***"About noon the following day as they were on their journey and approaching the city, Peter went up on the roof to pray. He became hungry and wanted something to eat, and while the meal was being prepared, he fell into a trance. He saw heaven opened and something like a large sheet being let down to earth by its four corners. It contained all kinds of four-footed animals, as well as reptiles and birds. Then a voice told him, "Get up, Peter. Kill and eat." "Surely not, Lord!" Peter replied. "I have never eaten anything impure or unclean." The voice spoke to him a second time, "Do not call anything impure that God has made clean." This happened three times, and immediately the sheet was taken back to heaven."***

**- Acts 10:9-16**

The most fundamental divide in the Bible's day was between Jews and Gentiles. Jews ate a certain way, Gentiles ate what they wanted. Jews wore certain clothes, Gentiles did not.

Jews lived within specific areas, usually close to synagogues because they had to be within walking distance of a synagogue... Gentiles could live where they wanted. So it is perhaps understandable that in Acts chapter 10 starts and God tells Peter to get over this divide and go eat with Gentiles that he has a bit of difficulty.

In Acts chapter 10 we meet two people, the first is Cornelius who is a faithful Gentile. The other person we meet is Peter, who has been Jesus' ever enthusiastic, but sometimes not so bright disciple. Peter gets a message from God that says it's ok to violate all the food regulations now. You can eat what you want. Food, which used to separate Jew from Gentiles, no longer has to be a dividing line. And what I love about this story is that Peter, ever enthusiastic and a bit stubborn, has the courage to argue with God. In fact, God has to tell Peter it's ok to eat what you want three times before he finally gets the message.

The story is a favorite of mine, not just because Peter is so loveably stubborn, but also because it reveals something about our fundamental human nature. It is very hard for us to let go of dividing lines that seem very clear. It's hard for Peter to get over the rules about food because after all, that is one of the fundamental things that divides Jews from Gentiles. Yet all the same, there God is, telling Peter it's time to get over himself and go eat with some people he has never eaten with before.

So my question for you today is this: ***What divide is God calling you to get over and cross?*** Peter is told directly by God to get over the food wars, and go eat something, and eat with somebody, he never has before. I suspect that all of us have some sort of divide between "us" and "them" that we think is essential in some way, but that God is telling us to cross. We all have something that will make us say to God "surely not, Lord" and every time God will respond with "do not call anything impure that God has made clean."

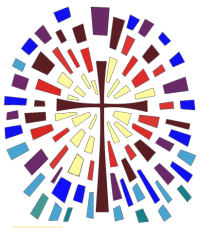

## Visiting with the Vicar,

April 2026

*From Philipians, Chapter 1, Verses 3 through 9*

***"I thank my God for every remembrance of you, <sup>4</sup> always in every one of my prayers for all of you, praying with joy <sup>5</sup> for your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now. <sup>6</sup> I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work in you will continue to complete it until the day of Jesus Christ. <sup>7</sup> It is right for me to think this way about all of you, because I hold you in my heart, for all of you are my partners in God's grace, both in my imprisonment and in the defense and confirmation of the gospel. <sup>8</sup> For God is my witness, how I long for all of you with the tender affection of Christ Jesus. <sup>9</sup> And this is my prayer, that your love may overflow more and more with knowledge and full insight <sup>10</sup> to help you to determine what really matters, so that in the day of Christ you may be pure and blameless, <sup>11</sup> having produced the harvest of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ for the glory and praise of God."***

So here we are at last, my final newsletter to you all. I find these words from Saint Paul to the congregation at Philippi appropriate for how I feel about our time together as we prepare to part ways. You all have been partners with me in this internship, walking with me to its completion on May 17th at my final worship service with you as your Vicar, and at my forthcoming ordination, tentatively set for June 20th, 11 a.m. here at RELC.

St. Paul was always on the move, going wherever he was required to go, whether to check in with the early Christian communities he helped form, to establish new ones, or to respond to requests for his help in established communities. Whenever Paul writes to his communities, he gives thanks and praise to God for them and usually mentions the partnerships they have built together.

I find this comforting, for it shows that the bonds of affection formed through our life together in Jesus Christ never end, even though we might be distant across physical space and time. The life we have shared together will always be with me in my spiritual and cognitive DNA and in my memories. RELC and the community it creates in and around it will always be a part of who I am and of the ministry I carry forward, no matter what I do and where I go. Thank you for the care you have shown my family and I over the past two years.

So, my friends, my family in Christ at RELC, I leave you with this parting blessing by Hendri-Frédéric Amiel:

***Life is short, and we do not have much time to gladden the hearts of those who make the journey with us. So... be swift to love, and make haste to be kind. And the blessing of God, who made us, who loves us, and who travels with us, be with you now and forever, Amen.***



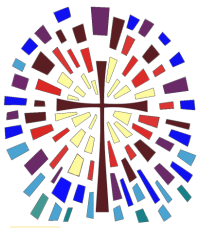

## GRANTS AND ALTERNATIVE FUNDING/SUPPORT

This ministry is focused on seeking sources of funding outside congregational giving. Here is a brief snapshot of what has transpired thus far (see how you might be able to help at the end of the article!):

- ELCA Hunger Grants: There are three types of grants available toward hunger ministry from the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA; our national church body). Our first Letter of Inquiry should be submitted by June 1st. The process takes several months, so look for regular updates to come.
- Community Retailer Grants: In the month of May, we will be seeking financial donations from area retailers through their community grant programs.
- B.O.L.D. Boost: 25 businesses in the immediate vicinity of RELC were approached about providing 10 canned goods, by the 10<sup>th</sup> of each month, for 10 months (Feb-Nov); additional follow-up to develop more interest will be happening in the coming weeks. (Remember, your donations to B.O.L.D. are also hugely helpful, so keep them coming! And thank you!)

Grant research: there are three main areas being pursued for grant research, namely, energy conservation infrastructure, support for our hunger ministries, and media development improvements.

### \$250 Thrivent Action Grants

- All members of Thrivent have the option of applying for two \$250 Action Grants per calendar year.
- These have to go toward some project that is a community improvement.

- The application process is simple. There is a little bit of follow up afterward, but it's easy.
- If you are willing to do this for a project at RELC, please let Katherine Hunt know in the office, Drew Nelsen (Council President), or me and we'll help this effort go toward a meaningful project here at RELC.

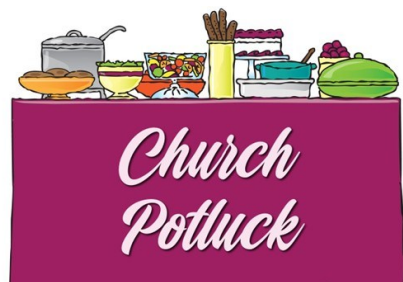

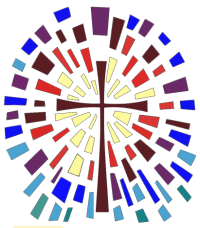

I hope you will continue to follow the GG road as we plant and eventually harvest spring crops and then summer’s bounty.

May God continue to walk with you on your journey. May you find your road to be peaceful and filled with pleasant surprises. Remember to say “Thank you Jesus” even though the road may be bumpy or cause a course correction.

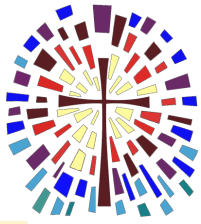
**FELC Breakfast is on Sunday, May 10 which is also Mother's Day, and dinner is on Thursday, May 28.**
