Mind The Gap

Watchmen Prayer Warriors,

If you've ever been to London and ridden on the London Underground railway you have heard the term "Mind the gap." They want to constantly remind you that there is a dangerous distance – a gap – between where you are and where you want to be. This week I was reminded afresh that there is a terrible gap that our sin, our rebellious choice to seek our own way rather than submitting to the lordship of God, has put between us and our holy and perfect God. It is a gap that results in death, eternal separation from God and the abundant life He has planned for us.

Most religions want us to "mind the gap" based on our own goodness, our own works of righteousness to work our way across the gap to God. Just be kind, help some people, give some money, perform the rituals of religion. But the Bible tells us that we can never be good enough to bridge that gap. As a matter of fact, our very best is like dirty rags in God's perfect presence. What a sad story! Without help an eternity outside of joy, peace, hope and light awaits our best efforts.

But hope pierces the night in Bethlehem. This is what the Christmas story is about. It is the most beautiful story in the universe – a story about the greatest love shown in the most unselfish way for the most unworthy recipients. You see, when we could not cross the gap in our own righteousness Jesus came to cross that gap from Heaven to earth. Jesus came to us!

I was drawn to this truth in Psalm 111:9a: "He has <u>sent redemption</u> to His people." The Old Testament proclaims that the bridging of this terrible gap does not initiate from people but from God. Redemption – the bridging of the sin gap by the payment for our sins – does not initiate from earth towards Heaven but rather was initiated before time by God to send a Savior to bridge the gap. Jesus puts it this way in Luke 19:10: "For the Son of Man <u>has come</u> to seek and to save the lost."

The story we celebrate each December is the story of God's proactive love for us demonstrated in Jesus leaving His perfect home in Heaven, appearing first in a dirty manger, living a perfect life, dying to bridge the gap created by sin, and then rising to bridge the way to eternal life.

Watchmen Prayer Warriors, this Christmas month let's praise our Savior Jesus Christ for coming to save us for our sins. Let's seek Him in prayer asking Him to compel our actions, our thoughts, our ministries, our very lives to share with a lost world that there is hope in Jesus to bridge the gap to a personal relationship with the Savior who came to save us.
