the tide. One moment you are on a mountaintop, the next you are walking through a valley. But in a world of constant change, your posture must remain unshakable and solidified in a sovereign God.

The key to a victorious, joy-filled, and spiritually resilient life is not having a perfect environment, it is having a steadfast heart that knows how to respond to every situation with the same three rhythms: **always praise, always pray, and always give thanks.**

**1. Always Praise – Worship in Every Season** “*I will bless the LORD at all times...*” (**Psalms 34:1**) David wrote this powerful declaration while fleeing for his life—not sitting on a throne but hiding in a cave. He was not surrounded by comfort; he was surrounded by danger. And yet, he made a decision: “*I will bless the Lord at all*

times.” Praise is not just for the peaceful moments. It is for the painful ones, too. When we choose to praise God in hardship, we are making a bold statement— “*God, You are bigger than what I feel. You are greater than what I see.*” Praise magnifies the Lord and minimizes the power of the problem. It shifts your focus from what is wrong to who is still right.

Praise does not ignore the pain. It overrules it. **Let praise be your anthem song—not just in celebration, but in every crisis.** In praise, we invite God’s presence, disrupt the enemy’s plans, and strengthen our spirit. Praise becomes the weapon that paralyzes the enemy.

**2. Always Pray – Stay Connected** “*Men ought always to pray, and not to faint.*” (Luke 18:1) Jesus told a parable with one clear message: **Never stop praying.** Not because God needs constant reminders—but we do. Prayer is not an emergency button; it is a daily connection. When we pray, we plug into Heaven’s power source. We receive peace that makes no sense. We gain wisdom the world cannot provide. We have strength to keep going when everything within us wants to stop and give up.

**Prayer is a two-way conversation.** It is where we talk and listen, cry and receive comfort, ask and align with God’s will. It keeps us grounded when life tries to pull us off course. And the truth: *The more you pray, the less you feel faint.* Prayer is not the last thing you do when things fall apart—it is the first thing you do to hold things together.

**3. Always Give Thanksgiving – Stay Grateful** “*Give thanks to the LORD, for He is good...*” (Psalm 118:1) Gratitude is not a reaction—it is a mindset. Thanksgiving should never be seasonal or conditional. It should be the default attitude of our hearts. Thankfulness has a way of softening your spirit and lifting your perspective. It is difficult to complain when you are counting the blessings. It becomes challenging to sink into despair when you begin remembering all that God has done.

**Even in waiting seasons—even in the middle of battles—there is always something to thank God for.** He woke you up this morning, He brought you through things you did not imagine you would survive. His love has not failed you.

When you cultivate a thankful heart, you begin to notice the fingerprints of God even in ordinary days. Gratitude is not denial of trouble; it is recognition of grace. When you live with this posture, you will survive storms, God anchored you through them.

**Prayer:** Almighty God, I thank you for being the **God of Miracles.** You have, you are and will always be there for me Your Word promised never to leave nor forsake me. **I trust You!** When I praise you, you are always there. Lord, when I am in trouble you are always there. And when I need a miracle, you are there.

Gracious and Faithful Father; I come before You today with a heart filled with gratitude. Before I ask for anything, I want to say thank You. Thank You for Your goodness and mercy that will never run out, and for Your love that never gives up. You are consistent when everything around me is chaotic. You are faithful even when I falter. You are present—even when I feel alone. Lord, this is the reason, I choose to praise You. Always.

**Lord, You are good all the time.** You are not an occasionally God showing up only when things are right, but always. Your goodness is the unshakable foundation that my life stands on. Even when life becomes difficult and

unpredictable, Your goodness, mercy and, loving devotion remain the same. I praise You today not because everything is perfect, but because You are perfect and with me.

God, teach me to be a person who does not just praise when the sun is shining, but who praises You in the storms. Let my worship not be dependent on my circumstances but rooted and grounded in who You are. When the doors open, I will praise and even if they remain closed, I will continue to praise. When the answers come quickly, I will rejoice. When they delay, I will trust. Because Your love endures forever—and that is more than enough for me to continue lifting my voice to You.

Father, I do not want prayer to be my last resort but, my first response. Help me to walk and talk with You daily. To pray when I feel strong, and to pray when I feel weak. To pray with tears in my eyes and hope in my heart. To pray when I do not have the words, but I know You understand the cry of my soul. You are the God who bends low to listen and sit high to resolve. I am never praying faithless but heartfelt. I am praying into Your heart.

And Lord, let thanksgiving be the rhythm of my life. Not just a seasonal act but a daily habit. Forgive me for the times I rushed through life without stopping to say thank You. Today, I thank You for breath in my lungs, purpose in my days, and joy that is stronger than sorrow. I thank You for every miracle You have performed in my past, every grace You are providing in my present, and every breakthrough that is waiting for me in my future.

I stand firm on the promise of **Jude 1:24**—that You are able to keep me from falling and hold me firm, when I feel like stumbling. You are able to carry me through what would have crushed me. You are able to present me faultless, not because of my perfection, but because of the power of Jesus that covers me. You bring me before Your presence not with shame, but with joy and that truth overwhelms me.

So today, I lift up a song of thanksgiving and a declaration of praise: **You have been good. You are good. You will always be good.** To You, O Lord, be all the glory, all the honor, all the power, and all the praise. Yesterday, today, and forevermore. In the name of Jesus Christ, my Savior and Sustainer, **Amen.**

### **Day 36: The Woman with the Alabaster Box – Lavish Love**

**Scripture Reading: Luke 7:37–38** (NIV) "A woman in that town who lived a sinful life learned that Jesus was eating at the Pharisee's house, so she came there with an alabaster jar of perfume. As she stood behind Him at His feet weeping, she began to wet His feet with her tears. Then she wiped them with her hair, kissed them and poured perfume on them."

**Devotional Thought:** In a room filled with religious leaders, judgmental glances, and cold formalities, an unnamed woman interrupted the scene with uncontrollable emotion and extravagant generosity. She was not invited, but she came in boldness. She was not welcomed, but she worshiped. And she did not come empty-handed. Only with a heart of humility, thanksgiving and gratitude.

With trembling hands, she broke open her alabaster jar an expensive possession, perhaps the most valuable thing she owned and poured it out on the feet of Jesus. What she poured out that day was not simply perfume but it was her past, her pain, her gratitude, her worship.

**1. Generosity is an Act of Worship.** This woman's act was not random. It was deliberate. She did not only show up with kind words, but she came with costly oil. **She used her treasure to honor the One who had transformed her life. She was intentional in her act of worshipping, and it was not only lifting hands or singing songs. Worship is deeper, it is willingness to break open and pour out for God's glory.** Her gift was fragrant, but it



was much more than that, it was personal from her heart. Something that cost her, true generosity will always involve surrender, and in this intentional action, her surrender became a sacred act of worship.

**2. Generosity Flows from Gratitude-** This woman was known for her sin, but Jesus had become her safe place. He perceived her differently. And out of that encounter, her heart overflowed with gratitude. **She did not give to be seen; she gave because she had been changed. Generosity that flows from a grateful heart will always carry weight in heaven.** The more we reflect on how far God has brought us, the more our hearts are moved to give not reluctantly, but joyfully and freely. Above all in our “agape” love and obedience.

**3. What Others Call Waste, God Calls Worship-** As she poured out her perfume, the room grew tense. The Pharisees muttered under their breath. The host questioned Jesus’ discernment. Even some disciples viewed her gift as wasteful, But Jesus silenced the critics. He saw what they could not, a heart fully devoted. At times, your worship will make others uncomfortable. But God does not call it waste; He calls it beautiful. When your gift is aimed at heaven, human criticism becomes irrelevant.

**Prayer:** Jesus, You are worthy of everything I have, my time, my talent, my treasure, my tears. Today, I bring You my alabaster box. The places in my life I have held onto, the treasures I have been reluctant to surrender. I lay it all at Your feet, my tears and heart, not because You demand it, but because You deserve it. You have forgiven me and loved me through all my messiness, shortcomings and sins. You have spoken life into dead places and restored what I thought was lost forever.

Like the woman with the alabaster box, I do not care who is watching, I do not need the approval of people when I have the presence of the Savior. I want my generosity to reflect the depth of my gratitude. I want my worship to carry the weight of surrender. If others call it extreme, permit them. As long as God calls and see it worship, I give glory in it all.

Break the pride in me that hesitates. Break the fear in me that calculates. Let me give in ways that challenges my comfort and stir up the heavens. Let me love lavishly. Let me live boldly and give fearlessly. I desire that my life smell like the fragrance of worship that will linger long after I have left the room.

Lord, use my gift even if it appears small let it bring glory to Your name. Multiply my offerings for Your kingdom. Let it speak louder than my words ever can and reflects the transformation You have completed in my soul.

Today, I break open my jar. I pour it out. And I worship You, not with surplus, but with my best. In Jesus’ name I pray, Amen.

### **Day 37: The Widow’s Mite – Giving Beyond the Amount**

**Scripture Reading: Mark 12:43–44 (NIV)** “**Calling His disciples to him, Jesus** said, ‘Truly I tell you; this poor widow has put more into the treasury than all the others. They all gave out of their wealth; but she, out of her poverty, put in everything—all she had to live on.’”

**Devotional Thought:** In a society that often celebrates large numbers, public recognition, and grand gestures, Jesus shifts the spotlight onto an anonymous widow who dropped two tiny coins into the temple treasury. Coins that were small and barely made a sound as they hit the offering box and yet, her quiet sacrifice echoed loudly in the courts of heaven. It was given to God with her heart.

Jesus watched the rich pour in their abundance; but He was not impressed by the size of their gifts. He was moved by the depth of her surrender. Her gift did not change the temple budget, but it revealed something eternal, a heart totally surrendered to God.

**1. God Measures Generosity Differently**-God is not watching the amount in your hand, **He's looking at the condition of your heart. While others gave large amounts out of their surpluses, the widow gave out of her lack. Jesus noted that she gave more because what she gave cost her everything.** God is not keeping ledgers to see who gave the most money. He measures those that trust Him the most. In Heaven's economy, the weight of your gifts is measured by what you have freely given with love and obedience, not by how impressive it looks on paper.

**2. Sacrificial Giving Reveals Deep Faith**-This widow did not just give what was convenient; she gave what was critical to her survival. She did not hold back her "just-in-case" coins. In doing so, she made a profound statement: ***I trust God more than I trust what is in my hands.*** Her act of faith was not about religious duty; it was about radical dependence. True generosity will always challenge your comfort and call you to lean on God like never before.

**3. Generosity Does not Require Riches**-**You do not have to be wealthy to be generous. You simply need to be willing.** The widow's offering reminds us that generosity has nothing to do with dollar signs and everything to do with devotion. Your kindness, your time, your encouragement, your lunch money it all matters when it comes from a heart of faith. Never underestimate what God can do with what feels small to you. When placed in His hands, your "little" becomes much.

**Prayer:** Heavenly Father, today, I come to You with open hands and an open heart. I thank You for the example of the widow, a woman who had every reason to withhold nevertheless, chose to release what she had as an act of faith and worship. Lord, teach me to give with a heart of faith, not out of my comfort but from a place of true faith. Help me to trust that when I release what is in my hand, You will release what is in Yours.

**Forgive me for the times I have held back out of fear** waiting to give until I had more, or until it felt safe. But I am learning that true generosity is not about what I give, but how I give. It involves the heart behind the gift. So today, I surrender my fears regarding not having enough. I surrender my pride that desires recognition. I surrender my need for control.

I want to give You my best not my leftovers. I want my life to be a living offering, poured out for Your glory. Help me to be bold in generosity, courageous in sacrifice, and full of joy in my giving. Let generosity speak louder than my words declaring that my trust is in You, not in things. May my gift no matter if big or small let it be pleasing to You, used by You, and multiplied by You to enlarge the kingdom of Heaven.

God, **"Thank You"** for seeing every seed that I plant, every coin I drop, every act of love that I extend. Remind me that no gift given in faith is wasted. You used broken bread to feed the multitudes and a widow's mites to teach nations. **Do it "once more" through me.** In Jesus' name I pray, Amen.

### **Day 38: Tithing – Honoring God with the First**

**Scripture: Malachi 3:10 (NIV)** *"Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. Test me in this," says the Lord Almighty, "and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing that there will not be room enough to store it."*

**Devotional Thought: 1. Tithing Is an Invitation, not an obligation.** Tithing is misunderstood as a legalistic duty, but in God's economy, it is a personal invitation. God is not attempting to take away from you. He desires to give blessings *to* you. When He says, ***“Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse,”*** He is inviting you to participate in something bigger than yourself. He is inviting you into divine partnership, kingdom provisions, and covenant blessings.

**It is not concerning the money—it is about the heart.** The tithe represents your first and best, and bringing it to God, you are stating: *“Lord, You come first in my finances, in my priorities, and in my trust.”* You are honoring Him not because you must, but because you get the opportunity to display honor.

**2. Generosity Unlocks Heaven's Resources** God makes a bold promise in **Malachi 3: “Test me... see if I will not open the floodgates of heaven...”** This is the only place in scripture where God invites us to test Him. Why? Because He recognizes it takes faith to give and it takes trust to give off the gross and not from the net, or what is left over.

**But here's the principle:** When you release what is in your hand, God releases what is in His. The windows of heaven are not just symbolic, they represent spiritual, physical, and material blessings. God does not trickle blesses; He *pours them out*. He delights in blessing His children who live with open hands and hearts.

**3. Obedient Giving Protects Your Harvest-** Tithing is not only about increase, but also protection. **Malachi 3:11** goes on to say that God will ***“rebuke the devourer”*** for your sake. This means that your obedience and faith activate provisions, also it activates divine defense.

How many unseen things has God stopped from destroying your income, your health, your business, or your peace, all because you have honored Him first? Your tithing places your entire financial life under the covering of God's covenant care. When you put Him first, He takes care of the everything else.

**Prayer:** Father, Thank You for being Jehovah Jireh, my faithful Provider, my Source, and the One who always makes a way. Today, I come before You with a heart of worship, bringing my tithes as an offering of honor and trust. I am not giving because I feel forced or out of religious duty, I give because I trust You and believe Your Word and promises. It is truth.

Lord, I recognize that everything I have comes from You. Every paycheck, every open door, every opportunity is because of Your goodness. Lord, I joyfully return the first portion to You as a declaration that You come first in my life. I do not give You what's left, I give my best.

You said in Your Word “to test You” and therefore I do, with expectation not with skepticism. I believe that as I give, You will open the windows of Heaven in my life. I am not looking for money but believing in peace, health, favor, provision, wisdom, protection, and divine connections. Lord, pour out more than what I cannot contain.

Lord, thank You that my tithes bring blessings and it divine covering. You will rebuke the devourer on my behalf and protect the works of my hands. Lord, preserve my resources, stretch what I have and make it, more than enough. Thank You for every time You blocked attacks, extended provisions, or sent help at the right timing.

I pray that my obedience today will impact generations tomorrow. Let my children, and my children's children, walk under the open heaven. I am building through my obedience and use what I give to feed the hungry, reach the lost, build churches, and bring glory to Your name.

So today, I do not give reluctantly, but with reverence, not fearfully, but faithfully. Do not give with anxiety, but adoration. I trust You with my finances, Lord, You have never failed me.

### **Day 39: Overflow**

**FAITH DECLARATION:** I am a child of God, and he has great plans for me. Blessed be the God who has bestowed spiritual blessings upon me in heavenly places through Christ Jesus. I am an heir of God, and a joint heir with Christ. Father, I lack nothing, and always have everything that I need, in Jesus' name. Amen.

**Scripture: Luke 5:1–11 (AV)** 1 And it came to pass, that, as the people pressed upon him to hear the word of God, he stood by the lake of Gennesaret, 2 And saw two ships standing by the lake: but the fishermen were gone out of them and were washing their nets. 3 And he entered into one of the ships, which was Simon's, and prayed him that he would thrust out a little from the land. And he sat down and taught the people out of the ship. 4 Now when he had left speaking, he said unto Simon, launch out into the deep, and let down your nets for a draught. 5 And Simon answering said unto him, Master, we have toiled all the night, and have taken nothing: nevertheless, at thy word I will let down the net. 6 And when they had this done, they enclosed a great multitude of fishes: and their net brake. 7 And they beckoned unto their partners, which were in the other ship, that they should come and help them. And they came, and filled both the ships, so that they began to sink. 8 When Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, depart from me; for I am a sinful man, O Lord. 9 For he was astonished, and all that were with him, at the draught of the fishes which they had taken: 10 And so was also James, and John, the sons of Zebedee, which were partners with Simon. And Jesus said unto Simon, Fear not; from henceforth thou shalt catch men. 11 And when they had brought their ships to land, they forsook all, and followed him.

**Devotional Title: *From Empty Nets to Overflowing Blessings***

**Scripture Focus:** *“And when they had this done, they enclosed a great multitude of fishes: and their net brake.” — Luke 5:6 (KJV)*

20 “Now unto him who is able to do exceedingly abundantly above all that we ask or think, according to the power that worketh in us.” **Ephesians 3:20 (AV)**

Peter and his fellow fishermen were tired, frustrated, and defeated. They had fished all night and caught absolutely nothing. Can you relate to this, you have done all you know how to do, you have worked hard, remained faithful, kept showing up and yet things still feel empty. But then, Jesus steps into Peter's boat.

**Your darkest hour is an “opportunity” for your greatest blessings.** What seemed like failure became the stage for a miracle. Jesus gave a simple command: ***“Launch out into the deep and let down your nets.”*** It did not make sense after a night of failure, but obedience to Jesus changed everything.

**You have tried it your way—now do it God's way.** Peter could have stated, “I am done.” Instead, he said, *“Nevertheless at thy word, I will let down the net.”* This one act of surrender opened the door to a supernatural outcome.

**Get ready for the overflow.** When Peter obeyed, the nets filled with so many fish they began to break. *Ephesians 3:20* is in action, God was doing exceedingly, abundantly above all that was asked or imagined.

Do not give up or quit in the empty place. Rather, invite Jesus into the situation. Listen to His words and follow His lead. **Your obedience will lead to overflow.**

**Prayer: Heavenly Father,** Today, I come to You not from a place of perfection, but from a place of need, hunger, and hope. I acknowledge that I have had some dark hours and, seasons where the weight was too heavy, the answers were few, and the hope felt distant. Nevertheless, in those moments, God, You were present. Even in the silence, You were speaking and, in the quietness, You were working.

Lord Jesus, thank You for not giving up on me, although, I had given up on myself and saw something in me, when others laughed at failure. You called me when I was drowning in discouragement and chose me while I was covered in shame. God, you did not disqualify me, but You rescued me, restored me and re-ignited the purpose inside of me.

I realize that my darkest hour was not my ending but was a setup for a divine opportunity for Your light to shine bright. It was a midnight moment, but You birthed a miracle. So, I do not despise my valleys, I do not curse the caves, the storms, or the silence. I thank You for them all. It was in the darkness that You met me, molded and transformed my life for your glory.

God, I have tried fixing it my way. I have strategized and reasoned. I have overthought and exhausted myself attempting to control what only You can redeem. But today, I surrender. I lay down my plan at the feet of the One who holds all power and hope. I am in His hands. **confess:** *My way does not work.* But Your way brings healing and hope leading to life. Your way is the only means that leads to the overflow of blessings.

Father, prepare me for the miracle of overflow. Enough to thrive, and not merely enough to survive. Let overflow come to my mind, with peace that surpasses understanding. Let overflow come in my heart that joy which is unspeakable and full of glory. Let overflow be extended in my financial resources meeting needs and blessing others. Let overflow occur in my relationships bring restoration, unity, and purpose-driven connections. Bring overflow to my ministry planting fruit that remains and multiplies.

I believe, God, that what You have prepared for me is greater. The pain produced something valuable inside of me creating room for the blessings. I am stepping into a new season. A season releasing blessings and restoration. A season that is filled with overflow, and Holy Spirit empowerment.

Thank You, Lord, for saving me, using me, and carrying me through it all. I may have walked through the fire, but I did not get burned. I may have experienced shaking, but I was not destroyed. I may have cried through the night, but just as you promised, joy came in the morning.

You are the God who turns mourning into dancing, ashes into beauty, and scarcity into abundance. So, I lift my hands in faith and great expectation and welcome the overflow of receiving the blessings. And I give You all the glory.

**Day 40: Warfare Requires Worship**

**FAITH DECLARATION:** I am a child of God, and my mouth will always be filled with praises because You are the more than enough God. No matter what weapons may be formed they will and cannot prosper because my mouth will declare and decree victory, we are more than conquerors, **because faith will sustain me through it all**, in the precious name of Jesus.

**2 Chronicles 20:21–22 (NIV)** “After consulting the people, Jehoshaphat appointed men to sing to the Lord and to praise him for the splendor of his holiness as they went out at the head of the army, saying: ‘Give thanks to the Lord, for his love endures forever.’ As they began to sing and praise, the Lord set ambushes against the men of Ammon and Moab and Mount Seir who were invading Judah, and they were defeated.”

### **Devotional Thought:**

**1. Worship Confuses the Enemy**—Jehoshaphat and the people of Judah were not facing a metaphorical problem; they were surrounded by hostile armies coming to destroy them. Instead of assembling their finest warriors first, King Jehoshaphat put worshippers at the front lines. It appears in the natural mind to be backward, but in the spiritual realm, it was God’s strategic plan.

Worship will always throw the enemy off balance and confuse him. The enemy expects tears, tantrums, fear, and failure and a world full of chaos. BUT, when you lift a praise song of *“hallelujahs”* in the middle of your sufferings, it confuses and disarms him. Worship breaks the cycle of fear and invites the presence of God to fight that battle supernaturally. Your worship in warfare is not weakness it is strategy. It says, “I trust God more than my own strength and He will bring the victory.”

**2. God Fights When You Praise**—Notice the sequence: *“As they began to sing and praise, the Lord set ambushes...”* God did not move *before* their praise He moved *in response* to their praises. often, we want God to act first then praise Him later. But the pattern of Heaven is Godly praise comes first, then supernatural power will respond.

**You do not have to fight with fists—God wants your faith!** Worship is an act of faith that trust God for the release of divine intervention. When you declare God's greatness over your battle, He will take over the war. In your sickness, worship, and confusion, God does not need your perfect plan, only surrendered praise and worship.

**3. Victory Often Comes Before the Fight**—Faith-filled worship praises God long before the breakthrough. The singers sung praises to the most-Highest God. They walked in strong faith forward to the battlefield, not with weapons drawn, but with voices lifted to Heaven, their Worship said it all, “God, I believe You even if I have not seen the outcome yet.” God, You, promised to go before us, stand beside us, and cover us in battle and that is more than triumph. It delivers victory over the enemy because we are more than conquerors, **because faith sustains us through it all**.

There is a bold kind of worship that arises in people who know who their God is worship that trusts Him although the storm is still raging, while the report remains bad, while the bills have remained unpaid, while the tears are continue falling. Praises and worship deliver *before* the situation may change because you looked at the God of deliverance it dispelled the power of the enemy. Victory belongs to you because of your uncompromisable faith and trust that the battle was already won.

**Prayer:** Father, today I come to You not in fear, but with faith-filled worship. You are my Mighty Warrior, the God who never loses a battle. When everything around me seems to be collapsing and falling in chaos, the enemies

are closing in, when I feel overwhelmed remind me that worship is my weapon and praise is my battle cry. Peace and deliverance are Your promises.

You need me to be strong in **Your** might with a surrendered heart. So, I lay down worry, fear, my need for control, and pick up my weapon of praise. I will praise You as if the battle is over. I will worship like the breakthrough is already here. I thank You that while I lift-up Your name, You are raising up a standard against my enemies.

God, when I worship, I am not simply making music, I am creating space for You to move. When You step into the fight, faith decrees it is a fixed fight and I win! You make walls fall and scatter the plans of the enemy. So, today I say: “Thank You, Lord. Your love endures forever.” I will say it in the darkness, in the silence, in the storms, and on the mountaintop. I will shout Your praises.

Let my heart worship you and be followed by the works of my hands. Let my trust in You lead me through the battle. I refuse to be discouraged and choose to be devoted. Let the sound of my worship shake the foundations of doubt, fear, and anxiety.

**This battle is not mine, but it belongs to You, Lord.** And because it is Yours, I know how it ends. Victory is in Your name. Peace is in Your presence. Strength is in Your Spirit. And praise will forever be on my lips.

In Jesus’ powerful and victorious name, Amen.

**Conclusion:** I pray that you have been blessed by this journey of devotion, prayer, and fasting. Always remember that your relationship with God should not be based on occasionally calling upon Him in only during the times of needs or troubles, but in a consistent and persistent walk with God daily.

**Psalms 1:1–3 (AV)** 1 Blessed is the man that walketh not in the counsel of the ungodly, nor standeth in the way of sinners, nor sitteth in the seat of the scornful. 2 But his delight is in the law of the LORD; and in his law doth he meditates day and night. 3 And he shall be like a tree planted by the rivers of water, that bringeth forth his fruit in his season; his leaf also shall not wither; and whatsoever he doeth shall prosper.

Steadfast, remember that the keys to the miracles of blessings, deliverance, and healings are accessed through a solidified relationship with God, that is based solely in His will, faith in His word, and by prayer and fasting. Faith will always sustain you; it is a key to God’s heart and without it, it is impossible to please Him. Above all” place your trust in Him”!
