The Lord said to Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt, ² “This month shall mark for you the beginning of months; it shall be the first month of the year for you. ³ Tell the whole congregation of Israel that on the tenth of this month they are to take a lamb for each family, a lamb for each household. ¹¹ This is how you shall eat it: your loins girded, your sandals on your feet, and your staff in your hand, and you shall eat it hurriedly. It is the Passover of the Lord. ¹² I will pass through the land of Egypt that night, and I will strike down every firstborn in the land of Egypt, from human to animal, and on all the gods of Egypt I will execute judgments: I am the Lord. ¹³ The blood shall be a sign for you on the houses where you live: when I see the blood, I will pass over you, and no plague shall destroy you when I strike the land of Egypt. ¹⁴ “This day shall be a day of remembrance for you. You shall celebrate it as a festival to the Lord; throughout your generations you shall observe it as a perpetual ordinance.” ~Exodus 12:1-3, 11-14

The above reading is the instructions God gives Moses and Aaron for the first Passover. On the whole, it seems like a boring reading that only gives liturgical and cooking instructions. Yet, if we look carefully, these seemingly boring instructions have a lot to say to us in this world.

The first thing to notice is in verse 11: “this is how you shall eat it: your loins girded, your sandals on your feet, and your staff in your hand, and you shall eat it hurriedly.” Basically God is saying that they need to be ready to move. The truth is that God always calls God’s people to be on the move. Abraham wanders for most of his story. Jacob and David are virtual refugees, never staying in one place too long. God’s people spend 40 years wandering in the wilderness and 40 years in exile. Read the book of Acts and you will find that early Christianity is never settled. The faith of Jesus Christ moves from Jerusalem to Samaria, then to Antioch, then to Greece, and finally to Rome. If there is one truth about our God it is that God never stays in one place too long.

The second thing to notice is in last verse: “this day shall be a day of remembrance for you.” God’s people are called to remember. They are to remember what God has done for them. Their entire worship life is geared around remembering. Even into the New Testament and the church today we are still called to remember. After all, we hear every Sunday “do this in remembrance of me.” The act of remembering is not just about keeping our facts straight. Instead the act of remembering is something that produces a new identity for God’s people. Remembering, at least according to God, is an active process. By remembering they tell a new story.

Now, I know what you are thinking: “pastor that is terribly interesting, but so what?” Well the truth of the matter is that we desperately need the faith of remembering and movement. We are very tempted in our world today to just sit down and stay put. Afterall, staying where you are is safer. It involves no risk. Yet the faith of Jesus Christ is a faith that is always on move. Moving to new people and places and ministry.

Similarly, we need to hear the call to remember. There are so many things in our world trying to give us an identity. Whether it be politics, or the news, or our addictions, or the things we buy, all these things offer us the promise of new identity. The problem is all these identities are flawed in some way. They will not offer us any new life. The only way to new life is to remember God and the story God has given us.

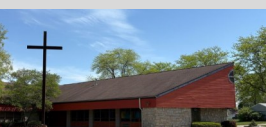
So, let us embrace our twin calls: the call to be on the move and the call remember so that we may we may go out into the world with confidence and hope.

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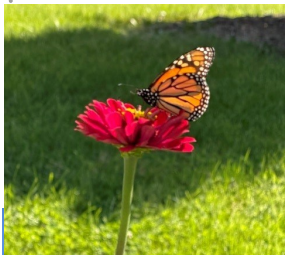
Giving Garden News - September 2026



Garden art is any non-plant object or creative design element added to an outdoor landscape to provide visual interest, create focal points or express personal style. Did you know that the GG has a small variety of garden art? There are whimsically painted vegetables attached to fencing, a small stained glass water basin, garden themed signs, a bee house for nesting and most recently a garden post.

On Sunday August 9th the garden post was blessed during church service and permanently placed in the GG on the 18th. This garden post is a labor of love by several individuals and one group. Two sides of the post have beautifully painted stencils of flowers and vegetables and the third side has the GG year of establishment (2016). Thank you to the 4H group Serendipity, Corbin Kelley and Madison Lattro for your help with painting the stencils. The fourth side has engraved block letters, RELC and BOLD and an engraved bok choy thanks to Charlie Anderson. A bright red tomato in the form of a metal post topper completes the garden post. Mark Williams was the final “touch up” artist and post installer. I am grateful for the artistic love everyone poured into this piece of garden art.

Bringing the art world out into the garden can enhance the garden landscape. We will continue to shape the GG artistically over the next 10 years

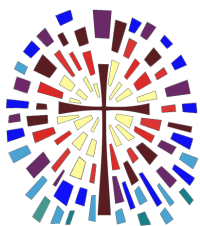

FELC English Meals

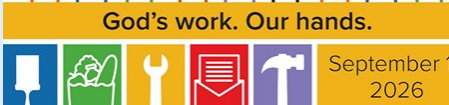

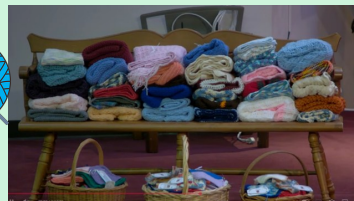

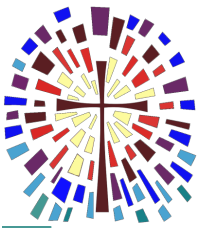

Change, Children, and Christ!

I often mention to people how much the RELC family has helped me, particularly in the very dark time after my son's death. But, one thing that has continually inspired me over the years is the willingness of this congregation to pivot in new directions, even when it may not be comfortable or easy. Additionally, there are little things each week that stand out to me that I wish those who don't know this community were better acquainted with.

Let me point out some very recent examples.

During the picture-taking on Sunday of the Giving Garden crew, Carol Williams detailed all the hands, both big and small, that contributed to the new sign pole recently mounted in the garden, an artistic addition that helps make the garden not just a place for plants to grow but a peaceful, attractive zone that showcases, whether known or not, the commitment of a full team of people to bring fresh produce to our neighbors in need, the beauty of God's creation, and the inspirational touches of art that make the garden a serene destination.



Also on Sunday, young Liam enthusiastically approached Pastor Dave, asking if he could help with Communion setup and noting that he wanted to teach his friend Finnegan. With the complete silliness and innocence of young boys, they wriggled and giggled while anticipating when Pastor Dave would let them get started. Oh, for us all to come to Christ with that kind of eagerness and joy! Two pairs of little, learning hands then unwrapped bread, poured wine, and removed covers with great seriousness and sense of responsibility.



Sharing the Peace is another marvel to me. I'll admit, it overwhelmed me a bit when I first started at RELC and I see similar hesitation when newcomers join us. But, there is something kind of amazing that unfolds. Lots of smiles as folks extend a hand and a blessing "Peace" AND dozens of little "let me catch up with you" chats...only momentary...that may be concern, congratulations, introduction, or comfort. No, that's not what is prescribed, I suppose, for that brief period of connection, but it's a way of shaping the RELC community so sweetly and is a precious time when we "feel" Christ's community profoundly.

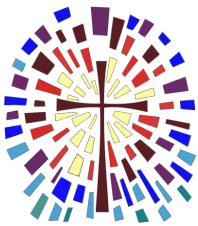


I have endless examples, but I'll close by challenging each of us to pause for a moment when we are in worship, in Bible study, in the parking lot distributing food, on a mission to tackle a difficult building issue, in a classroom sharing Christ's story with our young people, or in any of the hundreds of other moments that happen at RELC and watch what is happening, listen to the hunger to learn about Christ, and allow your senses to take in the many "God moments" that occur. May they remind us that we are God's children, and may they be a blessing to you as they always are to me.

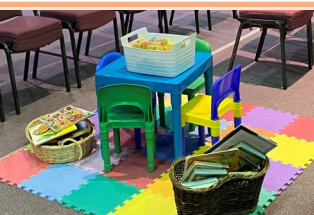

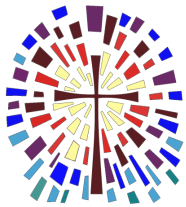

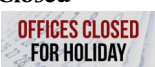
