Primary Task

To lead, oversee, and develop the faith formation ministries of our children-infants through 6th grade-and families of Third CRC that connect them to Christ, his church, and his community.

General Responsibilities

- 1. Pray faithfully for our children, ministry volunteers, and families.
- 2. Maintain a visible presence in the lives of our children and their families—i.e., congregational events, attend their sporting or arts events, home visitation, etc.
- 3. Advocate for the interests of children in our congregation to staff and leadership.
- 4. Collaborate with staff to create a formation environment that is intergenerational—ensuring that children are invited and included in the life and work of Third.
- 5. Develop goals, outcomes, and milestones for children's faith formation that intentionally move them to the next steps of following Jesus.
- 6. Recruit and develop children's ministry volunteers.
- 7. Create schedules for volunteers; manage family and volunteer databases; engage in healthy communication patterns; and other administrative details.
- 8. Ensure adherence and compliance to Third's Safe Church Policies and Procedures.

Specific Responsibilities

- 1. Prepare for and facilitate Sunday morning ministries—including: Children's Worship, Music Together, Faith Formation classes, and ECHO.
- 2. Support our Nursery, GEMS, and Cadet coordinators and their ministries.
- 3. Oversee the purchase, distribution, and use of all curriculum, equipment, supplies, crafts, snacks, etc.
- 4. Coordinate special ministry events: Vacation Bible School, Christmas Program, Family Fun Nights, etc.
- 5. Serve as a liaison to the Small World Preschool.
- 6. Develop and oversee the children's ministry budget.

Other

- 1. Directly accountable to the Lead Pastor–meeting regularly for mentoring and ministry oversight.
- 2. Participate in weekly staff meetings and specified ministry team meetings as requested by the Lead Pastor or Council.
- 3. Schedule is flexible with night and weekend event attendance required.
- 4. Given an annual evaluation.

Qualifications

- 1. A love of children and a desire to see them grow in their love for Jesus.
- 2. Proven experience working directly with children and families.
- 3. A college degree is required.
- 4. Able to articulate a mature Christian faith that is shaped by a Reformed identity.

Compensation

This is a half-time position–18-20 hours per week; salary is commensurate with experience, education, and the salaries of similar positions in our area.
