WILDLIFE VBS AT SALEM JUNE 12-16, 2023



The Bible teaches us that God made the animals. Animals, like people, are a part of the world God made, and we can learn so much from them. Think about facts you know about any animal you have seen or learned about. Kangaroos can jump 10 feet straight up into the air. In the same way people are right or left-handed, elephants develop a preference for turning their trunks one way or the other. Aardvarks can't see very well, but they use their keens senses of hearing and smell to guide them in the night to find the many ants and termites that they eat to survive. It's wild that God helps each animal grow and thrive . . . and us, too! This year at Salem's Vacation Bible School, "Wildlife," kids will discover how special they are to God and how wild it is that they can share their story, use their gifts, spend time with God, and spend time with others. This five-day morning program will focus on learning to build spiritual habits through lessons in the gospels about Jesus through awesome music, fun games, creative art, and lots of FUN!

VBS is for kids ages three years old and potty trained through those entering 5th grade in the fall of 2023. Cost is \$35 per child. BELONGING

There are six core questions humans long to have answered. Am I safe? Do you understand my point of view? What is my purpose? Am I valuable? Do you love me unconditionally? Do I belong?

Belonging matters to people. This spring, we are looking deeply at the story of the woman at the well in the Gospel of John. When the story begins she is at the well at noon, and she is curiously alone. In the ancient world women went to the well based on their status. The most respected would visit the well first, in the cool of the morning. No one wanted to go to the well in the hottest part of the day. But this woman is drawing her morning water at noon. She's alone. Not in the company of the other women. Not enjoying their conversation and companionship. She obviously does not want to be with the other women.

Have you ever experienced this? Have there been times in your life when you felt like you just couldn't be with people? I have seen this many times in the churches I have served—people who have pulled themselves away from the community of faith for one reason or another. A divorce—an addiction—a troubled family situation—economic hardship.

The pain was too great, or in their mind too embarrassing, to share with the community that could hold them up in the troubling time.

But what we learn from the woman at the well is that we need not be alone. Jesus comes alongside us in these moments, and there is a community that awaits our return. I hope that you will join us for the Belonging series this spring, and that you will seek new ways to find your place in the Salem Community as well. Next Steps is a great place



for those new to the church to meet our pastors and learn more. Serving at Haven Street is a great way to meet new people and feed those in our community that are hungry. We have small groups ready to welcome you. VBS is right around the corner for the kids in our church family.

No matter where you are in life, you are not alone. Jesus is right beside you and your community is here for you. We'll be celebrating Mother's Day with special music in all our services and recognizing the graduates among us. The labyrinth and prayer walk at Mid-County is in full bloom and open to the community any time of day. I pray you will allow Jesus to greet you wherever you are on life's journey, and that you will feel the blessings of belonging this spring.

If you ask anyone in the church or the faith-based non-profit sector, they will probably tell you that summer tends to be a season of low giving. FREEDOM SCHOOL BEGINS THIS YEAR ON JUNETEENTH!

This year, since Freedom School begins on June 19, it will kick-off with a Juneteenth celebration at LifeWise. Juneteenth commemorates the freedom of enslaved African Americans and derives its name from combining June and nineteenth as that was the day in 1865 when Major General Gordon Granger issued the order that proclaimed freedom for slaves in Texas, and as of 2021, Juneteenth is federal holiday. Members of the worship bands from Salem and The Connection will support the Freedom School Juneteenth celebration with their musical talent.

Once again, Salem is partnering with LifeWise to support Freedom School by hosting one of their locations at our South-City Site, The



Connection. Freedom Schools are a program of the Children's Defense Fund, and in St Louis, LifeWise St Louis facilitates their work through staffing, training of staff, and administration. Freedom Schools provide food and education to young students over the summer to keep them advancing in their reading levels. This is Salem's fourth year to host a Freedom School site, and we

are thrilled to be a part of this important supportive work for students and their families. Freedom School students in the past have averaged an eight-month gain in educational progress after only six weeks in this summer program.

Freedom Schools also provide opportunities for college students to serve as interns who work with the children over the summer. Serving as Freedom School interns not only gives these students valuable life experience and insight into possible career choices, but it also helps them to see the needs of children and families in our community. These young people will not leave their summer work experience unchanged. Working directly with children from St Louis schools will shape their character in ways that will hopefully give them a passion for service that will last a lifetime.

Do you want to help encourage children to learn? Freedom Schools also need volunteers to read to students and to provide enrichment programs each week at The Connection, Salem's South-City Site.

Summer Readers Volunteers Needed: 8:50-9:30 am Volunteers will choose a book that is meaningful to them, read the book aloud to K-2nd grade youth, and answer questions from the scholars.



Afternoon Activity Leaders Needed: 1:00-3:00 pm

Volunteers will teach/co-teach a 45-60 afternoon activity with elementary students (examples include but are not limited to: arts/crafts, team building games, music, knitting, tie dye T-shirts, baking, physical activity, and gardening).
