Certified Leadership Training

HMCC will introduce the Leadership Certificate Training Program, featuring five levels of certification:

- 1. Members
- 2. Volunteers
- 3. Sponsors/Teachers
- 4 Deacons
- 5. Elders & Staff

Each level includes a curated list of training videos and class curriculum designed to equip participants for excellence in ministry. Completion of each level grants an official HMCC Leadership Certification as part of our commitment to developing strong, Christ-centered leaders.

Training will be available through online study links (accessible via each ministry's webpage) and in-person group classes offered through the Leadership Learning Center (LLC).

Each ministry or department will track participant progress, record certifications, and report completed training sessions.

Those who complete certification levels will receive special recognition and public honor for their dedication to personal growth and ministry excellence.

Restore!

Restore! is a teaching and coaching approach that partners with individuals and families, 2026 will be the year of CULTURE! Our overarching focus will include four values.

Small Groups

Small groups involve people from our church who gather weekly in homes across our community to study God's word and support one another. It provides a relaxed environment where you pursue authentic community, grow spiritually, and experience seasons of life together. In 2026 our small groups will study Basic Christianity, How We Got The Bible, Practical Christian Living, and a Psalm Video Series.

Men's Leadership Development26 (2026)

Several of you participated in our Saturday morning breakfast workshops last year and found the time to be edifying, encouraging, and educational. This year's program will continue to build on that foundation.

Men's Leadership Development26 will offer three key training tools:

1. Workshops

Three Saturday morning workshops will provide biblical and practical leadership training. A primary resource will be John Maxwell's book, Developing the Leader Within You 2.0. Each session will also include doctrinal and Bible-based leadership principles.

2. Coaching Roundtables

Roundtables will help embed the principles from the workshops into personal and ministry life. These sessions will also offer leadership insights into each participant's growth and potential.

3. Individual Mentoring

If you desire to be mentored, let us know and we will connect you with a mentor who can guide you in your leadership

Deacon Initiation

The leadership at HMCC is committed to establishing and developing a Deacon Ministry, one that reflects the biblical model of servant leadership and equips faithful men to serve Christ's Church with excellence.

The position of Deacon is defined according to 1 Timothy 3:8-10 and Acts 6:1-6; 7. A Deacon is called to assist the Elders in the work of shepherding, service, administration, and training Christ's Church for effective ministry. As we study Scripture. it's clear that deacons hold an essential position and function in the church. The first deacons are possibly revealed in Acts 6, where faithful servants were chosen to meet the needs of the growing church. One of those servant leaders, Stephen, preached the longest sermon recorded in the New Testament (Acts 7)! The apostle Paul also greets the leadership at Philippi, writing: "To all God's holy people in Christ Jesus at Philippi, together with the overseers and deacons." Philippians 1:1 (NIV). In 2026, our Elders will begin prayerfully seeking and equipping men who are called to serve in the role of Deacon.


