UNLEASHED: Releasing God's Glorious Kingdom in and Through You

Session 6: Leaving a Mark

GOALS

Main Idea: Live as a visible representative of God's kingdom, proclaiming His truth and demonstrating your faith through actions that reflect your heavenly citizenship.

Head Change: To recognize your identity as a representative of God's kingdom, which involves proclaiming His truth and living with intentional kingdom impact.

Heart Change: To inspire a heart of boldness, devotion, and love for God that will motivate you to live authentically as His representative on this earth.

Life Change: To live publicly and purposefully as an ambassador of God's kingdom, integrating your faith into every action so you can make a visible impact on this world.

OPEN

What is one way you've seen someone boldly live out their faith? How did that inspire you?

DISCUSS

1. Reflect on the opening example of the Queen of England instructing her daughter to let her posture reflect her position. How does this apply to believers in Christ?
2. Read **1 Peter 2:9–12**. How should understanding your identity as a chosen, royal, and holy representative of God shape the way you live and interact with others?

“⁹But you are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, His own special people, that you may proclaim the praises of Him who called you out of darkness into His marvelous light ¹⁰who once were not a people, but are now the people of God, who had not obtained mercy, but now have obtained mercy. ¹¹Beloved, I beg you as sojourners and

pilgrims, abstain from fleshly lusts which was against the soul, ¹²having your conduct honorable among the Gentiles, that when they speak against you as evildoers, they may, by your good works which observe, glorify God in the day of visitation.”

3. Read **Matthew 5:13–16**. What does it mean to be “**salt**” and “**light**” in the world? How can you particularly live this out in your daily life?

“¹³You are the salt of the earth; but if the salt loses its flavor, how shall it be seasoned? It is then good for nothing but to be thrown out and trampled underfoot by men. ¹⁴You are the light of the world. A city that is set on a hill cannot be hidden. ¹⁵Nor do men light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a lampstand, and it gives light to all that are in the house. ¹⁶Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father in heaven.”

4. Read **Philippians 3:20**. How does viewing yourself as a citizen of heaven influence your priorities, decisions, and actions on earth?

“For our citizenship is in heaven, from which we also eagerly wait for the Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ,”

5. What are some ways you can boldly proclaim your faith while remaining loving and respectful in a culture that often opposes Christ?

REFLECT

Finish the study by working through the following activities

Read: Read John 14:1–4. What does Jesus reveal about your identity and your destination?

Write: Take a few minutes to record some of your biggest takeaways from the study. What is one new thing you learned? What part of the study challenged you the most – and why?

Pray: Ask that God would empower you to lead and unleashed life for him – one that stands out from the crowd and draws others to his kingdom.
