Historical Note

The Asbury Methodist Chapel was established circa 1848 at the corner of 19th and Gay Streets in St. Louis. A Sunday school arose from this congregation in 1864, and it was from that group of worshipers that St. John's church began. When the chapel was sold in that same year, about seventy-five people organized and decided to build a new church in a different location.

Work on the structure, at 2901 Locust Street, began in 1867, and the church was dedicated in 1869. Called St. John's Methodist Episcopal Church South*, the new building made quite an impression on a local writer who called it "one of the largest, wealthiest, and most influential churches in the city." That same writer said the church cost \$90,000 to build.

As the population in the City of St. Louis moved westward, the church needed to follow its parishioners. They bought property at 5000 Washington Place, an Italian Renaissance building designed by architect Theodore C. Link at Kingshighway and Washington Boulevard. That location in the Central West End came to be called "The Holy Corners"** because of the beautiful houses of worship that located there. In 1902, they sold their original property and moved to their new home. The Italian Renaissance building on Washington became home to the newly renamed St. John's United Methodist Church. They remained open until 2007, and, as of 2021, the building is the home of an antiques auction house.

*The name Methodist Episcopal Church was used prior to 1939. In that year, the Methodist Episcopal Church and the Methodist Episcopal Church South merged to become the Methodist Church. In 1968, the Methodist Church merged with the Evangelical United Brethren to become the United Methodist Church.

**"Holy Corners" acquired its name because of the concentration of churches that were erected at the intersection of Kingshighway and Washington Boulevards. Holy Corners is a designated St. Louis City Landmark. The first church, St. John's Methodist, was designed by Theodore Link in 1902. The next to be built was First Church of Christ, Scientist designed by Mauran, Russell and Garden. Across Kingshighway the Racquet Club was constructed in 1906, also designed by Mauran, Russell and Garden. The Second Baptist Church was constructed in 1907, followed by Temple Israel. In 1908, the Tuscan Temple was the last of the Holy Corners buildings to be constructed.
