Awards

Club attendance awards are given quarterly. One unexcused absence is allowed each quarter. Excused absences are given for sickness or family emergency.

Sunday School Attendance awards are given twice a year. Two unexcused absences are allowed in each half-year segment. A clubber does not need to attend Sierra Grace Fellowship to receive this award. Attending any church service or Sunday School class fulfills this requirement.

Cubbie & Sparky Awards

First Book Ribbon is given upon completion of the first book in Cubbies or Sparks.

Second Book Ribbon is given upon completion of the second Sparks book. A Cubbie bear is awarded upon completion of the 2nd Cubbie book.

A Sparky Award Plaque is given upon completion of the three Sparks books. The clubber will receive a pin and an attractive plaque. This is the highest award in the Sparks Club.

Truth & Training Awards

The Alpha Award is given upon completion of any one of the Truth and Training handbooks.

The Excellence Trophy and Pin are given upon completion of any two of the Truth & Training Handbooks.

The Challenge Award is given upon completion of any three of the Truth & Training Handbooks.

The Timothy Award and Pin are given upon completion of any four of the Truth & Training Handbooks.

Trek Awards

A Meritorious award is given to those who have completed six books; 4 T&T books and 2 Trek books.

Discipline

Our basic rule is that we will do nothing that could bring dishonor to our Lord Jesus Christ. We are to do nothing that would hurt any person, any thing or ourselves.

For serious misbehavior a clubber may receive a 1-count, which is a warning given by the Leader. If poor behavior continues and a 2-count is received, the clubber misses the rest of that evening's activities, and sits in another room and discusses their behavior with the club director. If a clubber receives a 3-count, the clubber is taken to the Commander who will attempt to call their parents for prompt pick up. The clubber is always welcome back another night provided that he or she has agreed, with their parents, to behave.

We want all clubbers to come and have a good time, but not at the expense of other clubbers. A clubber who has received a 3-count will be allowed to return when he or she and their parents have assured the Commander that the clubber will have appropriate behavior while at Awana.

Helpful Hints for Finishing a Book.



The handbook is an essential element of your child's success in Awana. It helps him or her learn about God as well as reinforce positive moral values.


Here are some helpful things to remember:

- 1. An entrance test MUST be passed before a clubber may purchase and wear a uniform and purchase a book.
- 2. No more that 2 "helps" are given per section to receive credit.
- 3. Uniforms MUST be worn to receive an Awana award.
- 4. Help your child be self-disciplined by encouraging him or her to take 10 to 15 minutes each day to work on their handbook.
- 5. Do your best to explain the meaning of each verse. We memorize more easily and more quickly if we understand what we are learning. If you want to confirm the meaning with your child's leader, feel free to give them a call. We want to help!
- 6. Sections are passed when they are said by the clubber to their Awana leader in person, never over the phone.

Standards of Behavior





1. Doors open to clubbers at 5:20 p.m. Clubbers should report directly to the game floor for opening flag ceremony. Cubbies should go directly to their club room. Club starts promptly at 5:30 p.m. and ends promptly at 7:30 p.m.

2. Respectful language always is expected before, during, and after club.

3. Care and respect should be shown for church property.

4. Anything that would hurt anybody or anything is not allowed.

5. Running is allowed only on the Game Circle during certain games.

6. Leader supervision is required for clubbers to enter the church.

7. Chewing gum should be left at home and not brought to club.

8. After every activity, the Commander, Director, or leader in charge will begin counting from one to five. By the time number five is reached, each clubber is expected to be waiting quietly for instructions for the next activity. In Awana, leaders and clubbers are taught to respect the "five count."

9. Uniforms and handbooks may be purchased when clubbers have completed their entrance booklet. Upon receiving the uniform, the clubber should wear it to every regular Awana meeting.

10. Awards are presented only to clubbers who are properly wearing their uniforms.

11. Sections must be passed by clubbers in one session. A maximum of two helps per section is allowed

12. Address Awana leaders respectfully - Mr., Mrs., or Miss.

13. Game time is a privilege. In cases of extreme disorderliness, it may be revoked for a night by the Commander or Director.

The Awana Store will be open two times during the year.

The Awana Store will stock various toys, trinkets, crafts, a small amount of candy and souvenirs that clubbers will be able to purchase solely with Awana Bucks they have earned at Sierra Grace Fellowship's Awana ministry.

Spontaneous bucks may be given out for participation, good sportsmanship, or a Christ-like attitude These bucks are at the discretion of the Awana Commanders to distribute, and may be done at different intervals throughout the club year.
