





ITINERARY

Day 1: Tuesday, October 13

Flight to Israel

Day 2: Wednesday, October 14

Arrival at Ben Gurion Airport (TLV). Meet your guide and driver and transfer to hotel in Netanya for dinner and overnight.

Day 3: Thursday, October 15

Caesarea, an ancient city built by King Herod in honor of Caesar Augustus. The next site will be Mt. Carmel, where Elijah slew the prophets of Baal. From there you will visit the archaeological site Megiddo, the strategic place of the future battle of Armageddon. Dinner and overnight at hotel in the Galilee.

Day 4: Friday, October 16

Magdala, Capernaum, where Jesus performed many miracles and the Mt. Beatitudes, where Jesus delivered the Sermon on the Mount, fish lunch. Boat Ride on the Sea of Galilee and **boat museum (Jesus boat).** Dinner and overnight in Galilee.

Day 5: Saturday, October 17

After checking out of your hotel, you will head to Qaser El Yahud, a possible site for the baptism of Jesus. You will take a cable car to the top of Masada, where Jewish refugees courageously held off the Roman army after the destruction of the Temple of God. **Dead Sea** swim at your hotel. Bring water shoes or old sneakers. Dinner and overnight at the Dead Sea.

Day 6: Sunday, October 18

Visit Ein Gedi, where David wrote many psalms. Visit Qumran. Visit Jericho, visit ruins. Genesis Land with lunch, possible visit to Lazarus tomb, if permitted. Ascend to Jerusalem and see the spectacular view from the Mount of Olives. Dinner and overnight at hotel in Jerusalem.

Day 7: Monday, October 19

Start your day with a tour of the Israel Museum. Then you will tour Yad Vashem, the Israeli memorial of the Holocaust. You will enter the Old City. Visit the Cardo and shop in the Jewish Market. Dinner and overnight at hotel in Jerusalem.

Day 8: Tuesday, October 20

Visit the Temple Mount and then followed by a visit to St. Anne's Church, near the Bethesda Pool, known for its excellent acoustics, Western Wall Tunnels, visit to pray at the Western Wall. Visit the Garden Tomb and share communion together. Dinner and overnight at hotel in Jerusalem.

Day 9: Wednesday, October 21

Shiloh. Your tour will end with a farewell dinner in a private area and a flight back home or overnight in Jerusalem depending on flights.

Day 10: Thursday, October 22

Arrive home.

A Prayer to the God of My Life

Psalm 42:9

Hashem, Elohim, El Shaddai - some of us come to You today with a massive weight, the kind of sorrowful weight that is internal and yet the laws of physics do not apply because there is nothing visual that applies to this weight.

This emotional dynamic is heavier than anything we have ever had to physically carry. This weight never leaves us. It is with us when You, Abba Father, wake us up, and we are reminded of this loss throughout the day, and then once again, when we lay down to sleep. Outwardly the people we interact with cannot see this weight upon us except perhaps by the outward expression on our face. They see a sadness that doesn't begin to tell the story. For some of us, this is a new weight, for some it has been with us for just a little while, and for others it has been decades of weight.

In some cases, we are physically living but emotionally lifeless.

Father, if we have put our time of mourning in "Shiva" and we are to move forward and breathe in life with every new breath You gift us with, then WHY do we continue to go through our days with this inconceivable sorrow? Is this a burden for us to bear alone? Is this our destiny, a self-appointed life sentence of inconsolable sorrow? No!!!!!!!

For those who have yet to find the true meaning of life, for those who believe that the one we lost is the definition of who THEY are, I say to you, you are carrying the burden of life and existence that you were never designed to carry!

Nothing will ever truly make sense or provide the "Peace that surpasses human understanding" until you awaken to the indisputable fact that our Jewish Messiah, our King of Kings, our Lord of Lords, "YESHUA" is the One designed to carry this sorrow, this internal pain, this loss.

You were not brought into this earth with the purpose of living a life of perpetual mourning. You were brought into this world because the God of all creation has a meaningful purpose for your life.

It says in Luke 6:45 "from the overflow of the heart his mouth speaks."

It also says in Proverbs 18:21 "Death and life are in the power of the tongue."

Jeremiah 33:3 "Call to Me, and I will answer you - I will tell you great and hidden things, which you do not know."

Do you get what Adonai is telling us? He is calling an audible for us!

Speak life, speak hope, speak joy, and for goodness sake, speak in prayer to the "Son of God" our Messiah, King Yeshua. He is waiting to take this sorrow and turn it into indescribable joy! The solution comes only from our Messiah.

Again, begin with calling out to the "God of all creation."
