Treasurer's Report

- At the end of nine months, our bottom line shows that we are over \$21,000.00 short of break-even. The primary reason for the jump in our deficit was paying the second half of the church property insurance, which was \$10,282.00. On the income side, we have built into the budget, taking \$23,500.00 from our restricted accounts to balance for the year. None of this has been moved, but if 9 months' worth totaling \$17,125.00 had been moved, we would only be about \$4500.00 short of break-even.
- In September, an additional \$645.00 was contributed to our Capital Campaign Fund, bringing our total to \$20,560.00 towards our \$25,000.00 goal.

He will soon undergo a follow-up surgery to address additional health concerns, and we ask the congregation to continue keeping him in prayer. - **Backpack** This past week we completed our 4th week of distributing weekend food bags to students at Easton Elementary. We have averaged between 120 and 125 per week.
- Crop Walk The annual walk takes place on Sunday afternoon, October 19, walking about 1-1/3 miles from Corpening Plaza down through Old Salem and back. Currently, we have 9 walkers signed up and a total of \$1,060.00 donated. Last year's Winston-Salem/Forsyth County Walk raised a total of \$100,820., which was our 4th largest total, and placed us 8th in the country.
- Children's Sabbath The congregation is working to fill the boat, located in the front of the sanctuary, with a list of items needed, available on our website or in the weekly newsletter, which will then be given to the Piedmont Chapter of Newborns In Need.
