What actually is lent all about?

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of this 40 day long season we call Lent, but what really is that season all about?

Is Lent just about feeling sad? After all the music is all in minor key. It's not quite spring yet and so the leaves have not returned to the trees. We all give up something we like for 40 days, is that just an attempt to make us miserable? Is it just about being sad?

But if that is all Lent is then there is really nothing special about it. I don't need any help feeling miserable. After all, the world is sad enough, desperately sad at the moment. There is a war being waged and we are exposed to every awful moment of it on our televisions. Our relationships with our families are still broken and the treatment of our diseases are still not working like we hoped. I don't need to give up chocolate or beer or whatever in order to be sad.

Or is Lent about feeling guilty. The confession of sin is rather long and we hear a lot about sin and our part in all that is sin. Are we meant to just focus endlessly on all our mistakes and our failures until they threaten to drown us?

But if that is all Lent is, then there really isn't anything all that special about it. I don't need any help feeling guilty. I'm pretty good at waking up at 3 AM and reliving every embarrassing moment of my life. I know all too well the failures and mistakes that I bring to this place, the things left done and undone as our confession and forgiveness says.. I know my addictions, my cruelty I've inflicted on others, and all the other deadly sins along the way. I don't need any help with guilt.

St. Paul writes: "*We are treated as impostors, and yet are true; ⁹as unknown, and yet are well known; as dying, and see—we are alive; as punished, and yet not killed; ¹⁰as sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, and yet possessing everything.*"

Paul is saying yes, we speak openly and honestly about all the places where we are treated as imposters, all the places where we feel unknown and forgotten, all the places where we are sad, all the places where we are grieving, all the places where we are dying not to make us feel guilty or miserable or sad,

No, we take an honest look at all those places because we also know that precisely there God is working God's wonders in Jesus Christ of raising from the dead. As having nothing, yet and yet possessing everything. As dying, and see we are alive.

This is what the cross, that moment we will come to on Good Friday is all about. That even in death we find God working. That is how Paul can say "now is the day of salvation" because in all the places where we are dying God is working there through Jesus Christ.

What is Lent about? It's not about being sad or miserable or guilty. No, it's about looking at ourselves and saying "I know Christ will take me by the hand and meet me in all those decaying and dying places and raise me from the dead."



Visiting with the Vicar,

This year, Ash Wednesday falls on February 18th, which also happens to be the day we celebrate and commemorate Martin Luther, Reformer of the Church, in the Lutheran version of the Church Calendar of the Saints. On this day in 1546, he died in Eisleben, the town of his birth and his family's hometown. He was there on business regarding his family's mining rights in the County of Mansfield, which had become an issue among the four Counts of Mansfield.

While there, he preached his last sermon at St. Andraes Church.

The irony of this day of commemoration falling on Ash Wednesday this year does not escape me, as God reminds us in Genesis 3:19: "you are dust, and to dust you shall return." This phrase has become ingrained in our liturgical rites, especially in funeral services and at the grave site. Ash Wednesday not only marks the start of the season of Lent and the journey of Christ to his death, but also reminds us that we all, including Jesus and Martin Luther, will die. But death is not the last word in our story; our resurrection in Christ is the ultimate victory.

However, this year, for me personally, it is another reminder that we, as Christians, are also called by God and Christ on the Cross to speak the truth, and that this calling sometimes leads to death. We live in a time when great social evils are occurring at the local and national levels. Immigrants and migrants, whether legally resident or not, including people who are citizens and who are not white, are increasingly marginalized and victimized by officials in our executive administration. We are also reminded of the sins of our past, as we just commemorated International Holocaust Day on January 27. Sadly, our own Lutheran heritage is tied to marginalization. Martin Luther's last sermon included instructions for Christians to force people of Jewish heritage out of Germany unless they wanted to become Christian. Germans and theologians would, for the next 400 years, use such writings to expand and justify antisemitism, with the Nazis in the 1920s to 1945 taking it to horrific ends.

Yet, at the same time, there have been and continue to be Lutherans and Christians who courageously push back against the narratives of empire and marginalization and speak and live out Christ's command to love our neighbor. For example, Lutheran pastor, theologian, and professor Dietrich Bonhoeffer wrote, taught, and preached against the sin of Christian Nationalism paired with Nazism, which took over the Church in Germany, ultimately paying with his life in a concentration camp. Conservative Lutheran pastor Martin Niemöller initially agreed with some of the reforms that Hitler and the National Socialist Movement wanted to implement, but shortly after they came to power, he recognized the danger of mixing Christian Nationalism with Empire and the Church, particularly the dangers the Nazi

Government began to institute. He began speaking out about corruption within the Church in 1933 and was eventually arrested and put in a concentration camp in 1937, only to be finally released in 1945 as the Allies liberated Germany. He later penned the now-famous "First They Came" poem, speaking about how silence aids the oppressor to the point that they will come for you eventually, and no one will be there to speak for you. Germans, particularly Lutheran Germans who have lived in the shadow of Nazism, have seen what Christian Nationalism can do to the Church, to the point that it almost destroyed it.


Given what we have recently seen in our newsfeeds or on news stations about issues with ICE in Minnesota, we see

Lutherans courageously speaking out and defending their marginalized neighbors. Lutheranism is the largest religious group in Minnesota. As Christ teaches us in Luke chapter 10, the keys to eternal life, and thus victory over death, are to love our God and love our neighbor by showing grace and mercy. I give thanks for the life-affirming work they are doing. Sadly, some have lost their lives while caring for neighbors, which reminds us that we too shall return to the earth someday. But we, as Christians, can give thanks that our ending is not the end, that we will be granted that glorious victory in the Resurrection of Christ Jesus.

And let us all give thanks to God and our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ for that. Amen.



During the readings and sermon and prayers they can get a bit fidgety.


So..."Children's Church" was started. There they can hear a Bible story, color a picture associated with that story and have some time to be kids.


2/17 **Shrove Tuesday**—we will have our annual pancake dinner provided by Men's Fella-ship (probably around 6pm)

Thank you to all the bakers! **FELC Breakfast will be Sunday, February 8th before service. Our next FELC dinner will be on Thursday, March 26.**




To all members and friends of RELC and great supporters of Operation Christmas Child: I will be making Tic-Tac-Toe bags for 2026.


