

DEVOTIONAL GUIDE

Weekly Text: Matthew 1:18-25

Monday: Joseph faced a challenging circumstance when he discovered Mary was pregnant. His initial reaction was one of concern and righteousness. How do you react to unexpected or difficult news? What can we learn from Joseph's desire to act justly while showing compassion?

Tuesday: Read Matthew 1:20-21. An angel appeared to Joseph in a dream, providing clarity and reassurance about Mary's pregnancy. Have you ever felt God guiding you in a confusing situation? What does this passage teach us about trusting God's plans over our understanding?

Wednesday: Read Matthew 1:22-23. Joseph's acceptance of the angel's message shows his willingness to embrace God's purpose. What might God be calling you to embrace in your life right now? How can we prepare our hearts to accept God's calling, even if it disrupts our plans?

Thursday: Read Matthew 1:24-25. Joseph's immediate obedience to the angel's command exemplifies his faith and commitment. What are the challenges you face in being obedient to God's calling? How can we cultivate a spirit of obedience in our daily lives?

Friday: Read Matthew 1:18-25. Joseph's peace came from trusting God's plan amidst uncertainty. His actions had a profound impact on the world. How does trusting God provide peace in your life? In what ways can we share this peace with others?

Prayer: Eternal God, thank you for the example of Joseph and his unwavering peace in trusting your plan. Help us to embrace your calling in our lives, even when it feels daunting. May we reflect your peace in our hearts and share it with those around us. In Jesus' name, Amen.
