### **Holding Up Each Other's Hands**

Teaching Pastor Paul Coleman shared an amazing message with us on Sunday, October 24. In that message of encouragement regarding God's sovereign control, care and plan he mentioned a story in Exodus 17:11-13, telling of the Israelites as they were sent out to fight the Amalekites: "11 While Moses held up his hand, Israel

prevailed, but whenever he put his hand down, Amalek prevailed. <sup>12</sup>When Moses's hands grew heavy, they took a stone and put it under him, and he sat down on it. <u>Then Aaron and Hur</u> <u>supported his hands, one on one side and one on the other so that his hands remained steady</u> until the sun went down. <sup>13</sup>So Joshua defeated Amalek and his army with the sword."

God is our greatest encourager (see Praise below). The Holy Spirit is called the "Comforter" or "Counselor" in John 14:16. It is the word *parakletos* – one who comes alongside to encourage, comfort, plead one's case before the judge. He directly pours into us strength, courage and power. He holds our hands up in visible and invisible ways as we fight the daily battles of life.

But God also uses His people to encourage one another. Moses encouraged Joshua (Deut. 3:38), Jonathan encouraged David (1 Sam. 23:16), Barnabas encouraged the Antioch believers (Acts 11:23) and Paul encouraged the disciples in Ephesus (Acts 20:1). We too are called to "encourage one another and build each other up" (1 Thess. 5:11), "encourage each other daily" (Heb. 3:13), "encourage each other...and all the more as you see the day approaching" (Heb. 10:25).

How will you use your words in the days ahead? Let's choose to lift up each other's arms through prayer, asking God to intervene and work in the lives of believers we know. We can also lift up each other's arms through words of encouragement and affirmation, speaking "what is good for building up someone in need" (Eph. 4:29). Our words – to God and to each other – have great power.

The Pastor Search Committee needs your prayers of encouragement in these days. Just as importantly, every member of the Mobberly family can be encouraged as you pray for them and speak life into them. <a href="Pray for encouragement">Pray for encouragement</a>, Watchmen, as we hold up one another's arms, see God win the battles and allow Him to be glorified in East Texas and beyond.

**Repent:** Of sins committed and commands neglected.

Our ongoing sins disrupt our fellowship with our heavenly Father. This is why we need to repent of our sins and confess them to God. "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and righteous to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness." (I John 1:9, CSB)
