INTRODUCTION, BACKGROUND, AND SCRIPTURE

Key Passage: Exodus 14:1–16 (NKJV)**Main Scripture:** Exodus 14: 13-16 (NKJV) 13 And Moses said to the people, "Do not be afraid. Stand still, and see the salvation of the Lord, which He will accomplish for you today. For the Egyptians whom you see today, you shall see again no more forever.

14 The Lord will fight for you, and you shall hold your peace."

15 And the Lord said to Moses, "Why do you cry to Me? Tell the children of Israel to go forward.

16 But lift up your rod, and stretch out your hand over the sea and divide it. And the children of Israel shall go on dry ground through the midst of the sea.

INTRODUCTION

There are moments in life when we come face-to-face with impossible situations—when the facts don't add up, the odds are against us, and the way forward seems sealed shut. It's in those moments that God writes His greatest stories.

Exodus 14 captures one of those defining moments—Israel trapped between the Red Sea and Pharaoh's army. Naturally, there was no escape. Spiritually, heaven was preparing to move in a way no one had ever seen before.

A miracle is the supernatural intervention of God that overrides the natural order—when heaven interrupts the ordinary to reveal divine power.

An unusual move of God is when He does it in a way that defies logic, reason, or expectation—where the outcome cannot be explained by anything except His hand.

The Red Sea parting was both: miraculous in power and unusual in method. God didn't use a bridge, a boat, or a battle plan—He simply told Moses to lift his staff, stretch out his hand, and move forward.

Key Supporting Scriptures

- Colossians 3:23 — Whatever you do, do it heartily, as to the Lord and not to men.
- Ephesians 3:20 — Now to Him who is able to do exceedingly abundantly above all that we ask or think, according to the power that works in us.
- Hebrews 13:8 — Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever.

SERMON POINTS

1) Miracles Are God's Intentional Interventions

Faith Response: Believe God still moves, expect the unusual, speak faith into every dry place, and give thanks because it is already done.

Scripture Anchors:

- Exodus 14:13–14 — "Do not be afraid... Stand firm... you will see the deliverance..."
- Isaiah 43:19 — Behold, I am doing a new thing...
- Proverbs 18:21 — Death and life are in the power of the tongue.
- 2 Corinthians 4:13 — We believe, therefore we speak.

2) The Power of Intentional Faith

Key Truth: Faith is not waiting for proof—it's moving with purpose while trusting God to perform the miracle.

Scripture Anchors:

- Exodus 14:15–16 — "Tell the Israelites to move forward... Raise your staff... divide the water."
- Hebrews 11:1 (NKJV) — Faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen.

3) How to Walk in Your Miracle (Exodus 14)

Key Step	Scripture Example	Main Focus	Faith Application
1. Be Intentional in Prayer	Exodus 14:10–13 – Moses sought God when the people panicked.	Prayer aligns your heart with God's voice instead of fear.	Pray first, not last. Seek God daily and let His presence settle your spirit.
2. Be Intentional in Obedience	Exodus 14:15–16 – God said, "Move forward," and Moses stretched his hand.	Obedience activates God's power and releases the miracle.	Do what God told you to do, even when it doesn't make sense. Faith moves before the waters part.
3. Be Intentional in Expectation	Exodus 14:19–22 – Israel walked forward before the sea fully opened.	Expectation keeps faith alive while you wait.	Speak faith, thank God early, and look daily for signs of His hand.

4) Standing on God's Spoken Word

Key Truth: Every promise God gives has an assignment attached. It will come to pass when it meets your intentional response of faith.

Scripture Anchors:

- Exodus 14:21–22 — The Lord drove the sea back... and turned it into dry land.
- Isaiah 55:11 — My Word... shall accomplish what I purpose.
- Romans 4:20–21 (NIV) — He did not waver... fully persuaded that God had power to do what He had promised.

BEYOND THE MESSAGE

Stand Firm Without Panic

Moses told the people to "stand firm," not because the situation looked promising, but because God had already determined the outcome. Standing firm does not mean doing nothing—it means anchoring your heart in trust while refusing to let circumstances dictate your response. Expectation trains spiritual vision to see deliverance before it manifests. Those who expect God to move unusually will recognize His hand when others only see chaos. Faith that stands firm, expects boldly, and speaks life positions us to witness God's delivering power.

Move Forward in Active Faith

The life of faith is active, not passive—it requires movement that aligns with God's instruction. Israel stood at the edge of the Red Sea with fear behind them and uncertainty in front of them, yet God commanded them to move forward. Waiting for everything to feel right can keep us stuck, but obedience releases divine intervention. Like a farmer who plants before the rain falls, we are called to take steps—praying, serving, giving, forgiving, trusting—before we see results. Breakthroughs often come after obedience, not before it.
