φ	Continue to and grow.  Three ways: 1) Lecture/Classroom/Reading, 2) Apprenticeship, 3) Immersion
φ	Root your faith primarily in what is true about, not in feelings or people.  "Him we proclaim, warning everyone and teaching everyone with all wisdom, that we may present everyone mature in Christ." –Colossians 1:28
φ	Be honest about your .

## Frequently Asked Questions

- I was baptized as an infant. Do I need to be baptized again?
  - There are many faith traditions that practice the baptism of infants. In the Catholic tradition it is believed that the act of baptism removes the stain of original sin. In some Reformed Protestant traditions baptism is seen as a sign that a child is a member of God's covenant community, not that the child has necessarily professed faith. At Bridgeway we believe the biblical model of baptism is that it is for believers, and thus baptism following a profession of faith is required for membership.
- I have been baptized as a believer, but it was not by immersion. Do I need to be baptized again? At Bridgeway we believe the biblical model of baptism is that it is done by immersion, so that is what we practice here. We would encourage you to be baptized by immersion, but if you have been baptized by sprinkling as a believer and do not wish to be baptized by immersion, that is ok.
- I have been baptized by immersion, but then I walked away from my faith. Should I be baptized again as a sign of my re-commitment?
  - We are overjoyed that you've returned to walking with the Lord, and we want to do everything we can to support you in that journey. However, it is not necessary for you to be baptized again. But if you would like to be baptized again as a sign of your renewed commitment to the Lord, that is totally fine! Your call.
- Does baptism make me a Christian?
  - No. Baptism doesn't *make* you a Christian—it is a sign that you are a Christian. A helpful analogy is to think of baptism like a wedding ring. A wedding ring does not make you married, but rather it is a sign that you are married. The ring means nothing without the commitment, but it is a powerful symbol when accompanied by a commitment. Jesus commanded that His followers be baptized (Matt. 28:18-19), but it is not what saves you. Salvation is by grace alone through faith alone (Eph. 2:8), and baptism is the way we publicly acknowledge our commitment to Christ.
- l'm not sure l'm ready to be baptized. What should I do?

  Baptism is a big step, and it's something to take seriously. That being said, it's important to remember that we don't need to "qualify" for baptism by doing good works. If you're struggling with whether or not to get baptized, it may be helpful to review the "How do I know if I'm ready to be baptized?" portion of this document. The bottom line is: if Jesus Christ is Lord of your life, you can be baptized!
