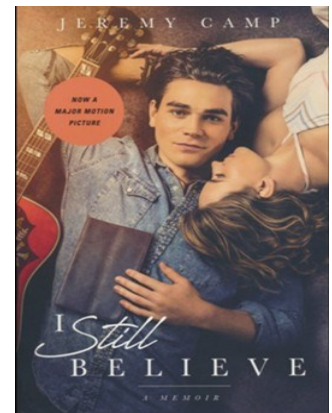

Student Minister: Maggie Sholar

Met with my ministerial support team. Working through worship transitions. Preparing for upcoming Lent activities.

What a month of ministry I have been blessed to be a part of here at West Lake.

Below you can see some data regarding that ministry.

From January 12th – February 8th :

2 of our current members have gone through an extensive study of who Jesus is and have committed their lives to The Way.

3 Guests contacted via phone call

12 Pastoral care Visits to homes, hospitals, or in office

32 Pastoral Care Phone Calls

14 Discipleship meetings (Time wrestling and studying with those who are hungry for Jesus)

Some of these other areas of ministry are not necessarily data, but they help us to understand just what was going on here this previous month.

Worship – Organized and led the funeral service of Pete Renick, helped tweak the new order of worship, organized and help implement the new video announcements, and met with the Worship Team weekly to organize, plan, and ensure we have meaningful worship throughout Lent. We also had a wonderful dinner at Carmalitas to celebrate the Christmas Cantata and discussed how often they would be willing to sing. It was decided that once a month is exactly what they would want. We also have been focusing on our online ministry and have put together a survey that will be on our website and Facebook pages. As you all also saw the McMullin's put together a Sunday morning worship service online the Sunday we closed.

Discipleship – Continue meeting with people who are hungry to know Jesus, not just know of Jesus. We are seeing real fruit blossoming here on a weekly basis as two of the people participating have discovered Jesus and have dedicated their lives to The Way.

Ministry Teams – I spent lots of time investing in our ministry team leaders this past month. It was a joy to meet with them, refocus them, and dream with them.

Christian Unity (Ecumenism) – I had the opportunity to help lead the Lake Leadership Conference with other Disciples Clergy. It was time spent uniting with other congregations and discussing just what spiritual leadership can be.

Police Chaplaincy – I have been working with the Chief of Police in Laurie to build a police chaplaincy program. We hope that you will hear from him soon.

Student Minister – I happily spend time investing in our Student Minister. This month I was able to help facilitate a team of people from the Region and from West Lake in discussing the growth of Maggie. It is a joy to hear of how the Spirit is moving and acting in her life, and how she is sharing that with the world.

Board Moderator – Bucky Gazaway and I spend time together each week to ensure that we are united in our leadership of West Lake. Along with the Executive Team, we have been in the process of bringing on a new staff member which has included writing job descriptions, communicating, and interviewing.

What a fruitful month it has been, and this is just what I was involved in. You have been doing ministry in places, to people, with the Holy Spirit that there is no way to calculate.

Thank you for being the church you are. Thank you for being the people that you are. I am so grateful for each of you who have decided to put your Faith into Action!
