I failed this Lent.

No, seriously, I misfired on about twenty-five things. Meetings were almost missed because I didn't write them down, events were cancelled because we didn't get enough people, I seriously think my life managed to get more disorganized, I made a series of poor decisions, and finally my Lenten discipline made it a grand total of eight and a third days before I failed. About the only thing that went right was our Wednesday Lenten service.

In the category of "things I wish someone had said" a real winner is "I wish someone had told me how often I would fail." You would think this would be obvious and I confess that I'm cheating a bit because someone did mention this once to me. However, I wish this message had really been drilled into me.

We live in a society that is fundamentally afraid of failing. Not all that surprising really. We worship success. One need only look at our president for proof that even the claim of success is enough to win many people's support.

And yet, if theologian Friedrich Schleiermacher is to be believed then "*religion consists in the feeling of absolute dependence.*" I might go so far as to say that religion only makes sense when one has failed.

Well, at least our religion. Hard to recognize the need for a savior if you don't think you have seriously messed up to the point of no return. This is the root of the Lutheran insistence on The doctrine of Law and Gospel. The law is God's word that convicts you of your failure. Gospel is the promise that God brings new life anyway.

The good news is that he both loves and saves failures. In fact, if you look at the list of people God chooses, it's nothing but a long list of people who can't seem to get it right. Abraham can't quite trust that he is going to have a kid. Moses literally kills a man at the beginning of his story. Jesus chooses Peter who nearly gets everything wrong his whole career. Even on the cross, Jesus is right there promising new life and forgiveness where no one expects it.

That is, in the end, what Easter is all about. God promises new life and resurrection to all of us. Even and especially amidst all of our failures. So my prayer for you this Easter is that you can sit and see you are loved and promised new life, even amidst all your failures. We in the suburban world spend so much time pretending that we have everything put together. My prayer is that you learn to stop pretending and can join me in admitting that we all fail quite a bit.

Because after all, God has declared on Easter that we are all loveable failures that will receive new life.

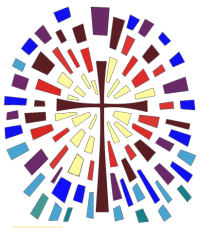

Visiting with the Vicar,

"...a time to weep, and a time to laugh; a time to mourn, and a time to dance..."

Ecclesiastes Chapter 3, verse 4

One of the things I appreciate about this poem is that it honestly holds polar opposites together. In fact, Lutheran Christianity recognizes that many things can be true simultaneously, even when they are opposites. Luther said that we are both saints and sinners. As I wrap up this journey with all of you, I am feeling both joy and sorrow—knowing that the end is near, a new transformation is beginning, while at the same time staying present in the here and now—almost a pastor, but not quite. Nearly finished with seminary, but not quite there yet. Preparing for graduation, filling out required forms, emails, and documents—while also writing sermons, essays, and working on final projects. That's not including the daily life responsibilities—being a husband, father, caretaker of Monroe's management of Scottie dogs, cats, ducks, chickens, rabbits, guinea pigs, and other creatures of the Woodland Realm; to name a few of my roles.

In the midst of all this, it's the season of Easter—Death to Life, Resurrection, Transformation. Jesus, through his physical death on the Cross, atones for our sins; he is resurrected and defeats death in a way that still mystifies us nearly two thousand years later, but grants us eternal life. Martin Luther often said that we do this daily—just as we go to sleep each night and awaken in the morning, resurrected into new life. In a way, the end of my time here feels similar. The old me is transforming into the new me: from intern-vicar to ordained pastor, from seminarian student to teacher, undergraduate to graduate. It seems surreal in many ways. The other week, my graduation cap, gown, and master's degree hood arrived at my house. I put them on to try them out and make sure they fit. My wife told me to put the hood on, and I told her no, not yet. Maybe I was being a little superstitious, but in a way, it was a nod to the fact that I am in this strange in-between time.

We often rush through life, coming and going so quickly that we forget to pause and be present in the moment. As I find myself caught between endings and new beginnings, I encourage you to do the same. For example, we tend to want to jump from Passion/Palm Sunday directly into Easter morning and the Resurrection, but the journey from one to the other is just as meaningful. There can be no Easter morning without acknowledging the complex realities of Maundy Thursday and Good Friday. As my internship committee often reminds me, it's okay to stop and breathe. Let us walk the paths we have left and breathe together, and take a moment this week to slow down, enjoy the present, acknowledge the solemnity of Good Friday, and look forward to celebrating Easter Morning together. One last time.

RELC Energy Conservation Tips from March

There are ongoing efforts to bring our utility costs down. As many of you are aware, the building is large, not well-insulated, and has a lot of gaps that allow heating/cooling to escape. We are taking a multifaceted approach to addressing this, but we truly need everyone's help as well.

- Signage is around the building to help educate about thermostat use and remind people to turn off lights and secure doors
- Letters have gone out to RELC ministry leaders and all leaders of outside groups that use the building requesting everyone pay a bit more attention to how we utilize energy in the building.
- Ministry leaders have been asked to share the details with their groups. Consider rotating responsibility for ensuring lights are off, doors are latched, and thermostats are properly set.
- Our heating/cooling is set up in zones and works best when all of the hallway doors are closed.
It's fine to have those doors open as we work in the building, but if your group is the last in the building, take a moment to get those doors closed.
- Thermostat settings: Thoughtful thermostat use is the single biggest change that can really help us.



Warming up an area:

- Designate someone to come a little early to adjust the thermostat, on **temporary setting**.
- Setting the temperature really high on a thermostat is NOT going to make the room heat up faster.

IMPORTANT NOTE: The HVAC systems at RELC have a very difficult time keeping up with weather temperature extremes (i.e., extremely low or extremely high outdoor temperatures). Adjusting the thermostat will not make any difference in these situations except to put extra strain on the units. If you find your work area uncomfortable, let the office know and we'll try to find a solution to help.

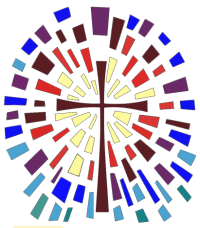

-We provided breakfast and dinner this month to our friends at First English. At breakfast we served 100 meals of eggs, sausage, potatoes, fruit and a pastry.

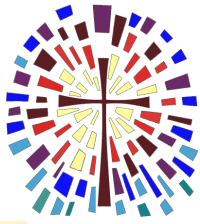
