Power and Proxy

Picture this. You are sitting with friends on a hillside near the town of Bethany. Standing before you is the resurrected Lord Jesus. He has shown you many convincing proofs that He is indeed Jesus and that He is indeed risen from the dead. He has spent time with you teaching you. And now the time has come for Him to ascend to His Father. But first...a promise and a proxy.

In Acts 1:8 we read a passage similar to Jesus' Great Commission found in Matthew 28:18-20: "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come on you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." The promise is that as Jesus leaves the Holy Spirit will be sent to abide in the disciples, direct them, and empower them to accomplish what He commands. The proxy? They are charged with being Jesus' representatives to bear witness to His life, death, and resurrection...and the amazing power of His grace to redeem and restore broken people. They are the bearers of the "good-est" news ever proclaimed on earth.

As we approach Resurrection Sunday this year on Sunday, March 31 it's a wonderful time to visit that hillside again and remember that this promise and proxy is for us today just as much as it was for the disciples in that day. The Holy Spirit is in and around you to empower you and lead you. You are not alone and you are not called to live out this mission in your own strength. We are given not just regular human power, but God's amazing resurrection power to make the dead live again. He raised Christ from the dead and he takes sinners who are dead in their trespasses and gives them new life.

Our proxy is to be empowered witnesses for Christ. The resurrection gives us good news to share with others around us – the neighbors in our sphere of influence. The disciples' job was not to solve all the problems of their world. Their call was to tell others about Jesus and how He had changed their lives. They were called to serve people and gain the privilege of speaking into their lives.

Prayer Warriors, as you pray this month revisit the hillside with the risen Christ. Pray for an amazing celebration of the resurrection at Mobberly (see schedule below). Pray that the powerful Spirit of God will move in amazing ways in the coming weeks. Pray that Mobberly family members will be empowered witnesses in sharing Christ and inviting neighbors to come and hear the gospel preached. As always, never lose sight of the fact that your prayers matter. God has given you the privilege of participating in this divine and eternal building of the Kingdom.
