"I am the Alpha and the Omega," says the Lord God, "who is, and who was, and who is to come, the Almighty." - Revelation 1:8

To begin, I wish to dispel two rumors I hear occasionally:

First: We are worshiping in the chapel temporarily. This is not a permanent move.

Second: Youth group is not dying or ending. It is just changing.

Now, lets talk about the verse above from Revelation and maybe connect all these things.

The one "who is and who was and who is to come" is an odd way to describe God and an old way. In fact a few of you may remember some prayers ending on that refrain "the one who was and is and is to come." however it is more than just an odd thing the bible says. Instead it is trying to say something important. God is both the one present in our pasts, the one with us in our present, and the one who is with us in the future. God is not just located in any one of those places.

The truth about us humans is that we tend to think that God is present only in either the past, present, or future. We think about God as being present only in the past when we focus on nostalgia for the way things used to be (or the way the church used to be). We think about God as only with us in the present when we focus on the now to the exclusion of all thoughts about the generations to come. We think about God as only in the future when we ignore the realities we have to focus on right now. But the truth that scripture tells us is that God is with us in all three times. He is with us in our pasts, but not to the exclusion of our future or our present. God is, in fact, working right here and leading us into something amazing in the future.

So that brings this back to my two rumor dispelling points at the beginning. As we worship in the chapel it can be tempting to think about this as purely a return to golden days of years past. Yet as we worship there we are not attempting to recreate the past. We are worshiping in the present and waiting for where God is leading us in the future. Similarly, as the leadership in our youth group changes that means things will be done differently. This does not mean God was any more with us in the past than God is in our present time.

Through all the changes of our lives God is the alpha and the omega, the beginning and the end, the one who was and is and is to come.

Adulting 101


The Adulting 101 July class, was a great first step to becoming more financially aware. It was great to see some high school and college-age faces looking for insight on personal budgeting.



Giving Garden Harvest Update for July 2023



We are mid-growing season right now. Vegetables being harvested include cucumbers, garlic, peppers, and squash. The vegetables that are starting to flourish are tomatoes, eggplant, beans and peppers. As grand as that sounds, we are well behind last year's harvest for the same time frame. By this time last year, we had harvested 231 pounds of vegetables compared to this year at 109 pounds. July last year was 187 pounds and this year to date only 69 pounds. So, what is going on???

Well good old Mother Nature has just not let the sun shine as frequently. We have had numerous cloudy days and yes, several dreary smoke-filled days. This has caused the tomatoes to fall behind in turning colors. Rainfall has been very good and we are on automatic irrigation this year so we cannot blame the lack of water. Unfortunately, over the past week we have lost 4 of our yellow squash plants to the squash vine borer. (I have a fix for that nasty insect next year)

Keeping my fingers crossed that our tomatoes will make a big splash in the next few weeks along with eggplant and peppers and beans. Late plantings of zucchini squash and some cool fall crops will hopefully bring a strong finish to the garden.


