Day 1

Individual – Repentance and Cleansing

“If I send pestilence on My people, and My people, who bear My name humble themselves, pray and seek My face, and turn from their evil ways, then I will hear from heaven, forgive their sin and heal their land.”

2 Chronicles 7:13b-14 (CSB)

Thought

Are you ready? The prayer of repentance is the most important prayer we pray as God’s children. It means that we desire to return to closeness with God and that we are ready to abandon any and all things that we have traded for that closeness.

This is where we start - “Turning” is our part; it’s our first step toward God. Just as we consciously turn toward and pursue sinful things in our lives, we must also consciously turn away from evil in our lives and turn to God. Prayer

Day 2

Thought

We all find ourselves under attack at times. David certainly knew what it was like to be attacked, yet he never retaliated against King Saul. Day 3

Thought

Thought

Thought

I recently saw a meme stating, “In Texas, we don’t say, ‘You missed the exit.’ We say, ‘Where are you going?’.”

I’ve missed countless turns. Even worse, I’ve been guilty of rejecting timely guidance from the passenger seat. I’ve come to terms that I may never get better at knowing where I’m going, but I must get better at receiving guidance if I want to get there. Thought



comes from Him.”*


Psalm 62:1 (NIV)

Thought

Thought



Thought

Often, when we are faced with tough decisions, our first instinct can be to rely on our power and our limited wisdom. Our pride challenges us to push through and make the best decision that we can and hope for the best outcome. This mindset is contrary to the Bible in James chapter one. James reminds believers that the Lord is ready to give His wisdom generously to those that seek Him and ask for His help in time of need. God desires to impart His wisdom to our Pastor Search Committee and our church body as a whole, but we must be confident when we pray and ask for His guidance in this search process.

Prayer

God, as we seek our new Pastor, we ask that You give us Your wisdom and patience in the process. Help us trust You and seek Your will with confidence, and as we are waiting, remind us to look for opportunities to be Your hands and feet to those around us that need hope and healing that only the gospel can provide.

Day 10

Committee – Discernment

“But the LORD said to Samuel, ‘Do not look at his appearance or his stature because I have rejected him. Humans do not see what the LORD sees, for humans see what is visible, but the LORD sees the heart.’”

1 Samuel 16:7 (CSB)

Thought

Several years ago, Susan Boyle was a contestant on Britain’s Got Talent. She did anything but fit the mold of what you would expect of a competitor. Her youth had long passed, and her appearance was rather ordinary, but the moment she sang, the judges and audience were stunned by her voice’s beauty.

Without a doubt, a pastor’s capacity to proclaim God’s Word clearly and connect with others is essential. However, our Pastor Search Committee will need wisdom to look beyond that which is visible, gaining a clear understanding of each candidate’s heart and character.

Prayer

Our understanding is incomplete and imperfect, but as it is written in James 1:5, *“If anyone lacks wisdom, let him ask God who gives generously.”* Father, provide the Pastor Search Committee with spiritual discernment. As Your people and as Your church give us wisdom beyond human understanding, lead us to make decisions that are consistent with Your Will and let us live these out in a way that brings glory to Your Name and advances the work of Your Kingdom.

provided for you.”*


Matthew 6:33 (CSB)

Thought

your paths straight.”*


Proverbs 3:5-6 (NIV)

to my path.”*


Psalms 119:105 (CSB)


Prayer

Philippians 4:6-7 (CSB)


Thought
