Tell the Story

Matthew 14:22-33

²² Immediately he made the disciples get into a boat and go on ahead to the other side, while he dismissed the crowds. ²³ And after he had dismissed the

crowds, he went up the mountain by himself to pray. When evening came, he was there alone, ²⁴ but by this time the boat, battered by the waves, was far from the land, for the wind was against them. ²⁵ And early in the morning he came walking toward them on the sea. ²⁶ But when the disciples saw him walking on the sea, they were terrified, saying, "It is a ghost!" And they cried out in fear. ²⁷ But immediately Jesus spoke to them and said, "Take heart, it is I; do not be afraid."

²⁸ Peter answered him, "Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water." ²⁹ He said, "Come." So Peter got out of the boat, started walking on the water, and came toward Jesus. ³⁰ But when he noticed the strong wind, he became frightened, and, beginning to sink, he cried out, "Lord, save me!" ³¹ Jesus immediately reached out his hand and caught him, saying to him, "You of little faith, why did you doubt?" ³² When they got into the boat, the wind ceased. ³³ And those in the boat worshiped him, saying, "Truly you are the Son of God."

QUESTION 1:

One thing to notice about our reading for today is that we are given an image here of Jesus maintaining a life of prayer. In this case, we are shown that Jesus prays **before** the storm, indicating that prayer helps us be firm in our faith when the storm hits, as Jesus is not praying in the middle of the storm.

What would prayer look like to you if you centered yourself in prayer in advance rather than praying during a proverbial storm?

Would it change your perspective on things? (Please do not interpret this as you shouldn't pray during a storm-I think all prayer, no matter what stage we are in, is fine, before, during, and after-after all, prayer looks different to different people and is contextual to your experience).

QUESTION 2:

Being in a relationship of faith always involves certain risks. Peter steps out onto the water and starts walking, but then he gets distracted, fearful, and loses his faith.

As a follower of Christ, what risks have you faced?

How does focusing on Christ help us not be distracted by our fears?
