***"A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another."***

***- John 13:34-35***

"Love one another." It's a command that sounds easy enough. After all, Jesus also says "love your enemies." By comparison, "love one another" sounds simple. Loving church people and fellow Christians sounds easy.

At least, it sounds easy until we begin to actually experience our fellow Christians. The people that share the pews with us are often different from us. They come from different backgrounds, have different political beliefs, different ethics, different experiences. So suddenly "love another" becomes a bit difficult. Can we love each other if the other person is a Democrat or Republican? Rich or poor? White or black? Can we love each other when there are real disagreements among us?

The world's honest answer to those questions is no, we can't be different and love another. So that is why everyone continues to sort themselves into groups where no one has to experience a disagreement. We block people on Facebook and other social media sites that have different opinions than us. Sociologists call this "self-sorting". We sort ourselves into groups that increasingly look, think, and believe like ourselves because it is easier to love people who are like us.

The word Jesus uses for love here is the famous word "agape." Agape means a love that, according to my Greek dictionary, means "love that seeks the true good of another regardless of merit or cost." There are two important pieces here. First, notice that love in this definition is not just a feeling. Jesus is not saying "feel good about one another." Jesus is saying that love here is not a feeling but an action. Seek the true good of the other person. One can seek the true good of another person even if your feelings about them aren't so great. Second, "regardless of merit or cost" is the crucial bit of this definition and the hardest part. We are to seek the good of the other person, black or white, Republican or Democrat, citizen or not, regardless of what that good might cost us.

For Jesus, this is all rooted in the fact that Jesus loves us in this exact way. "Love one another as I have loved you." In John's gospel this is Jesus' final command before he is crucified. Jesus' love is a love that seeks our true good even if that means death.

So, "love one another" may sound easy, but it is actually one of the most difficult things we can do. Yet it is also one of the most necessary things in our world. For our world has created a lot of easy and cheap love. Our world pushes us to love people exactly like us. Jesus calls us to love one another, to seek the good of each other regardless of merit or cost. It sounds difficult, and it is, but we have tried only loving people like us and it hasn't turned out too well. So as hard as it is, why don't we give Jesus' way a try.

We went 3 units over goal! ❤️

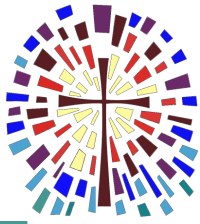

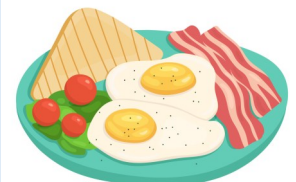

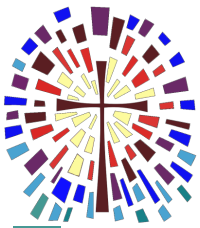
## FELC English Meal Ministry

## Giving Garden News - June 2026

### HAPPY BIRTHDAY



This month we celebrate a milestone birthday for the Giving Garden. The Giving Garden is 10 years old! In 2016, the Giving Garden was created because of an Eagle Scout project. At that time, there were four raised beds and a large inground plot on the east side or back of the church. Since then, the GG has expanded in all directions. Currently the main GG on the east side is home to 6 raised beds, a no-dig garden featuring straw bale gardening, a hillside meadow, and a pollinator garden. The south side is our "container" garden, where growing is done in a variety of containers from buckets, to grow bags, to straw bales and modular metal raised beds. In 2024 we expanded the Giving Garden to the west side of the church or our front entrance by creating the Mark Reynolds Memorial Garden. The various raised beds in this garden feature vegetable crops as well as flowers. As you can see, the Giving Garden indeed has lived up to its name over the past 10 years by "giving" back in the form of garden fresh produce to our BOLD community.

So Happy Birthday to the Giving Garden. May it continue to be a source of pride to RELC and the Hilliard community. May it continue to meet the needs of the BOLD participants that face food insecurity. May it continue to be an educational garden where we teach others about growing vegetables, flowers and fruit.

Thank you Jesus for the celebration of 10 years that the Giving Garden has existed. May we continue to serve you and others through this ministry.

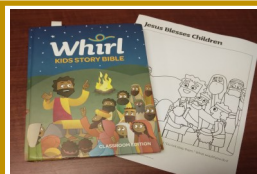


## Congratulations!

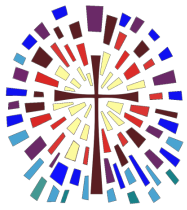
