Historical Note

John Wesley first called Methodist preachers together in 1744 for a conference in London. When the Methodist movement spread to America, the preachers gathered for the first time in Philadelphia in 1773. During the Revolutionary War between England and the American colonies, many Anglican pastors returned home to England, causing a clergy shortage in the new nation. When the Methodists gathered for the Christmas Conference in 1784 at Lovely Lane Chapel in Baltimore, Maryland, they formed a new church, The Methodist Episcopal Church. In 1892, the Methodist Episcopal Church preachers decided to meet every four years, a practice that continues today.

Shortly after the Christmas Conference, Jacob Albright set out to spread Methodism to the German-speaking people of Pennsylvania. In 1803, those Methodist class meetings met in a conference where they ordained Albright to lead them. In the years that followed, they would name themselves the Evangelical Association, and would continue to hold conferences to lead the new church.

At about the same time, another group of German-speaking Pennsylvanians gathered under the leadership of William Otterbein and Martin Boehm. At their conference in 1800, they ordained bishops and organized themselves into a new church called Church of the United Brethren in Christ, and agreed to meet in annual "General Conferences." Soon they would also move to a quadrennial (once every four years) cycle. The Evangelical Association and United Brethren in Christ would form the Evangelical United Brethren in 1946. Then in 1968, they would join with The Methodist Church—formed through a series of splits and unions of The Methodist Episcopal Church—to become The United Methodist Church.

Methodism in Missouri began with a sermon in the summer of 1798 by John Clark. In 1806 John Travis was assigned to the "Missourie" circuit. Thus, the history of Methodism in Missouri began.

Charge Conference: The charge conference is the unit that connects the local church to the general church. The conference should meet at least annually to review and evaluate the total mission and ministry of the church and to adopt new goals. The district superintendent presides at that meeting, or he/she appoints another elder to preside. The conference receives reports from the church staff, all local church organizations and Volunteer-in-Mission teams. The group may also recommend candidates for the ordained ministry. The Charge Conference establishes the budget and the sets the compensation for the pastor and other staff members appointed by the bishop. The conference also elects leaders based on nominations by the Committee on Lay Leadership. The Charge Conference is composed of the Church Council, but to encourage broader participating, the charge conference may be convened as a Church Conference in which all professing members have the right to vote. 14 The Charge Conference will elect a lay leader who will meet regularly with the pastor to discuss the church and needs for ministry. The Charge Conference also elects lay members of the annual conference.

General Conference: General Conference is the top policy-making body of The United Methodist Church. It meets once every four years and revises The Book of Discipline (church law) and Social Principles, and also adopts resolutions on current moral, social, public policy and economic issues. It also approves plans and budgets for churchwide programs for the next four years.
