A couple of weeks ago Tuesday morning bible study was trying to decide what new topic people wanted to study. After some discussion it became clear that what people were wrestling with was despair in the face of all that is happening in our world. I don't think I have to list everything that is going on for you, dear readers, to understand the feeling. If you take two minutes to look at the news, both local and national, one can easily get the impression that the world is falling apart we feel adrift amidst all that chaos.

Ephesians 1:3-10 is the clearest summary of reasons why Christians should have hope.

There Paul writes:

"Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in the heavenly realms with every spiritual blessing in Christ. For he chose us in him before the creation of the world to be holy and blameless in his sight. In love he predestined us for adoption to sonship through Jesus Christ, in accordance with his pleasure and will— to the praise of his glorious grace, which he has freely given us in the One he loves. In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of sins, in accordance with the riches of God's grace that he lavished on us. With all wisdom and understanding, he made known to us the mystery of his will according to his good pleasure, which he purposed in Christ, to be put into effect when the times reach their fulfillment—to bring unity to all things in heaven and on earth under Christ."

So our reasons for hope are pretty clearly laid out. We have been blessed by God through Jesus Christ with every blessing. We have been chosen from the beginning to be God's people and God has adopted us into his family. Grace is free given and God loves us. Finally, all things, in the end, will be brought to unity in Jesus Christ. If that isn't reason enough for hope then I don't know what is.

However, Paul doesn't end there. A little bit later in verse 18 Paul writes that *"I pray that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened in order that you may know the hope to which he has called you."* So hope is not just a gift, and not just a logical conclusion as Christians, but also a calling. Callings are things that must be lived out and practiced.

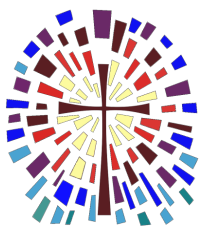
Practicing hope can be hard because we think of hope often as a feeling that just happens. Over the next few months I'll write more in this space about how to practice hope. Where practicing hope begins is taking all those reasons for hope Paul lays out in Ephesians and daily reminding yourself of them. Often practicing hope means saying to yourself *"I will be hopeful today because God has blessed me in every way, he has chosen me, and destined me for grace and love and new life."*

Afterall, if all that is true, why shouldn't we be hopeful?

Visiting with the Vicar,

Grace and Peace to you from our Lord and Savior, our Emmanuel, Jesus Christ the Lord.

Merry Christmas!

'Merry Christmas?' you say to yourself. Christmas Eve and Christmas Day have passed. Why is that crazy Vicar still wishing us a Merry Christmas?

When Julia and I first got together, she, coming from the United Methodist tradition, one of the first issues we had as a married couple was when Christmas was over. For her, her family tradition was to box up Christmas the day after. For me, when we got together, I struggled with this notion. Being raised in a somewhat orthodox Lutheran tradition, I still celebrated Christmas both in the Lutheran Church and in our family traditions until at least January 6th, Epiphany, and the Christmas tree stayed up until that point.

Now, this isn't an article about who is right and who is wrong. Rather, it's about what has become common in our society. We push the Christmas season further into the calendar, in some cases even before Halloween and All Saints Day, when stores start flipping the script. Then the Christmas décor and markings are quickly tossed aside on December 26, both in stores and in homes and offices. However, as we encourage you to do during the weeks leading up to Christmas by holding space for Advent, I think we need to do the same with the Christmas season after Christmas Eve and Christmas Day.

For the Church, we still celebrate the 12 days of Christmastide between Christmas Day and Epiphany. We celebrate the life, birth, and early childhood of Christ. We hear in Matthew about the escape to Egypt as refugees, and in Luke about Christ teaching in the temple. While Mark and John jump right into the ministry of Jesus around the time of his baptism and the calling of the 12 disciples, I think it is important to stay in the narrative of the Christ Child during Christmas. It gives us time to ponder the mystery of God choosing to be fully human and fully divine in Jesus Christ, teaching us the importance of being good stewards of one another here on Earth. So I encourage you not to rush past the mystery and miracles of Christmas yet, but to pause and wonder at the 'word made flesh' that gives us hope in the past, present, and future.

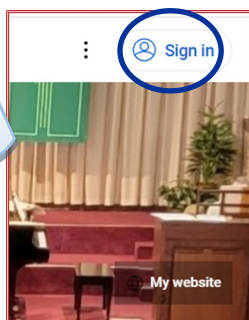
ATTENDING WORSHIP ONLINE

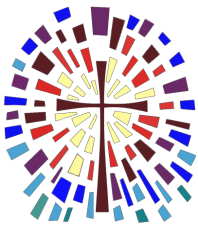
TIME TO PUT THE CHRISTMAS DECORATIONS AWAY

Giving Garden News - January 2026



This certainly is not the month I report much about the Giving Garden. But this is the time to be more reflective as the cold, dark, dreary days of January remind me of soil. Yes, soil!

As the GG soil at the surface is covered with a nice layer of straw mulch and occasionally a layer of snow, it is the deep-down soil underneath all of this is what I want to focus on. This soil is at work!

Soil in the winter continues to host bacteria, fungi and microorganisms, although they are moving at a slower pace, but they continue to break down organic matter and release nutrients for soil health.

Earthworms burrow deep into the garden soil to survive and they produce anti-freeze, so they are ready to warm up and get to work in the spring.

Microbes keep soil nutrients available and with the help of the straw mulch covering, the microbes and their production of nutrients stay nice and secure in the soil where they are needed.

My prayer for you as we enter January 2026 is that you reflect on your "soil".

May God provide you with all the spiritual nutrients you need in this New Year so that you are ready to grow a productive, faith filled garden inside of you.

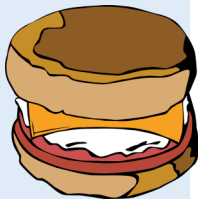
1st English Ministry

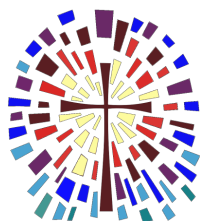
