He has won multiple awards for his work, including the Latvian Great Music Prize, had his music performed at numerous international festivals, and has been frequently featured on recordings. Ēriks is a popular public speaker, which he often combines with leading masterclasses and conducting.

B. E. Boykin's commissions and collaborations include a number of ACDA divisions, the Minnesota Opera and the Kennedy Center. With degrees from Spelman College and Westminster Choir College, Boykin's choral piece, "We Sing as One," was commissioned to celebrate Spelman's 133rd Anniversary. Boykin says, "When I think of diversity within the classical music world, there is diversity within sound, within ensembles, within colors."

Errolyn Wallen has been called the "renaissance woman of contemporary British music" (The Observer). She is as respected a singer-songwriter of pop influenced songs as she is a composer of contemporary new music. The motto of Errollyn's Ensemble X, "we don't break down barriers in music... we don't see any", reflects her genuine, free-spirited approach. Wallen has composed operas, orchestral, chamber and vocal works performed throughout the world.

Kile Smith is the recipient of three Grammy nominations. His music is hailed nationally and internationally for its strong voice, sheer beauty, and "profoundly direct emotional appeal." Smith writes of this composition, "The text is powerful and moving on its own but felt quite apt for our time. The music, with its gently descending line and undulating triads, suggests peacefulness and perhaps the descending Holy Spirit".

Daniel Elder creates forms and aesthetics that are at once lyrical and textural, sacred and secular, drawing roots particularly from the impressionist movement. He creates "the kind of immediately ingratiating melody-centered, harmony-gilded works that no choir director or singer—or listener—can resist." (ClassicsToday.com) He says, "I attempt to tap the emotions a poet once put into words… Through the pursuit of emotion I chase truth. The notes are merely the language." Elder has won prizes in national and international competitions by organizations including The American Prize, Abbey Road Studios, CANTUS, and many others.

**Robert Beaser** Song of the Ascents – Psalm 121

Robert Beaser's music has been characterized as a synthesis of "spatial clarity and epic sweep," and is known for its fusion of European traditions with "American musical vernacular." In his evocation of American hymn styles, critics have drawn comparisons to Copland and Barber. The Baltimore Sun writes "Beaser is one of this country's huge composing talents, with a gift for vocal writing that is perhaps unequaled." He has received a Grammy nomination, numerous commissions, fellowships, and awards, including an Academy Award in Music. Beaser is chair of the Composition Department at Juilliard.
