Because these children are in great need, this year we brought breakfasts to this place blessing hundreds of children. Today we see how they are



developing a desire to know God more. We pray that in 2026 God will bless these children of Xesana with His love and support.

From Jacobo in Zacapa...

Marconi is a 14-year-old teenager. I remember the first time I spoke with him; he was crying from sadness and frustration. He didn't understand why he was at the Zacapa Home. Some time ago, his parents had marital problems, and Marconi's way of escaping was to go out into the streets. That's why the police turned him over to child welfare authorities in Guatemala City, and he was taken to the Zacapa Home. At first, he was a lonely child, just sitting and watching his classmates play soccer. But little by little, he began to trust us and told us his story. He started to enjoy every activity we did, he started playing soccer, and above all, we began to see how God's love and peace began to fill his heart. Several times he has asked me to pray for him. Marconi listens attentively to the Bible stories. Something that stands out about Marconi is that he is someone who is willing to please God with his behavior. A few days ago, while playing soccer, another teenager with a violent temper started provoking him by pushing him in the chest. The only thing I said to him It was: "Don't answer him, stay calm," and Marconi listened me. It was amazing to see how God had given him the strength to remain calm. We had our Christmas soccer tournament with the children of the Zacapa Home. We gave out a prize we called the "Golden Ball." It was to be awarded to the best player, the top scorer, and the one with the best conduct. The winner was Marconi.
