

IMPORTANT NOTES ABOUT THE LORD'S SUPPER

The Bible teaches that along with the bread and wine of Holy Communion we also receive the true body and blood of our Savior. Jesus' own words, "this is my body" and "this is my blood for the forgiveness of sins" reveal His Real Presence in the sacrament (Luke 22, I Cor. 10:15-16). The Bible also teaches (1 Cor. 11:23-32) the Lord's Supper, properly received brings great blessings, but improperly received without understanding can actually incur God's judgment. If you are a baptized Christian who has been instructed in the Biblical teaching of communion, please feel free to commune today. If you have any questions, please first speak to a pastor.

As you come forward, gluten free wafers are available by request, as well as individual cup choice of wine or lighter colored non-alcoholic grape juice (located in the center of the trays). Common cup is also offered during Traditional Praise services at the altar only. **During regular worship weekends, the Lord's Supper is celebrated in Traditional Praise on the first, third, and fifth weekends of the month; and in Modern Praise on the second and fourth weekends of the month.**

MODERN PRAISE WORSHIP

A relaxed, modern Lutheran worship celebration led by guitars, keyboard, and drums. All services feature Bible focused teachings, and the life-changing love of Jesus is shared through His Word. The Lord's Supper is celebrated on the second and fourth weekends of the month.



TRADITIONAL PRAISE WORSHIP

A traditional, liturgical Lutheran worship celebration led by a pipe organ and enhanced by choirs, hand bells, brass, strings, and other classical instrumentation. All services feature Bible focused teachings, and the life-changing love of Jesus is shared through His Word. The Lord's Supper is celebrated on the first, third, and fifth Sundays of the month.



FAMILY WORSHIP ASSISTANCE

- **Children's Activity Bags** for young children are located just outside of the entry to worship. These activity bags are filled with paper, crayons, and other things to keep little ones content. Please feel free to help yourself to a bag or ask an usher to assist you.
- A Family Worship Room, located in the chapel off the north hallway behind the sanctuary, provides a live video feed of traditional worship services. When you feel a need to step away with your little one, this room is the perfect destination!
