

A Letter from Our Pastor

Dear Faith Community,

Sometimes when I am distributing communion, God reminds me that every person who steps up to accept the Eucharist or to receive a blessing is the object of God's TOTAL focus. To God, it is as if that person were the only individual in the universe. And every aspect of that man/woman/child's life, personality, activities, joys and worries is of huge concern to the Creator. No one is left out, left behind or marginalized.

And that also makes me acutely aware that this individual person could change the world. Or the Church. Or Prince of Peace Parish.

It only takes one Catholic Christian to make someone feel welcome at church. Or to make Holy Communion available to a post-surgical patient in the hospital. Or to make faith formation a possibility for every third-grader who wants to come. It takes only one person to speak a difficult truth at Pastoral Council or to collate those last few bulletins or to make music with voice or keyboard at a weekend liturgy. It is because of an individual that sufficient bread and wine are prepared for Mass, the church is readied for a wedding, altar servers are assigned for an important event. It takes one person to pay the bills, another to organize the collection counters, one to lead the translators or compose the bulletin or shop for prayer blanket fabric.

Although we are the Body of Christ, a community, a great mass of people journeying toward the Kingdom, it is the individuals who steer, brake and make a difference.

This means that NO ONE IS UNIMPORTANT in God's plan. Nothing is left out. No one is unaccounted for.

So many of you have given generously to the financial support of our parish and our building program and our many ministries. Beyond that, only when each of us realizes that s/he is important and necessary to this parish will we really be built up into the community that God desires.

What is YOUR place. What does he call you to do or be?

This wonderful parish is about all of us. But it is also – it must be - about <u>you</u>.

Financial Report for Fiscal Year Ending June 30, 2007

Thank you for your generosity in supporting Prince of Peace during this last fiscal year with your prayers, your financial resources, your skills, and your very valuable time. As always, your support makes possible everything this community does.

This year has been a year of construction and some disruption. The addition to the Religious Education Building (newly renamed the St. Joseph Center), the repairs and upgrading of the old wing of that structure, the plaza, fire control system, a second air-conditioning chiller yard and more parking have been completed. The furnishing of the Mary Chapel continues. The cost of these projects is \$7,400,000 which will result in debt of \$2,000,000 once all Capital Campaign pledges have been received by the end of December 2008.

As our community grows, we are in need of *everyone's* continued support in keeping our parish strong and vital in all areas. Our budget for the current fiscal year is \$67,000 a week, which provides for an increase in parish ministries as well as additional operating expenses for our new facilities. The budget also includes \$472,000 to supplement building projects and \$120,000 to meet the Archdiocese's requirement that each parish maintain a reserve for that parish's own facility maintenance. The Finance Council is dedicated to ensure that your offerings are used responsibly in supporting our church and its many ministries.

As we start our new fiscal year, our biggest concern continues to be the shortage in pledges for both the Capital Campaign and the Diocesan Service Fund (DSF). Nearly 6,000 households claim Prince of Peace as their parish church. Sadly, only 1,300 families have contributed to the building campaign for the Mary Chapel and the expansion of the St. Joseph Center. Even fewer have supported DSF. Every contribution will make a difference, so please contact the parish office to make your pledge and assist the parish in reaching our goal and once again to be debt free.

Thank you for your stewardship. The gifts that you entrusted to this community have touched many lives during the past year. *You are Prince of Peace!*


