#### The Problem with Kindness:

"People Often Misinterpret Kindness As Tolerance And Tolerance Is Viewed As Consent"

• We Often Confuse Kindness With NICENESS

"Niceness is About You, While Kindness Is Acting In The Best Interest Of Others With Empathy And Compassion."

Nice Isn't Always <u>KIND</u> And Kindness Isn't Always <u>NICE</u>

But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness,.....Galatians 5:22

Kindness = Greek = **Χρηστ**ό**της** = Fit for Use / Useful Kindness = Old English = Cynde = Kin/Class/Family = Humankind / Mankind

"Kindness Points To A Character Quality That Not Only Is Useful Or Essential, But It Reflects The Central Attribute Of What It Means To Be Truly Human."

### Jesus Models Human Kindness

At dawn he appeared again in the temple courts, where all the people gathered around him, and he sat down to teach them. <sup>3</sup> The teachers of the law and the Pharisees brought in a woman caught in adultery. They made her stand before the group <sup>4</sup> and said to Jesus, "Teacher, this woman was caught in the act of adultery. <sup>5</sup> In the Law Moses commanded us to stone such women. Now what do you say?" <sup>6</sup> They were using this question as a trap, in order to have a basis for accusing him. But Jesus bent down and started to write on the ground with his finger. [vs 8:1-6]

"bent/stooped" = Greek = κύπ**τω** ="To Lower Yourself"

<sup>7</sup>When they kept on questioning him, he straightened up and said to them, "Let any one of you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." [va8:7]

"straightened" = Greek =  $\alpha v \alpha \kappa \circ \pi \tau \omega$  = "To Stand Up"

"Before The Sinful, Adulterous Woman, Jesus Lowered Himself, But Before The Unkind, Cruel & Hypocritical Men Jesus Stands Up"

Again he stooped down and wrote on the ground. At this, those who heard began to go away one at a time, the older ones first, until only Jesus was left, with the woman still standing there. Jesus straightened up and asked her, "Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?" "No one, sir," she said "Then neither do I condemn you," Jesus declared. "Go now and leave your life of sin." [vs 8-11]

Human Kindness <u>BENDS</u> Down

The Son of Man came not to be served, but to serve Mark 10:45

Human Kindness <u>STAN</u>DS Up

We have seen his glory, the glory of the one and only Son, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth. John 1:14

"If You're Only About Truth - You Will Be Condemning. If You're Only About Grace - You Will Be Condoning"

• We Have A Hard Time Separating The PERSON From The Sin.

"In The Midst Of This Woman's Sin & Brokenness, Jesus Chose To Show Extraordinary Kindness - And It Started When He Separated The Person From The Sin."
