Biographical Sketch

Robert Appel was born on September 15, 1921 in St. Louis, Missouri. He was raised in St. Louis and joined his parents as members of Salem. Mr. Appel's parents, George and Irene Appel, were loyal members of Salem, and played a large role in saving the church during the Great Depression of the 1930s.

During World War II, Mr. Appel entered the United States Army in 1942 and served with Company B, 7th Infantry Regiment, Third Division as a 30 Caliber light machine gunner. He was wounded in his neck on January 31, 1944 on the Anzio Beachhead, Italy. Mr. Appel was discharged honorably in 1945.

After the war, he returned to the United States and continued his active membership at Salem. He was employed by United Van Lines in the capacity of Personnel Manager (hiring and placement), as well as Advertising and Public Relations Manager for over 25 years. Robert Appel first married Jennie Louise Grant, and the couple had a daughter Robbie (Robbie Louise Rabanus). Mr. Appel's wed a second time to Lorraine Lemmons. He married once more, to Ms. Shirley Sneed.

Robert Appel was integral in building Salem's Archives by carefully collecting and saving valuable documents related to the church's history. He chronicled the church's history in his book Salem - Congregations of the Faithful, and educated Salem's membership as the longtime "church historian." Salem is indebted to Mr. Appel for his keen recognition of the importance of Salem's documented history and material culture, and his dedication to collecting it.

Scope and Content Notes

SERIES 01: Includes early, middle and final drafts of the manuscript for the book <u>Salem – Congregations of the Faithful</u>. The book is a history of the first 150 years of Salem United Methodist Church written by Robert Appel. Some pages of the manuscript drafts correspond with different pages of the book. The manuscript draft pages that correspond with different book pages are labeled as folder names. Manuscript graphics include

drawings, photos, and excerpts from church bulletins, church records, etc. Also included are a book index, created by the Special Collections Department of the St. Louis County Headquarters Library, and correspondence and material related to the book.
