• We had several staff changes with Frank Rambo retiring and Al Mango stepping back from some of his roles. Nicole Glasgow stepped up and became our Executive Director. Brandy Morrow stepped up as our Program and Rental Coordinator. Priscilla Hodge is our new Accounting Manager. Patsi Yarborough is the new, friendly Office Manager. John Glasgow is our Facility Manager. Richard has led incredible services and is supporting all of us in growth. The rest of the staff has shown me personally that they are 100% dedicated to our mission and vision. We are now stronger in our skills and organization. We are building fans beyond our geographic area. Our financial position is carefully managed. And we are grateful for unexpected results!

• Living our beliefs. Thank you to the Board for supporting me and each other during this amazing year. The stability of UNA's finances through unexpected sources of income and creative expense management is a testament to our beliefs. We have intentionally increased our community outreach and deepened our tithing to encourage the flow of positive energy. We hold a goal of making a difference in the lives of our members, friends, and community through our actions. We are grateful.

• We had some challenges too! We had a kerfuffle with a potential rental that included media attention and lots of drama. It was settled peacefully. We tried valiantly to install classrooms for our Youth Ed that didn't work out. We've had technology issues, water leaks, internet cables breaking, and more – and yet we still persevered and prospered. The lesson for me here is that most of the biggest challenges or problems I experience today will be but a memory a year from now.

• I've seen so much love and effort put in by our community. Habitat for Humanity, our weekly food bank, the Organic Garden, the prayer shawls, the meals, the newly wonderful space now known as Holy Grounds Courtyard by the Mens Group, a wonderful Welcome Team, the Labyrinth Ministry, Scouting, the Pumpkin Patch, the Volunteer Appreciation Lunch, the re-growing of the Youth and Family Ministry, the Prayer Chaplains, the Spanish Ministry, the LBGTQ+ and Friends Ministry, the Women of UNA, the Wholeness Ministry, and most importantly, the friendships and support. • I'd be remiss if I didn't mention that this year was a particularly tough year with the number of transitions of members of our community. The outpouring of love and support and the joyful remembrances and memorials have been amazing and inspiring.

• My biggest concern is the deferred maintenance of our building and facility. Since I've been on the Board, we've always made do in terms of repairs and maintenance. We seem to break even cashflow-wise each year but not save enough for the expected big repair items. Items that will need attention are exterior paint, parking lot resurfacing, and HVAC units. I am comforted knowing that each time we are asked, much is given. The Board has some plans and ideas and are open to yours.

- It was a tough year of saying goodbye to some beloved congregants. - Two big projects last year were a brand-new web site and our Church Center App. It is an allencompassing program that has redesigned our giving processes and afforded much more access to the congregation to all things Unity North. Thanks to the staff of UNA for the hours of effort and learning. Special thanks to Nicole Glasgow for leading the charge.

- Gratitude to the **Men of Unity** for the refurbishing and cleaning up of the Holy Grounds Courtyard. The Brick Project raised all the money needed for the update, and it's been a wonderful place to gather. Our first service will be meeting there starting March 26.
- Education continues to be a blessing at UNA. Classes included A Course In Miracles, Beyond Fight and Flight, Living in the Flow, Unity Basics, Insights into Spirituality, Silent Meditation, Job Networking and Sunrise Yoga Meditation.
- Outreach continues to thrive at UNA. Notable ministries include our weekly Food Bank (Thank you Jeanne Ruetz), Family Promise (Thank you Judith Johnson and Mary Kusterman), Habitat for Humanity (Thank you Chris Skaer and John Ragland), the Extension (thank you John Everage), and FAPA. We continue to tithe to the Cumberland Counseling Center, Covenant House, MUST, Habitat for Humanity, Simple Needs, and national Unity organizations. We also continue several 12 step support programs that are serving the greater community. We also hosted a special Spring Fling for the Greater Angels Foster Parent Association of Cobb.
- Our **Care Team** came together in 2022 spearheaded by Susan Hayden and a host of volunteers. They have been able to provide food, transportation, companionship, errands, and animal care support.
- The **Chaplain Core** continues to thrive under the leadership of Judy Demmer and the dedicated chaplain volunteers. We now have five chaplains serving every Sunday. Thanks for the great Service of Remembrance, World Day of Prayer, and Burning Bowl service.
- Youth Education is bouncing back from COVID in amazing ways. Gratitude to Susan Clancy, John Glasgow, Suzie Burdick, Sarah Michelle Bloodworth Young, Lisa Vail, Rev. Julie Boniger and all the volunteers who serve our youngest members. We are seeing growing numbers as families make their way back to us. We had to release the trailers that were planned as part of our expansion. It became cost prohibitive to continue down that road. Reconfiguring our main building will temporarily allow for more growth. If anyone has a cool million dollars laying around, we would gladly name a youth center building after you in the current hole where the Admin. Building used to be.
- We continue to work to improve our **technology**, streaming, and marketing. Grateful thanks to Wes Maxham, Misty Cochran, Sebastian Giles, Sara Crawford, and the great team making sure we reach beyond our walls to the growing congregation around the country.
- Notable programs include Songfest (thank you Wil Hodge), Moonflower (thank you Organic Garden). Wednesday dinners, meditations and dialogues, (thank you Earth Care Team), Pumpkin Patch (thank you Judith Johnson, Linda Deaton, and Beverly Epps), Fall Festival, White Stone and Burning Bowl service, Christmas Eve and Easter services, Solstice ceremonies, Thanksgiving Dinner (thank you Jennie Langer, Kathleen McKinley, and team) Week-long visit from the monks from Drepung Loseling Monastery (thanks Rev. Avril), and Sol Dance.
- Scouting at Unity is as strong as ever, and we have added a female scout troop to our programs.
- Ministries that remain strong are the Prayer Shawl Ministry, Dances for Universal Peace, Women of UNA, Men's Group, LGBTQ+ and Friends Ministry, Animal Ministry, Wholeness Ministry, Welcome Team, Job Networking, Usher Core, Singles, Organic Garden, Labyrinth Ministry, Outreach, Card Care, Care Team. We have added, under the leadership of Imani Davis, a grief support group for Widows and Widowers. We also added our Authentic Living Group last year. NGU hosted two Sol Dance experiences and Body, Mind, Spirit started programming again with wonderful reviews (thank you Julie Steele). What a rich environment we have here.

- Special thanks to the **Spanish Ministry** that continues to offer monthly services and programs to serve the Spanish Speaking community. Grateful thanks to Sheyla Ravan and Vilma Orrego.
- We continue to be a polling station for **Cobb County** and have welcomed many local neighbors into our sanctuary for two elections.
- **Consistent Giving** continues to be the solid rock that allows us to stay flush with the ups and downs of doing business as a non-profit. If you are not currently on the Consistent Giving Program, I encourage you to jump on board. It makes such an enormous difference.
- **Rentals** are coming back to Unity North, and we are delighted that Brandy Morrow has moved from being the Office Manager to coordinating this forward progress. This was a large part of our budget pre-COVID, and we are thrilled that income is coming back.
- A few special services included Homecoming, Annual Ecumenical Thanksgiving Service, Annual Pet Blessing, and Monks from Drepung Loseling Monastery.
- I am grateful for the **Board of Directors and the Finance Committee** who last year rode many waves and always showed up with grace and dignity. They are a blessing to our community. Their diligence and attention to the finances of Unity North are of the highest integrity and respect.
- I am grateful to the staff of Unity North for their tireless flexibility and patience with our busy environment. Each one always steps up to get the job done.

These bullet points represent a large portion of the UNA field, but there is much more going on in the day-today workings of our organization. Executive Director's Report Nicole Glasgow, Executive Director

It's hard to believe that 2022 was the first year we were fully open after the shutdown. It was a year of coming together, with great events like the Spring Fling, Moonflower Concert, Homecoming, Fall Festival, Thanksgiving and the Family Christmas Celebration. It was a year of action, with the Men of Unity Courtyard Project, the Pumpkin Patch, Family Promise, Habitat for Humanity, and a number of other outreach projects. It was also a year of change.

You may be aware of the staff changes that happened in November. As I became Executive Director, Brandy Morrow became our Program Coordinator, and we brought in Patsi Yarborough as our Office Manager. As Frank Rambo entered retirement, Priscilla Hodge was hired as our new Accounting Manager. I am grateful to have Patsi and Priscilla join the team and grateful for Frank's years of service.

All during 2022, behind the scenes, the staff worked to update and consolidate our systems. Our new church management software, Church Center, brought together our membership, giving, youth, volunteer, and leader databases and is allowing all of our systems to talk to each other. This includes our website, which was totally redone last year. Many thanks to Misty Cochran, Julie Boniger, Brandy Morrow, and Rev. Richard who made the website transition happen quickly and easily.

We are grateful to those of you who downloaded the app, switched over their Consistent Giving, and were gracious as we hit bumps along the way. Many of you have probably talked to Edie Smith during this transition. Her help in Accounting has been invaluable.

You may have also noticed that we didn't ask you to fill out a Membership Verification Card as we have done in the past. We still verify membership every year, but we are able to do most of it behind the scenes with the help of our new system.

Of course, all of these systems are here to support you, our congregation. From staff to leaders to volunteers, Unity North has an incredible congregation whose passion and dedication have left me feeling blessed and grateful.

For our Volunteer Appreciation Lunch in February, we invited 270 volunteers to attend, and we celebrated over 14,500 hours of service in 2022. We are blessed by the depth and breadth of our volunteer base. As we said at the lunch, the staff could not do what we do without you. Our volunteers make the programs, outreach, and service we provide possible. Thank you!

Though I have been working at UNA since 2015 in various roles, I am excited as I take on the role of Executive Director. I am excited to work with our leaders, volunteers, and congregants. I am excited to work on the business side of UNA. And I am excited to see where Spirit leads Unity North.

Youth Education

UNIKIDS - Rev. Julie Boniger

Our Youth Ed department was greatly affected by COVID, but 2022 saw significant growth. In Unikids, many families have returned, and we are honored to welcome several new families into our spiritual home each month.

At the end of 2021, Unikids (birth-5th grade) had an average of 10-12 children per week. We now welcome 22-24 children per week and are blessed by the wisdom, presence, and energy of these "earth angels."

Our families are connecting outside of Sunday morning through Family Fun Nights, special events, and play dates. The plan is to broaden and expand our connection and reach by working with other ministries, multi-generational events, more time in front of the congregation, and community service projects.

2022 was a big year for changes to our campus. Below are some of the highlights:

- In February, the Admin Building was taken down. There are no plans to do anything with that space at this point.
- Supply ducting to HGC has been repaired and the outside air leakage in both HVAC closets feeding HGC has been sealed.
- Our water line burst in the island in front of the building has been repaired.
- The Men of Unity have completed revitalizing the Holy Grounds Courtyard.
- Peace Chapel ducting has been replaced and should address the temperature control issues in the Peace Chapel, Richard's office, and the Connections Room.
- All inspections were completed with no issues.
- Fire alarm panel has been replaced with a new one due to damage from a lightning strike.
- Trailer project was dropped per Board decision. One trailer has been sold and the other is still for sale.
- Gas has been converted to a seasonal plan to avoid fixed line costs (\$600/month).
- Converted upstairs water heater to electric so that the gas service could be changed to a seasonal plan.
- Grills outside of Holy Grounds Cafe have been replaced with propane ones.
- Commercial dishwasher has been installed in the kitchen thank you Earth Care!

Ongoing and upcoming in 2023:

- Hired a cleaning contractor to handle janitorial work.
- HVAC: 7 23-year-old HVAC units remain to be replaced working with Paulson Cheek to get current quotes on replacement and upgrade of associated ductwork.
- Currently working with our Scouts on their donation of an upgraded projector in Holy Grounds, and they are providing a new TV on cart – with DVD player for us to use. This will be stored in the Kid area closet after it has been cleaned out.
- Working toward retrofitting our current sign at the street with an LED display, digital sign instead of just repairing the damage sustained last July when a car crashed into it.
- A shed for golf carts and landscaping supplies, etc. is being speced out and will be added to the Wish List on the website.
- Quoting cleaning/repair/replacement of chairs (570 chairs in inventory).

Treasurer's Message

We want to thank our congregation for their continued financial support to our church. In particular, we would like to highlight those congregants who dedicate their time, talent, and treasure to our community. You are the heart of this community, day in and day out. Also, we want to highlight the growth we have seen in Consistent Giving, which helps us maintain and grow our church.

Our church continued to make investments in 2022 to support a growing segment of our congregation who participates in our community by reaching out to us online. We are going to continue making investments in Technology in 2023 to upgrade aging equipment, as our church depends more and more on technology for its operations. In 2022, we transitioned to a new application, website and database via Church Center which will help us support our growth by maintaining better track of our membership database, streamlining contributions and payments, and also maintaining better controls for our Unikids program. We want to thank our congregants for their support during this transition. In 2022, we completed the Admin Building transition project and made investments with the purchasing of two mobile units to expand our Youth programs. Our church finances continue to be strong as we returned to normal operations after COVID-19, and we look forward to continued investments to grow our church.

Vision: For Unity North Atlanta to become truly spiritually wealthy by recognizing Spirit as our Source of abundance and prosperity and allowing the wealth of the Universe to flow freely in our congregants' lives! UNA activities are funded through our **Foundational Giving programs – Consistent Giving, Christmas Match, and fund-raising events** during the year. These pay salaries, keep the building operational, and provide services and classes. We are grateful for your participation in these activities.

Inspired by Don Simon and developed by Dena McFarland, our **Creative Giving Program** is underway. Our intention is to offer opportunities to celebrate your abundance by heart-driven giving. These include **Legacy Giving** to invest in the future of our youth and other programs; **Tangible Giving** of items to help pay down the mortgage; and **Spiritual Giving**, sharing a portion of abundance you feel moved to give beyond Foundational Giving from home sale profits, investment returns, bonuses, inheritances, etc.

Ongoing leadership for Creative Giving Program – We are establishing a standing committee to maintain continuity and leadership for the program.

Key activities of our giving programs:

- Acknowledge our donors and prospective donors through multiple messaging channels.
 - Fall 2022 Prosperity Class- Reverend Richard led this 4-week Zoom class, successfully raising the consciousness of prosperity.
 - Fall 2022 Over 120 personal **'Thank You' phone calls** were made to Consistent Givers, which included an opportunity to provide feedback regarding their experiences at Unity.
 - January 2023 Thank You Notes were included in end-of-year tax documents that were mailed out.
- Holiday Match, December 2022 Launched with a \$38,000 donor match challenge, Unity North collected \$109,000 to support our annual operating budget. Your Board, Staff, and Finance Committee are grateful for your generosity, demonstrating the flow of prosperity that supports our church.
- Consistent Giving Program

Our Fall Consistent Giving outreach included phone calls and other contacts with current participants. Consistent Giving is 70% of our 2023 budget and is important for planning and managing our finances.

Marketing has done a great job offering convenient ways to give, including a QR code, website with links, the Church Center app, paper options, as well as one-on-one support to set up accounts. Person-

al

drop-ins with each ministry are in progress to personally acknowledge and encourage CPG, offering technical support as needed. These visits have been very rewarding. Those in the Unity Basics (new member) class were invited to download the Church Center app as a way to set-up Consistent Giving and also be connected to what's going on at Unity North.

We continue to seek ways to increase our revenue stream and involvement from our online viewers.

- CGP Cards and Offering Baskets Back by popular demand, these have returned to our services.
- Spring 2023 Legacy Giving Two "Lunch and Learn" sessions are scheduled; cost is \$10 including meal. The Wednesday, May 3 event is at 5 pm, with dinner following; and will focus on the estate planning concerns of the "Sandwich Generation," parents with children and/or aging parents. The Thursday, May 18 lunch event at 12 pm will target Seniors' concerns. Our guest speaker is Attorney Cindy Nelson from Nelson Eldercare Law in Marietta.
