One: In this fourth week of Advent, we rejoice in the good news that God has come near to us in Jesus Christ— the eternal Son, Light from Light, true God from true God, who took on flesh and dwelt among us.

All: We await the One through whom all things were made, who for us and for our salvation came down from heaven.

One: Hear the song of Mary, who rejoiced in God's saving love, from Luke chapter 1. (A reading, taken from Luke 1:46-55)

All: We rejoice in the God who lifts up the lowly, keeps his promises, and brings salvation through Christ.

One: Today we light the fourth Advent candle—the candle of Joy—as a sign that Christ's coming brings joy to the world and gladness to all who hope in him.

(The candle representing joy is lit.)

One: As this flame shines brightly, we remember that true joy is found not in our circumstances, but in the Savior who has come to dwell with us.

All: May Christ, the Light from Light, fill our hearts with his joy, strengthen our hope, and prepare us for his coming.

One: Come. Lord Iesus-

All: God of God, Light of Light, Word of the Father. Let your joy rise in us and shine through us.

*Prayer of Confession

(Modernized text based on a prayer by Martin Bucer (1491-1551))

One: Almighty and eternal God, our Father, we confess that we are born into sin and naturally drawn toward what is wrong, slow to do what is right. We continually break your holy commands and cause further harm to ourselves. We are truly sorry for this and ask for your grace and help.

All: Have mercy on us, gracious and loving Father, through your Son, our Lord Jesus Christ. Fill us and grow in us your Holy Spirit, so that we may honestly recognize our sin, feel genuine sorrow and repentance, turn away from it completely, and live a new life that pleases you. (Silence for personal confession.)

ADVENT AT FIRST PRES MAUMEE
