



## #9 Gentleness – “Gotcha”

The Fruit of the Spirit:

*“...love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control.”*

Galatians 5:22-23

Greek = πραότης [pra'h-tas] = gentleness/meekness

The “Gotcha” Moment:

*Brothers and sisters, if someone is caught in a sin, you who live by the Spirit....* Galatians 6:1[NIV]

*“When We Are Caught In Our Sin - We Wish In That Moment That Someone Would Be There To Help Us With The Mess”*

- As A Jesus Follower, You Are In The RESTORATION Business
- Condemnation Is Destructive – Restoration Is CONSTRUCTIVE

Gentle Restoration:

*“Begin With The End In Mind” ~ Steve Covey~*

Question #1: “What Is My GOAL?”

*“...you who live by the Spirit should restore that person gently.”* Galatians 6:1[NIV]

*“Is The Goal Restoration, Or Is It Condemnation?”*

Caught In a Net Vs Caught By a Net:

*“To Be Caught In A Net Implies Danger. To Be Caught By A Net Implies Safety.”*

- Gentleness Requires STRENGTH

*But watch yourselves, or you also may be tempted.* Galatians 6:1
