MEMORIAL GARDEN





The Church has traditionally been the natural repository and final resting place for the mortal remains of deceased members of the Christian community.

In keeping with this tradition, First Presbyterian's Memorial Garden is a beautifully landscaped area located on the east side of our sanctuary. A peaceful garden setting provides a variety of options for a safe, permanent and serene resting place for the cremains of deceased members of our church and their families.

The Memorial Garden also offers a way to remember loved ones interred elsewhere.

MEMORIAL GARDEN OPTIONS

NICHES - \$2,000

- Housed within stone & brick walls
- Aluminum niche provided for placement of ashes
- Niche contains a permanently sealed canister to provide a secure, final resting place
- Brass plate inscribed with name and dates of birth & death

GARDEN INTERMENT - \$1,000

- Ashes buried within Memorial Garden
- Brass plate inscribed with name and dates of birth & death and affixed to plaque near site

MEMORIALS - \$400

- Memorialize a loved one interred elsewhere
- Name plate affixed to plaque on stone wall of garden

ELIGIBILITY

- Covenant partners
- Immediate family of Covenant Partners
- Supporters and friends approved by Memorial Garden Board of Directors & Pastor

INTERMENT ARRANGEMENTS

An interment can be arranged once the church has been notified of the death. Cremated remains will be transferred into the possession of the church when a specific date has been established for the interment process.

The ceremony is conducted by a clergy member with family and friends present.

During the ceremony, ashes are placed directly into the earth or into a niche within the Memorial Garden.
