## News from Jacobo in Zacapa

Antony was a twelve-year-old boy who arrived at the Zacapa Home last months for the second time. He had a very sad story: He was abandoned by his mother because of alcohol and drug addiction, and nothing is known of her whereabouts to this day. He was left in the care of his father, who died a few months ago. No one else took responsibility for him, so he returned to the Zacapa Home. During his time there, God gave us the opportunity to speak to him and show him His love. Several times, through Bible lessons, we presented him with the importance of having Jesus in his heart. Antony always listened attentively and responded to God's love. One day, during a scheduled activity at the Zacapa Home, the children were taken to a swimming pool by the staff where he drowned. It has been very difficult for everyone to cope with, especially for his fellow friends at the Home.

A few days ago, a memorial service was held for Antony. It was a very healing time for the children and staff of the Home. We could see how the comfort of the Holy Spirit came upon everyone. Thank you all for supporting this ministry of love that eternally blesses the lives of the children.



Please join us in prayer for Jacobo and team as they minister to the children and staff at Hogar Zacapa after Antony's drowning. Many children are asking for prayer and seeking the Aguilar's support as they struggle with sadness and fear. Jacobo shared that the director and staff of the government home are also seeking out the Aguilars for prayer and spiritual support. We grieve the loss of Antony with them and pray that God would continue to strengthen Jacobo and his team as they support so many in this sad and stressful time.

## News from Josias in Xela


